STOCKS OF LEAF TOBACCO OWNED BY DEALERS AND MANUFACTURERS 1/ 2/

Total leaf tobacco stocks lower than last July 1

Leaf tobacco inventories of dealers and manufacturers in the United States and Puerto Rico totaled 4,355 million pounds as of July 1, 1960. This is 94 million pounds less than the figure a year earlier and 254 million below 2 years ago. Inventories of imported leaf were 24 million pounds more than on the previous July 1, but lower stocks of U. S. grown tobacco--down 118 million pounds--considerably more than offset this increase. Imported stocks of both the cigarette and cigar types were at record levels. About 39 million pounds, consisting of Maryland and Puerto Rican tobaccos, was marketed by growers during the April-June quarter.

Stocks as of July 1, 1960, included about 738 million pounds (farm-sales-weight) of leaf tobacco under Government loans (1,004 million on July 1, 1959). These loan stocks were divided as follows: flue-cured, 557 million pounds; burley, 98 million; Maryland, 4.2 million; fire-cured, 43.0 million; dark air-cured, 19.7 million; and cigar leaf, 16.3 million.

1/ Figures quoted for type totals in this summary are the farm-sales-weight equivalent of reported stocks except foreign-grown leaf which is converted to an unstemmed equivalent basis only. (See tables in body of report for reported weight basis). This report is issued quarterly.

2/ All Government loan stocks are reported by grower cooperatives, which are considered dealers for stocks-reporting purposes.

CIGARETTE-LEAF STOCKS

Flue-cured, Burley, and Maryland stocks smaller than a year ago.

Stocks of flue-cured tobacco as of July 1, 1960, totaled 2,106 million pounds--104 million lower than holdings reported on July 1 last year (2,210 million). The marketing year for flue-cured is on a July-June basis, and total disappearance (exports plus domestic disappearance) during the year just ended was 1,185 million pounds (1,179 million the year previous), based on July 1 stocks. Domestic consumption of flue-cured leaf increased to 766 million pounds (736 million the previous year). The export volume dropped to 419 million, the lowest since the 1952-53 marketing year.

Burley tobacco stocks this July 1 were reported as 1,357 million pounds--9 million below the holdings on July 1, 1959 (1,366 million).

Inventories of Maryland tobacco on July 1, 1960, totaled 73.1 million pounds--slightly under those reported last July 1 (77.2 million). Marketing of the 1959 crop of Maryland began on April 26, 1960, and sales through June 30 totaled 23.6 million pounds--a little less than was sold during the corresponding period in the previous season (24.9 million).

Foreign-grown cigarette and smoking tobacco stocks (Turkish and other) were reported as 241.4 million pounds on July 1, 1960--well above those on hand a year earlier (235.5 million), and record high for imported cigarette and smoking leaf.

DARK TOBACCO STOCKS

Fire-cured inventories about the same and Dark Air-cured slightly below those reported a year ago.

Stocks of fire-cured leaf, reported at 134.7 million pounds on July 1, 1960, were about the same as holdings on the previous July 1 (134.9 million). An increase in type 23 practically offset decreases in types 21 and 22. Fire-cured stocks on this July 1 were as follows: Virginia, 24.9 million pounds; Eastern District Kentucky and Tennessee, 88.9 million; and Western District, 20.9 million.

Dark air-cured holdings of 72.1 million pounds on July 1, 1960, were 2.6 million under the July 1 inventories last year (74.7 million). As was the case in fire-cured, decreases in types 35 and 36 were partly offset by an increase in type 37. Inventories of dark air-cured on this July 1 by types were as follows: One Sucker, 44.8 million pounds; Green River, 21.3 million; and Virginia sun-cured, 6.0 million.

CIGAR LEAF STOCKS

Domestic Cigar-leaf Filler and Wrapper stocks larger than a year ago Binder holdings down slightly

Inventories of all domestic-grown cigar tobacco, including Puerto Rican, totaled 307.4 million pounds (farm-sales-weight) on July 1, 1960. This increase is about 1 percent above the holdings of last July 1 (304.0 million). It is estimated that around 15 million pounds of the 1959 crop of Puerto Rican entered stocks during the quarter. Stocks of foreign-grown cigar-leaf on hand as of the July 1 reporting date were at the record level of 61.4 million pounds--40 percent above holdings a year earlier (43.3 million), and more than twice those on hand two years ago (25.9 million).

Holdings of the cigar-filler types as of July 1, 1960, totaled 197.2 million pounds--2.6 million above the figure reported on the previous July 1 (194.6 million). Stocks of type 41 and 42-44 were larger than on the previous July 1, but there was a slight decrease in Puerto Rican holdings. Inventories of cigar-filler by types on this July 1 were as follows: Pennsylvania Seedleaf, 122.6 million pounds; Ohio filler, 19.0 million; and Puerto Rican, 55.6 million.

Cigar-binder stocks totaled 87.5 million pounds on July 1, 1960--a little below holdings on the same date last year (89.1) million). Stocks reported in three of the types were smaller than a year ago; type 54 holdings were slightly larger. Connecticut Broadleaf stocks this July 1 were 20.1 million pounds; Connecticut Valley Havana Seed, 14.6 million; Southern Wisconsin, 24.5 million; and Northern Wisconsin, 28.3 million.

Shade-grown cigar-wrapper stocks as of July 1, 1960, totaled 22.7 million pounds consisting of 15.1 million of Connecticut Valley Shade and 7.6 million of Georgia-Florida Shade. Stocks of each type were larger than those reported a year earlier (13.0 and 7.3 million, respectively). The marketing year for cigar-wrapper is on a July-June basis, and total disappearance during the year just ended was 15.9 million pounds (16.9 million during the previous marketing year), based of July 1 stocks. Exports totaled 3.8 million pounds, down sharply from the previous year, while indicated domestic consumption of 12.1 million was slightly higher.

Stocks of Cuban (Havana) leaf, reported at 44.1 million pounds, were nearly twice as large as stocks on hand a year ago (25.1), which were record-high at that time. Philippine Islands (Manila) totaled 12.5 million pounds, and other foreign cigar-leaf, 4.7 million--both down slightly from stocks on hand the previous July 1.

TOBACCO SHEET

Leaf represented in stocks of Tobacco Sheet shows increase

Stocks of leaf represented in inventories of "tobacco sheet" totaled 6.5 million pounds (reporting weight) compared with 3.3 million the previous July 1. Of the total this July 1, 4.8 million pounds was for use in cigarettes and smoking tobacco, and 1.7 million for cigar binder, including a very small quantity for wrappers (see Table 5).
