

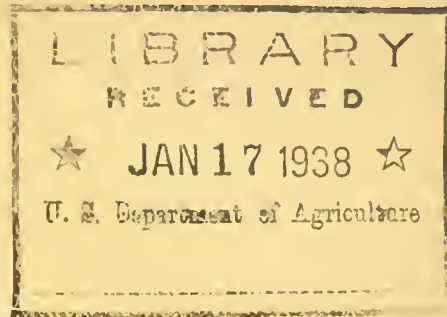

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FOREWORD

This list is designed to show the sources of prices and other statistics and economic material relating to dairy products in the periodicals currently received in the United States Department of Agriculture Library. These include trade journals, price lists, the more general dairy periodicals, and official publications of the United States and of some other governments. An exception has been made in the case of the official publications of the individual States of the United States, as they were included in Agricultural Economics Bibliography No. 38, List of State Official Serial Publications Containing Material on Agricultural Economics.

The statistics found in these publications are varied. They include production, receipts, cold storage holdings, shipments, exports, imports, value, and prices (wholesale, jobbers', f.o.b., and retail) and cover milk, butter, cream, cheese, and manufactured milk and milk products. Prices of feedstuffs frequently appear. A statement of the type of information found in each publication has been given in a descriptive note, and a detailed index has been included.

General agricultural publications, such as farm papers and other periodicals, which frequently contain statistics relating to dairy products, have been omitted. "Crops and Markets" and "Foreign Crops and Markets," issued by the United States Department of Agriculture, have been omitted, as much of the statistical material which they contain appears first in other publications of the Department which are included.

While most of the periodicals contained in this list are published in the United States, eighteen foreign countries or parts of countries are represented. These are Argentina, Austria, Australia, Brazil, British Columbia, Canada, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, France, Germany, Gt. Britain, Ireland, Italy, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Sweden, and Switzerland.

Classified advertisements appear in each issue.
Feedstuffs prices at principal markets, by carlots, give prices
for bran middlings, flour middlings, cottonseed meal, linseed meal,
soy bean meal, gluten feed, hominy feed, and alfalfa meal at
Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Buffalo, Chicago, Milwaukee,
Minneapolis, Cincinnati, St. Louis, Kansas City, Atlanta, Memphis,
Fort Worth, Denver, Ogden, Los Angeles, San Francisco and Portland.
Monthly Cold Storage report (U.S.Bureau Agr. Econ.) shows storage
stocks of cream, creamery butter, packing stock butter, cheese,
by kinds, etc., while storage holdings, Pacific Coast Section in-

The Library of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has jaarg. 1, no. 23 to jaarg. 2, no. 32, June 10, 1921 to August 11, 1922; jaarg. 18, no. 33, August 18, 1922 to date.

This journal, which is devoted to the hygiene of butter, cheese and milk, absorbed Nederlandsch Tijdschrift voor Melkhygiëne, August 18, 1922. It assumed the year numbering of this journal but kept its own issue numbering. V.1, no. 23, June 10, 1921 to v. 2, no. 32, August 11, 1922 has title, Algemeen Zuivelblad.

Each issue contains market reports, both domestic and foreign, from various cities, showing supply, prices, high and low for different days, with average prices for the day and for the week, of butter on various Dutch markets, of various kinds of cheese, milk in Friesland, condensed milk on various markets (including New York and London), powdered milk, the freight situation and the coal market.

A section is devoted to shipping and trade, and articles dealing with various phases of the industry are included.

A review of labor conditions, notices of conferences, etc. are given.

3. Algemeenen Nederlandschen Zuivelbond. Officieel Orgaan [weekly] Den Haag, Hugo de Grootstr, 13. 44.9 Al3

The Library of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has jaarg. 16, no. 823, Feb. 8, 1922 to date.

Has monthly supplement "Extra Blad" separately paged, January 1924 to date.

A section showing production statistics of butter, cheese, manufactured milk and margarine includes production, cold storage holdings, exports, etc.; production of cheese, condensed whole milk, condensed skim milk, milk powder, casein; and margarine.

The International market for milk and milk products shows sales of butter in Germany, Belgium, England, France, United States; cheese in Germany, France and Italy; powdered milk in Germany, England and France; condensed milk in France, Germany, and England; and cream in England.

A market report shows prices on domestic markets - Edam cheese in North Holland and on the Cheese exchange at Alkmaar; Golden and Edam cheese in Friesland and in South Holland (cheese produced on farms); production of condensed milk and milk powder.

Market reports from foreign countries show receipts of butter and cheese by country of origin with prices for cheese, also by country of origin.

Imports of butter and cheese in England by country of origin are shown.

Market reports from Germany, France, and Denmark appear.

Rates of exchange are given - Amsterdam with London, Berlin, Paris, Brussels, Copenhagen and New York.

One issue of each month shows exports of butter and cheese by country of destination; also imports of butter, cheese, and casein by country of origin; another shows exports of condensed whole milk, condensed skim milk, milk powder, sterilized milk, and cream for month previous to month of issue.

The regulation of milk consumption; new patents; notices and reports of meetings; articles, usually unsigned, relating to

various phases of the dairy industry, make up the publication.

The monthly supplement "Extra Blad" is given over to minutes of the proceedings of various organizations of the dairy industry.

The Library of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has October 3, 1928 to date.

October 3, 1928 to January 21, 1931, incomplete.

October 3, 1928 to August 28, 1929 have title: "Market News"; September 4, 1929 to March 4, 1931 have title "Chicago Market."

March 11, 1931 to 1934 are nos. 174-383.

Gives prices on the Chicago market; average prices on the London market for Danish, New Zealand, Dutch and Siberian butter; and the cooperative butter make for the week, showing number of plants of American Association and Pacific States creameries.

Occasionally cold storage figures are given for creamery butter, American cheese, eggs, cream (frozen & liquid) in the United States; and occasionally oleomargarine production (represented by taxes paid) is given.

The Land-O-Lakes report of butter production which was formerly included was discontinued with the March 18th, 1936 issue.

New legislation, reprints of comments, new developments in the industry, etc. are included as well as notices and reports of meetings of associations, etc.

A section entitled "Dairy Markets and Statistics", shows the butter and cheese situation, giving comparative receipts and prices at New York; daily and weekly prices of butter at Chicago and Montreal; butter futures on the Chicago Clearing House; and price for cheese at New York, daily, and at Plymouth, Wis., and Montreal, weekly. Retail prices at New York for eggs and butter by grades, also wholesale retail price spread for butter and eggs are given.

The section dealing with the concentrated milk market gives prices, f.o.b., New York City, of condensed milk (case and bulk), evaporated whole milk (case), dry skimmilk; prices f.o.b. New York State factory, of condensed skimmilk, butterfat, and whole milk condensed.

Milk receipts on the New York, Boston, and Philadelphia milk markets; frozen cream stocks in the warehouses of New York State and Greater New York are given. Dairymen's League pool price of milk for the month is included.

The section, entitled "The Egg Market and Statistics" includes prices and receipts for the New York market, prices and receipts of Pacific Coast eggs on the New York market; egg futures (Chicago, New York); number cars sold and prices; and auction prices of eggs at various Eastern points.

A page entitled "Observations by the Egg Man" includes egg stocks at leading markets, storage stocks at thirty-five cities, trade output of four leading markets and of the New York market.

Live and Dressed Poultry Markets shows New York City receipts, storage holdings in the United States and 26 cities; prices on the New York market for poultry (broilers, leghorns, fryers, capons, roasters, fowls, old cocks, turkeys, ducks, squabs, and pigeons; frozen poultry (chickens, fowls, geese, turkeys, ducks), and the number and prices of poultry moved into New York by truck and express (fowls, broilers, pullets, old roasters, turkeys, ducks, geese, pigeons, squabs, guineas, and rabbits).

A page entitled "Chat about Butter" includes butter stocks, at leading markets, storage stocks at twenty-six cities, trade output at 4 leading markets and at New York, U. S. storage stocks, etc.

Live Poultry Statistics show freight, truck and express receipts in New York, by State of origin (data from U.S.D.A.)

The wholesale-retail price spread of butter and eggs in New York City and New York retail prices of eggs and butter are shown.

A classified advertising section is included and also the week's news from the capital, covering legislation, etc.

Signed articles on various phases of the industry are included.

6. American Creamery Operator and the Milk and Ice Cream Plant [semi-monthly], St. Paul, Minn., 300 Dakota Bldg., 54 West Seventh St. 44.8 An36

The Library of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has v. 1, Mar. 1, 1926 to date.

This is the official paper of the North Dakota Creamery Operators Association and the South Dakota Dairy Association.

V. 1, 1926 has title "American Creamery Operator."

V. 3, no. 22 to v. 4, no. 22, Nov. 15, 1928 to Nov. 15, 1929, official organ of the North Dakota Local Creameries Association; v. 4, no. 23, Dec. 1, 1929 to date, official paper of the North Dakota Local Creameries Association and the South Dakota Dairy Association.

At least one signed article, usually a copy of an address delivered before some meeting and dealing with some timely topic relating to the industry, is included. Statistics appear only

incidentally in the various articles.

Editorials cover new and needed legislation, contests, methods, etc.

Happenings in the Industry, by N. W. Hepburn, is a regular feature.

Brief reports of conventions, resolutions passed, etc. are presented. Classified advertisements appear in each issue; as does also a column headed "Coming Events" which contains notices of meetings of associations and congresses.

New books and recent periodical articles pertinent to the subject are listed.
8. Boston fruit and produce exchange. Produce report [daily] Boston. Mimeographed.
The Library of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has Sept. 10, 1917 to date.
The report contains a summary of cold storage holdings - butter, eggs, cheese, and poultry in 4, 6, and 10 markets; - Boston, New York and Chicago receipts of these four commodities; prices of butter and eggs by grades on the New York, Chicago, and Boston markets; and butter and eggs, New York call.
9. Breeder and Dairyman [monthly] Harrisburg, Pa., Benn-Chester publishing co. 44.8 H74

Contains articles of general interest to dairymen on subjects such as feeding, care and testing of cattle; articles on ways to increase the consumption of dairy cattle; and articles on various problems of the milk industry, including reasons for Government regulation.
Notices and reports of meetings of associations are included.
10. British Columbia. Department of agriculture, Dairy branch. Dairy circular. [irregular] Victoria, Printed by Charles F. Banfield, printer to the King's Most Excellent Majesty. 44.9 B772
The Library of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has no. 1, 1921 to date.
Each year a bulletin is devoted to a List of Dairy Sires of the Jersey, Guernsey, Holstein, and Ayrshire Breeds...; while another consists of Certified Milk and Butter-fat Records. Other bulletins deal with various phases of the dairy industry.

11. C.M.P.A. Bulletin; official publication of the Connecticut Milk Producers' Association. [monthly] Hartford, 130 Washington St. 44.9 C766

The Library of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has no. 15, October 1920; no. 19, February 1921 to date.

This bulletin gives milk prices set by the association each month; brief discussion of farms and dairies in Connecticut; articles of current interest; hints to dairymen for increase of products; and discussion of new legislation.

12. California Dairyman; a journal devoted to the interests of the dairy and livestock industries. [bi-weekly] Hynes, Calif., 365 So. Paramount Blvd. 44.8 C12

The Library of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has v. 1, no. 1, February 4, 1922 to date.

This is the official organ of the California Milk Producers' Association.

Hints to dairymen on the production of dairy products are included. Throughout the year, condition and annual reports of various dairy associations of other States appear. Articles of current interest relating to such subjects as dairy farm management, cooperative marketing and cooperative extension work are published in each issue. Announcements of auction sales are given regularly.

No. 2 has title "News Letter."

V. 1, no. 2, Jan. 10, 1920 to v. 5, Feb. 11, 1920 issued by Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Cold Storage Branch.

No. 31 has supplement which contains information as to iced car service for butter, eggs and cheese; inspection of iced butter and cheese cars; cargo inspection; dairy market intelligence service; dairy news letter; and inspection of dairy products.

V. 1, no. 6, Mar. 10, 1920 to v. 4, no. 52, Dec. 10, 1923 issued by Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Cold Storage Branch, Markets Division.

V. 5, no. 57 to date issued by Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Cold Storage Branch, Division of Dairy Markets and Cold Storage.

The publication contains: Federal butter and cheese grading - pasteurized and unpasteurized; Quantity of milk and milk products imported into Canada during second month preceding month of issue (milk and cream, butter, casein, cheese, condensed milk, powdered milk); U. S. cold storage holdings on 1st of month of issue (Creamery butter, American cheese); Quantity and value of Canadian milk and milk products exported from Canada during second month preceding month of issue (cream, fresh milk, butter,

cheese, condensed milk, milk powder, evaporated milk, and casein) by country of destination; Production of creamery butter and factory cheese in Canada, by provinces, for month preceding month of issue and the 6 months ending with that month; Report of holdings of butter and cheese in all Canada on second of month of issue compared with second of same month of previous year; Imports of butter, cheese and condensed milk into the United Kingdom (From Accounts Relating to Trade and Navigation of the U. K.) by country of origin.

Notes on the dairy industry in other countries - Australia, the United States, Belgium, Italy, New Zealand, etc., usually reprinted from some journal and frequently containing statistics are a regular feature.

No. 1, May 24, 1919 has at head of title: Dairy and Cold Storage Branch.

No. 2 to 32, May 31, 1919 to Feb. 23, 1920 have at head of title: Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Cold Storage Branch.

No. 33 to 175, May 1, 1920 to Apr. 19, 1924 have at head of title: Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Cold Storage Branch, Markets Division.

No. 176, Apr. 26, 1924 to date have at head of title: Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Cold Storage Branch, Division of Dairy Markets and Cold Storage.

"Quotations for Montreal and Toronto are, so far as can be ascertained, ruling prices to manufacturers for butter and cheese delivered there and should not be considered as prices at which purchases can be made from wholesalers. Prices quoted as being paid on country boards are, unless otherwise stated, f.o.b. country shopping points."

Prices by grades on the Montreal, Toronto and New York markets are given for butter and cheese. Volume of cheese offered for grading in the province of Ontario is included and receipts of butter and cheese at Montreal are given.

Exports for the week of butter and cheese from Montreal and Quebec by port of destination are shown.

A postscript gives prices of cheese and butter at Montreal and Toronto for the date of issue.

15. Canada. Dominion bureau of statistics, Agricultural branch. Stocks of dairy and poultry products. [monthly] Ottawa. [Mimeographed] 253 C1625

The Library of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has v. 19, no. 7, July 1, 1936 to date.

With its Cold Storage Holdings of Meat and Fish in Canada (295.9 C16C0) and its Cold Storage Stocks of Apples and Small

Fruits (295.9 C166) continues its Cold Storage Holdings in Canada (295.9 C16) of which the Library has v. 2, no. 7, July 1919 to v. 17, December 1934. Continues the volume numbering of its Cold Storage Holdings in Canada.

V. 19, no. 7, July 1, 1936 to v. 20, no. 3, March 1937 have title "Production of Butter and Cheese (June 1936 to February 1937) and Stocks of Dairy and Poultry Products."

Beginning with April 1937, Production of Butter and Cheese is issued on separate mimeographed sheet and shows production of creamery butter and factory cheese in Canada, by provinces, for month preceding month of issue, with corresponding month of previous year.

Statistics appearing in Stocks of Dairy and Poultry Products show: Creamery butter, stocks in cold storage and dairy factories in Canada, by provinces on date of issue, with comparative holdings on 1st of preceding month and for the corresponding month of previous year; Dairy butter stocks in cold storages and dairy factories in Canada by provinces; Eggs in cold storages and creameries in Canada, by provinces; Milk products in cold storages and dairy factories in Canada (condensed whole milk, evaporated whole milk, whole milk powder, cream powder, condensed skim milk, evaporated skim milk, skim milk powder, buttermilk powder, and casein); Poultry stocks in cold storages and creameries in Canada, by provinces (broilers, chickens, fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys); Car-loads of butter, eggs, and poultry in transit in Canada, by provinces. (These statistics are all as of 1st of month of issue with comparative figures for preceding month and for corresponding month of previous year.)

Statistics show also: Stocks of butter and cheese in the principal cities of Canada; Stocks of eggs and of poultry (by kinds) in the principal cities of Canada (Montreal, Quebec, Toronto, Winnipeg, Regina and Saskatoon, Calgary, Edmonton, and Vancouver). Carloads of butter, eggs and poultry at principal railway terminals in Canada; and Analysis of reporting firms (creameries, cheese factories, and cold storage).

A preliminary statement showing stocks of butter, cheese, and eggs in the principal cities of Canada (Quebec, Montreal, Toronto, Winnipeg, Regina, and Saskatoon, Calgary, Edmonton, Vancouver) is issued in mimeographed form. The list of cities covered and the title vary.

The Library of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has July 1929 to date.

Title varies.

Concentrated milk production for the month with comparative statistics for the preceding month and for the corresponding month of the past year includes statistics of condensed milk (sweetened, case and bulk) condensed skim milk, evaporated milk (unsweetened - case and bulk), evaporated skim milk, whole milk powder, skim milk powder, cream powder, buttermilk powder, condensed buttermilk, casein and sugar of milk.

Cumulative production for the same products is given with comparative statistics for the year before.

Production by months of condensed milk, evaporated milk and skin milk powder is given for the current year.

Imports and exports of condensed milk, evaporated milk, milk powder and casein are given for the current month, the preceding month and the corresponding month of the year before.

Concentrated milk products in cold storage warehouses on the first of the month, with comparative statistics for the preceding month and for the corresponding month of the year previous are given.

Exports (volume and value) by countries of destination are given for cream, cheese, fresh milk, butter, condensed milk, milk powder, evaporated milk, casein, total milk and its products, and eggs.

18. Canada. Dominion bureau of statistics, External trade branch. Imports of milk and its products and eggs. (External trade press bulletin No. 101) [monthly] Ottawa, Dept. of trade and commerce. Mimeographed. 253 St25I

The Library of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has June 1926 to date.

June 1926 to December 1930 are External Trade Press Bulletin No. 125.

Imports of milk and cream, butter, casein, cheese, condensed milk, powdered milk, total milk and its products, eggs in the shell and eggs, frozen, dried, etc. are contained in this publication. Volume and value with country of origin are shown for each commodity.

International markets show prices of butter at London, by country of origin; prices of butter in various cities on the Continent; prices of cheese at London, by kind and by country of origin; and prices of cheese by kinds in various countries of the continent.

Foreign Commerce of France shows imports and exports of cheese and butter, by country of origin and of destination - also imports and exports of certain milk concentrates, casein, milk sugar, etc.
