## European Parliament, Brussels, Kingdom of Belgium

We, representatives of the movements of indigenous peoples and the colonized regions of the Russian Federation, based on the Declaration on Decolonization, the Gdansk Manifesto, and the Memorandum on Termination of the Russian Federation, declare:

- The so-called Russian Federation is not a monolith, it is not one nation and not a single state. It is a colonial continental Empire where there are hundreds of colonized and virtually occupied indigenous peoples and regions. The future of every liberated nation and region must be decided by the people and the region itself based on the principle of self-determination of the nations up to secession and other generally recognized norms of international law
- Moscow and Moscovian "all-Russian" politicians do not have the right to speak for "all of Russia" it is necessary to revise the policy of supporting pseudo-democratic "all-Russian" movements and leaders, who annihilate the ideas of national and regional differences by "acting on behalf of all Russia".
  Such leaders and movements are one of the tools of the Kremlin's expansionist and imperialist policy, part of its propaganda and repression machine, and they should be deprived of this opportunity. In contrast, it should be a direct dialogue between the leaders of the EU and NATO states with representatives of the movements of indigenous peoples and regions.
- 3. Putin (at the same time a terrorist and war criminal number 1 in the world) with his clique of rashists, the same terrorists and war criminals, is not the cause, but only one of the symptoms, a consequence of the problem. The problem's source is the very imperial, anti-liberal, and anti-humanistic essence of the so-called Russian state. It is necessary to create a multi-scenario strategy for changes in Post-Russia, as well as effective tools for support, assistance, and constant dialogue, communication, and feedback for real dissident leaders of indigenous peoples and regions, in order to communicate with institutions and countries of the free world.
- 4. Only complete and irreversible decolonization of the so-called Russian Federation is the key to long-term peace and the creation of a new collective security architecture in Europe and the world.
- 5. Acceptance of complete denuclearization and maximum demilitarization (not only of all types of mass destruction weapons but also of all offensive weapons) by future post-Russian independent states as the ground for their de-occupation, recognition of their independence, and socio-economic Reconstruction programs.
