## HOUSING

## Housing Subsidy Order

ORDER, DATED 14TH JUNE 1974, MADE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING, LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND PLANNING, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE, UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE HOUSING (NO. 2) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1946.

The Department of Housing, Local Government and Planning (in this Order referred to as "the Department") with the approval of the Department of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Department by section 1 of the Housing (No. 2) Act (Northern Ireland) 1946(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Housing Subsidy (Variation) (Renewal) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1974 and shall be construed as one with the Housing Subsidy Order (Northern Ireland) 1962(b).

2. In its application to a housing scheme in respect of which the tender has been submitted for approval to the Ministry of Development or accepted by the Northern Ireland Housing Executive or by a housing association after 15th December 1972 and before 16th March 1973, the Housing Subsidy Order (Northern Ireland) 1962 shall be amended by substituting for the Schedule contained therein the Schedule to this Order.

3. This Order shall come into effect on 16th June 1974.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)*

This Order has the effect of keeping in operation the subsidy rates indicated in the Housing Subsidy (Variation) (Renewal) (No. 8) Order (Northern Ireland) 1973 which now ceases to have effect not having been confirmed by a Resolution of the Northern Ireland Assembly within the statutory six months' period. These rates apply to houses for which tenders were accepted by the Northern Ireland Housing Executive or housing associations after 15th December 1972, and before 16th March 1973, and also to houses built by new town commissions by virtue of section 21 of the New Towns Act (Northern Ireland) 1965.

By virtue of the Housing Executive Act (Northern Ireland) 1971 the Department will pay the local authority contribution shown in column 3.
