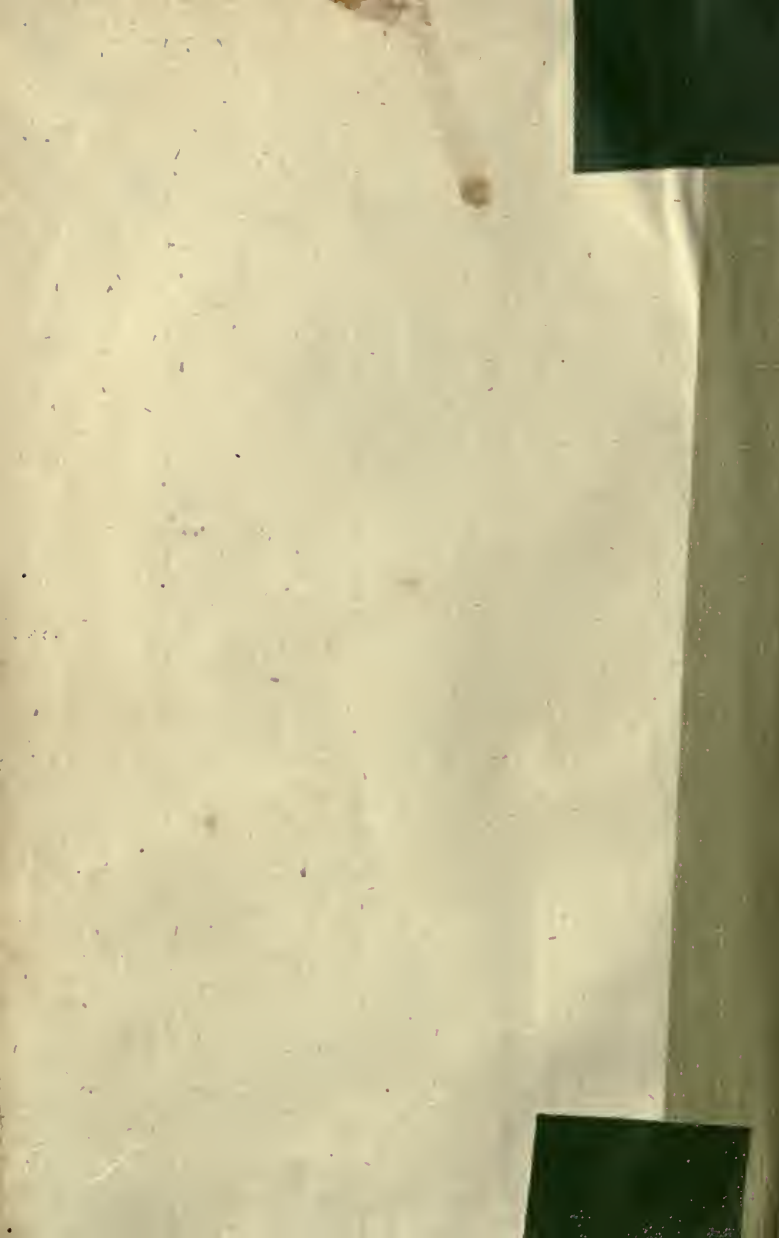

## P R E F A C E.

THE Utility of an accurate Description of the Roads is so obvious to every Person who travels as not to require any Demonstration; and as the Preference which the following Work claims, before any other of the Kind hitherto published, will be evident on the least Comparifon, we fhall decline enlarging on that Head, and only mention what is neceffary by Way of Explanation.

By the Plan adopted in executing this Work, it contains all the new Roads down to the prefent Time, with the Alterations and Improvements made in the old; and exhibits, at firft View, the Difftance of each City, Town, or remarkable Village, from London, with a particular Account of the Roads leading to it, meafured from the different Standards in London, according to the Mile-Stones on each Road, and arranged in the following Order, *viz.*

1. The Kent Roads, meafured from *London Bridge.*
2. The Croydon, Ryegate, and Epfom, Roads, from *Westminfter Bridge.*
3. The Kingfton Road, from the *Stones End in the Borough.*
4. The Brentford Road, from *Hyde-Park Corner.*
5. The Uxbridge and Edgeware Roads, from *Tyburn Turnpike.*
6. The Barnet Road, from the Spot where *Hicks's Hall* lately flood, in *St. John's Street*, near *Smithfield.*
7. The Ware Road, from *Shoreditch Church.*
8. The Effex Road, from *Whitechapel Church.*

The Measurements, which are taken in Miles, Halves and Quarters of Miles, are arranged in two Columns, the first giving the Distance from one City, Town, or Village, to the next; the second, the Number of Miles from the Commencement of the Road. And (for the farther Amusement of the Traveller) at the End of each Road is given a brief Account of whatever is worthy of Observation; such as Parks, Seats, Castles, Ruins, &c.

To find the Road from London to any City, Town, or remarkable Village, in England or Wales, look for the Name of the Place in *the Index to the Roads from London*, and the Figure opposite to it refers to the Page in which is that Part of the Road containing the Place looked for; thus, from London to Durham, the Index directs you to Page 168, where you find Durham with its Distance from London, &c. though the Description of the Road in which it is situated (being that from London to Edinburgh) begins in Page 165, and ends in Page 168.

In describing the less Roads branching out from the greater, the last remarkable Place on the great Road, or the Spot where the less turns off, is first given, with a Reference to the Place in which you will find the Road so far as to that Place; and afterwards the Branch is continued: as, for Instance, to find the Road from London to Chertsey, in Surry, the Index refers you to Page 50, where you find it in the following Form, *viz.*

By which it appears you are referred to Page 31 for this Road, as far as Hounslow, (the last remarkable Place on the great Road,) thence the Remainder of the Road to Chertsey is given after the above Form in Page 50, as directed



directed by the Index. In like Manner, for the Roads from London to Askrig, the Index directs to Page 176, whence you are referred to Page 167 for one Road as far as Boroughbridge, and (in Page 176) to Page 159 for another as far as Settle, the Continuation of each Road being given in Page 176. These References are made use of in order to prevent the numberless Repetitions, which otherwise would unavoidably occur in a Work of this Kind.

In looking for the Cross Roads, Recourse must likewise be had to *their* Index, which is so plain as to require no farther Explanation than what is there mentioned.

Having thus, to the best of our Abilities, supplied the Traveller with a full and accurate Description of a much greater Collection of Roads than was ever before attempted; yet, as the different Routs which Travellers may have Occasion to take are almost infinite, and consequently not comprisable in a Volume of this Size, we have, in order to complete our Plan, compiled, and published separately, a *Second Part* to this Work, entitled, *A TRAVELLING DICTIONARY: or Alphabetical Tables of the Distances of all the Cities, Borough, Market, and Sea-Port Towns, in Great-Britain, from each other, &c.* By these Tables, the Traveller will find the Compass he must make to visit any Place or Places which he may be desirous of taking in the Course of his Journey; and will likewise be enabled, at setting out, to form an Estimate of his Time and Expence, by ascertaining the Number of Miles he must travel, with the greatest Exactness, should the Tour he proposes to make be ever so much about, or irregular. Those who have experienced how varying, and often contradictory, have been the best Accounts they could procure of the Distances of Places on their Journey, and how vexatious in their Consequences, will readily acknowledge the Utility of a Work of this Kind.

The *Travelling Dictionary* being printed on the same Size as the *Description of the Roads*, the two bound together make a complete Travelling Companion.

The Roads of Scotland are also printed of the same Size, and may be had bound up with the above, or separate, Price 6d.

The Distances from the *Obelisk*, in *Fleet-street* to the Standards in London, from which the different Roads are measured.

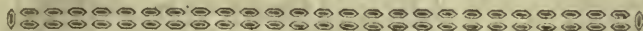

From Hereford to Hay is a very beautiful Ride through a rich enclosed Country, fertile in Corn; but not abounding so much with Hops and Apples as the eastern Part of Hereford.

On the l. see Crednall Hill and Park, at the Foot of which is a good House belonging to Mr. Eckley.

On the l. of New Ware is a House lately built by Will. Parry, Esq.

Beyond Bridge Sollers is Kenchester, a Roman Station, where several Antiquities have been found.

On the l. at the 6 Mile-stone, a View of the Wye; Shipton Hill on the right, whence is a fine View to the South over a Valley fruitful in Corn, watered by the Wye, and terminated by Mountains covered with Oak. See in this Valley the Churches of Preston upon Wye and Byford.

At Garnons, John Green Cotterell, Esq. and, more to the left, is Stanton upon Wye.

On the l. on the south Side the Wye, is Moccas Court, Sir George Cornwall, Bart.

North of the Wye is Morning, almost opposite to Moccas, lately purchased of Mr. Heywood by Sir

George Cornwall. This was the Estate of the famous Owen Glendour, in the Time of Henry IV. who is said to have retired here, and was buried in the Church.

At the ten-mile stone, where the Road divides to Kington, pass over Tin Hill, from which you have a fine View to the right.

At Bradwardine was formerly a Castle, but now destroyed, but the Foundations remain near the Church.

After passing the Wye at Bradwardine, leave Burbridge Hill to the South; a fine Valley to the North, watered by the Wye, on the north Bank of which are Winforton, and Letton Court, formerly belonging to the Booths, now the Estate of — Freeman, Esq. who is much improving the Place. West of Winforton, is Whitney, formerly the Seat of the ancient Family of Whitney, now of Tomkins Dewe, Esq.

Beyond Bradwardine, pass over a high Hill, called Penna Park, in the Parish of Clifford, belonging to Sir George Cornwall. Here are the Ruins of a Castle, which was the Estate of, and gave Name to, the Lord Clifford, afterwards Earls of Cumberland; but was exchanged by them with the Crown, temp. Edw. I. for Skipton in Yorkshire, still enjoyed by their Descendants.

On the r. of the Road, in the Parish of Clifford, is the More, now — Penoyre, Esq.

Enter Brecon at the Hay, a Market-Town on a Hill, South of the Wye, where has been a Castle, now nearly destroyed, and a House is now built on the Scite, belonging to Richard Wellington, Esq.

On the Road from Hay to Brecon is Marflough, seated on the north Bank on the Wye, Gov. Wilkins.

On the l. of Glasbury is the Lodge, Sir Edward Williams.

Farther to the l. see Talgorth Church, Hill, and Forest, where are the Remains of an ancient Castle.

On the l. of Bruntlis is Tregunter, a good House, lately built by Mr. Harris.

Leave the Turnpike Road, about seven Miles from Hay, down a narrow gloomy Lane to the left, which leads to Trevecka, noted for the late Lady Huntingdon's Methodist College, which contains eleven Students, with their Tutor.

Another Foundation is also here by Howel Harris, Esq. now in the Hands of his Executors, where seventy Men and Boys are fed, and clothed, and employed in the following Manner: At four in the Morning, Prayers and Preaching; then to work on the Turnpike Road; Breakfast at eight, Prayers, &c. again, and so on, Prayers and Work alternately.

Near Gofylehan, in the Parish of Llanerfyll, and about 3 Miles from Cann's Office, on the Pool Road, is the Roman Causeway, which formerly led from Caerfw's to Cauleon, or the City of Legions, now called West Chester. It crosses the Roman Road at this Place, which formerly led from Uriconium, or Wroxter, to Segontium, otherwise Caer Segeint, now called Carnarfore.

On the Church-yard of Llanerfil is a Stone Monument with a Roman Inscription.

Near the Village of Llanerfil stands Llwyfyn, with an extensive Park, formerly the Lords Herberts, Ancestors of the present Earl of Powis.

At Cann's Office is a noted Tumulus, or Barrow, which is supposed to be the Monument, and contains therein the interred Body of an antient British Chief. It is surrounded with the remains of an antient Fortification.

The Traveller, on Horseback, who wishes for a most exquisite Prospect, may have it by going from Shrewsbury to Welsh Pool by another Way. Go to Wespry  $8\frac{1}{2}$  Miles on the Montgomery Road, there turn by the Inn on the right Hand, keep a track over the Hill, inclining to the right, and go down to Buttington, known by a small Church, and, just beyond it, a wooden Bridge over the Severn. From the Brow of the Hill see the Vale, Powis Castle and Park, the Town, River, &c.

At  $3\frac{1}{2}$  Miles on the left, Onslow, Rowland Wingfield, Esq.

To the l. of the Road, on the River Team, 2 Miles from Ludlow, the fine Seat of Lord Clive, late Lord Powis. Not far from there, Mr. Walpole. Four Miles farther to the l. is Downton Castle, the noble Mansion and fine Walks of Richard Payne Knight, Esq.

At Rowton, on the right, Richard Lyster, Esq.

One Mile beyond Welsh Pool is Powis Castle and Park, Earl of Powis,

From Montgomery to Welsh Pool a new Turnpike Road is made, only  $7\frac{1}{2}$  Miles; it passes Lord Viscount Hereford's, crosses the Severn by Mr. Jones's, and then comes into the other Road.

Cann's, or Cannons Office, now an Inn in Montgomeryshire, was so called, either from having formerly been an Ecclesiastical Office, or else (and indeed more probably) a Military Office, from the Fortifications around it.

At Stevenage, a remarkably-built Barn, the ridge of it broad enough to contain a Coffin, which it now does, and is to be seen with the Body of Henry Trigg, a Shop-keeper of that Town, who built it for that Purpose, and, by Will, ordered his Body to be laid there.

At Bugden is the Bp. of Lincoln's Palace.

From Stilton to Grantham, at every Mile, are Blocks made of the famous Ketton Stone, with 3 Steps, which were placed there by Mr. Boulter, for the easy mounting of his Horse, he being a very corpulent Man, and travelled that Road every Week for many Years; each Stooe engraved E. B. 1708.

A Mile from Stamford, on the r. is Burleigh-House, the magnificent Seat of the Earl of Exeter, formerly the Residence of Treasurer Burleigh, in the Reign of Queen Elizabeth. Here is a beautiful Canal; also an extensive Park, which, with the Lordship round it, is supposed to contain more Game, Hares in particular, than any other Park in the Kingdom. Since the Houghton Collection of Pictures left this Kingdom, the Paintings in this House are reckoned the most valuable of any.

On the l. is Worthorp, a Seat in Ruins, also belonging to the E.

of Exeter. Here is an excellent and plentiful Spring of Water, from which the Town of Stamford is supplied.

Upon the Hill, from Casterton, on the l. is the Seat of John Wingfield, Esq.

At Woolsthorpe, a Hamlet to Coltsworth, is the House in which Sir Isaac Newton was born, whose Manor and Estates are now the Property of Edm. Turnor, Esq.

Beyond Grantham, on the right, is Belton, Lord Brownlow's; and a little beyond it, on a Hill, Sison-Hall, Sir John Thorold, Bart.

From Gunnerby Hill, a great Prospect; Lincoln Minster on the r. Belvoir Castle on the left.
