


Futile Tactics THE British have a thousand

A Nippon Base in Burma, February 17 (Domei)—Stubborn Nippon defence along the entire Irrawaddy front is frustrating the enemy's drive on Mandalay. On the Shweli front, Nippon forces on February 15 attacked the main strength of the 36th Indian Division at a point north of Myitson, when the enemy attempted to cross the river. The Nippon troops intercepted the enemy before he could throw his entire force across the river and smashed half the enemy strength employed in his southward drive.


