PLANTING SEASON

The fall season is the only season in which the Peony can successfully be transplanted. To move Peonies at any other season than the months of September, October and November means a setback from which the roots sometimes do not recover for two years. When we sell you peonies we want them to start right in to work for you from the beginning, without a setback through moving at the wrong season. We begin digging September 1st and continue to fill orders as late in the year as the ground remains open.

PEONY CULTURE

Our customers are naturally interested in the proper care of their peonies and to meet the need of a reliable guide we have for many years sent free with every order our now famous BOOK OF DON'TS which, we believe, contains all the advice needed to raise peonies. These few "Don'ts" added to the plant's natural inclination to grow regardless of conditions, make the peony a real delight. Mohican Peonies properly cared for will give you none of those unhappy garden disappointments: painful losses of labor and love or time and money.

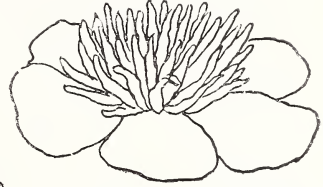

Types of Bloom

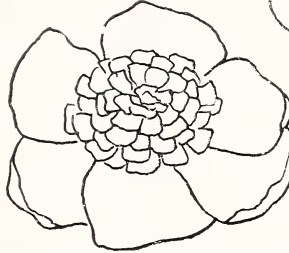
Paeonia albiflora, or *P. Chinensis*, as it is more commonly catalogued, has by the American Peony Society been divided into seven types as follows:



SINGLE. Those with a single row of wide guards and a center of yellow pollen-bearing stamens.



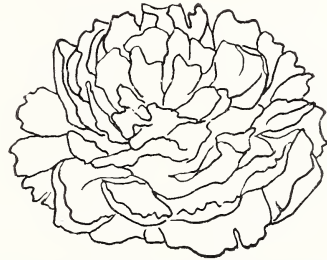
JAPANESE. These have wide guards the same as the Singles, but with the stamens and anthers greatly enlarged into narrow, thick petaloids of various colors, tipped with vestiges of the yellow anthers without pollen.



ANEMONE. This type is a step further in the process of doubling, with the stamens all transformed into short narrow petals, forming a round cushion in the center of the flower.



SEMI-DOUBLE. Those with several rows of wide petals and a center of stamens and partially transformed petaloids. Many of the reds are of this type.



DOUBLE. In these the process of doubling is completed, all stamens fully transformed into evenly arranged wide petaloids, similar to the guards, forming a perfect rose-shaped bloom.



CROWN. In this type wide petals are developed in the center of the flower, forming a high crown with the narrow, short petals forming a ring or collar around it. Often the crown and guards are one color, and the collar another or lighter shade.



BOMB. The next step is this type in which all the center petals are uniformly wide approaching the guards, but distinctly differentiated from them, forming a globe-shaped center without collar or crown.

DESCRIPTIVE CHART AND PRICE LIST

Our divisions are always generous, three-to-five-eye or better; our one-year and two-year roots have been grown in our own fields from divisions made in 1929 and 1928 respectively. Where no price is shown under one-year and two-year roots after the name of any variety, we are shipping only divisions of that variety this year. For discounts on quantity orders, see page 2.

Challenge Collection

Our Challenge Collection represents our list in miniature; its twenty-five varieties are the cream of our gardens and cover the entire range of form, color and blooming season. Originally planned as a guide to those who know little about Peonies and have not the time to study catalogs, it has proven equally popular with those who know Peonies well and therefore recognize the choiceness of the varieties included.

This Collection may be purchased as a whole at a saving of over one-third or it may be purchased in two different years by buying Collections No. 2 and No. 3 at almost as great a saving.

ADOLPHE ROUSSEAU: dark, lustrous red, shaded maroon, showing yellow stamens; side blooms always single; tends toward semi-double; free-blooming and very long-stemmed.

X X

BERLIOZ: currant-red, tinted rose and amaranth with tips of petals fading to nearly white; beautiful and effective, compact double bloom.

X X

CLAIRE DUBOIS: bright, rose-pink tending toward mauve, paling toward petal tips; the serrated edges of the closely incurved petals give a crisp look to the bloom; fairly long, heavy stems.

X X

DUCHESS DE NEMOURS: cupped, white guards with a center of light canary-yellow, deepening to pale green at the base of the petals; very free-blooming; fairly long erect stems.

X X

EDULIS SUPERBA: bright old-rose pink with a collar of lighter narrow petals; very free-blooming with long, bending stems.

X X

FESTIVA MAXIMA: white with crimson flakes on a few central petals; large beautifully formed blossoms; very free-blooming; very long, heavy, erect stems.

X X

JEANNE D'ARC: pale pink guards, yellow collar and full, high center of delicate pink with occasional carmine flecks.

X X

KARL ROSENFELD: bright crimson without a trace of blue; outer petals large and waved; central petals incurved and notched; very free-blooming, long, strong stems.

X X

LIVINGSTONE: old-rose-pink flaked on a lighter base; especially spicy fragrance; free-blooming and fairly long-stemmed.

X X

MADAME DE VERNEVILLE: white guards surrounding an incurved, blush-white center with crimson flecks; free-blooming, fairly long, bending stems.

X X

MADAME EMILE GALLE: very light rose-pink deeper toward center; translucent texture; charming delicate flower; free-blooming, fairly long, erect stems.

X X

MADAME GEISSLER: old-rose-pink, brighter in center and tipped on the reverse with silver; an enormous flower, compactly built of many crinkled petals; fairly free-blooming, rather short, bending stems.

X X

MARIE JACQUIN: white, semi-double, very pale pink on outer petals; large cluster of yellow stamens in center; beautiful water-lily shape; very free-blooming, fairly long, strong stems.

X X

MARIE LEMOINE: lemon-white with a few crimson flecks; whole flower suffused with yellow from hidden stamens; large globe-shaped blossom; fairly free-blooming; short, strong stems.

X X

MILTON HILL: very light shell-pink with a luminous quality; a few red flecks on central petals; very free-blooming, fairly long, strong stems.

X X

MODESTE GUERIN: deep tyrian pink of compact, bomb shape with brighter colored center; very free-blooming, fairly long, very strong stems.

MONSIEUR DUPONT: white with yellow glow from buried stamens and conspicuous crimson flecks on central petals; very free-blooming and long-stemmed.
MONSIEUR MARTIN CAHUZAC: maroon-crimson with a silky, black luster; loosely formed, straggly petals mixed with many stamens; the darkest and most picturesque of peonies; free-blooming; fairly long, erect stems.
PRIMEVERE: creamy white cupped guards with canary-yellow center of short, narrow petals; fades in full sunlight; free-blooming on very long, bending stems.

REINE HORTENSE: light, rose-pink with crisp, fluffy translucent petals, notched and silvered at the tips; occasional crimson flecks; very free-blooming and long-stemmed.

SARAH BERNHARDT: deep, rose-pink with occasional yellow anthers and a few red edges on central petals; unusually large, free-blooming on long, strong stems.

SOUV. DE L'EX. DE BORDEAUX: aster purple; tinged with silver on petal edges; full, very round bomb shape; very free-blooming; fairly long slender stems.

THERESE: enormous, long petals of pale, translucent, old-rose-pink, paling toward the base and illumined by a yellow glow in the depths; very free-blooming; long, strong stems.

TOURANGELLE: pale cream-white toning to flesh-pink in the center; a compact flower of irregularly placed petals; most delicate in appearance of all peonies; requires time for good development; long, bending stems.

UMBELLATA ROSEA: rose-pink guards surrounding a flesh-pink center; very early; blooms freely in clusters; long, strong stems.
