CONDITIONS OF SALE.

- 1. The highest bidder to be the buyer; and if any dispute arise between bidders, the lot so disputed shall be immediately put up again, provided the seller cannot decide the said dispute.

It is not too much to say, that so far as Scottish Coins are concerned this is the most important Collection ever disposed of in this House. Besides numerous examples acquired in detail or incidentally procured, it contains the most valuable Coins of the Scottish portion of almost all the Cabinets sold, either privately or by public sale, during the last ten years.
