YESTERDAY Evening about sun-set, anchored in the Harbbar, the long expected Agamemnon, Captain J. Jackson Commander, from England.

The Agamemnon left Falmouth on the 8th of November, touched at the Cape of Good Hope on the 27th of January, and left it again on the 7th of February.

The Agamemnon having left England previous to the sailing of the Challenger, has brought no public News which has not been, some time ago, anticipated. A great number of private Letters have been brought by this Vessel, which we hope will serve to relieve the great anxiety which has been so long felt at this Presidency, for domestic news.

We understand that the Agamemnon left the Charlotte at the Cape, bound for Bombay.

This morning arrived H. M. Sloop Favorite Hon'ble J. H. Maude, Captain, from the Gulph, we hear that two packets have been forwarded from Bussora by the Favorite, but no intelligence has yet transpired.

Should we learn any thing of importance of a public nature, we shall publish another Extra.

A Letter has been received from the Hon'ble Company's Ship Carmarthen, Dated the 27th March, about a degree to the Southward of the Line : all well.
