

b. Reparations items removed from a privately owned facility for authorized use by the Occupation Forces will be returned to the plant from which it was taken or to a branch plant of the same company.

c. Surveillance will be exercised by Civil Affairs Regions to assure that adequate cleaning and preservative measures are accomplished by the using agencies prior to return from authorized use to dead storage.

Occupation Force units will submit a report to this headquarters through Civil Affairs Regions showing the complete inventory number and description for each machine or piece of equipment, Occupation Force organization from which equipment was returned and the code number, name and address of the arsenal or plant to which the equipment is returned for storage.

e. The expenses incurred in the return of reparations equipment mentioned in paragraph 2a and 2b above from authorized use status will be borne by the Occupation Forces.

3. Civil Affairs Regions will coordinate and expedite admittance of Occupation Forces to reparation plants for the purpose of inspecting reparations equipment for Occupation Force usage as outlined in paragraph 2a of reference 1b.

2. Procedure and criteria for the use of reparations equipment by the Occupation Forces are as follows:

a. Occupation Forces having a justifiable requirement for equipment located in reparations plants may conduct such inspections of the equipment as are deemed necessary by competent authority. Arrangements for inspection of reparations items will be made with the local Regional Civil Affairs Team. No inspection of reparations plants will be conducted without clearance from the Regional Civil Affairs Team.

b. Requests for the use of reparations items by Occupation Forces will be submitted through normal military channels to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Requests will fully identify the item requested by complete inventory number and nomenclature.

c. Accountability records of reparations equipment approved for use will be maintained as directed in references 1a and 1b above.

d. Occupation Forces using reparations equipment will provide necessary maintenance and security for such equipment.

e. All expenses incidental to placing reparations equipment in authorized use by the Occupation Forces will be charged to Termination of War funds.

3. Return of reparations equipment no longer required for use by Occupation Forces will be accomplished as follows:

a. Equipment to be returned will be cleaned and projective lubricants applied for dead storage by the Using Occupation Force Unit.

b. Name and location of the plant or arsenal to which the equipment is to be returned will be obtained from the appropriate Regional Civil Affairs Team. The equipment will be returned to the designated plant by the Using Occupation Force Unit. Expenses incurred in the return of reparations equipment from an authorized use status will be charged to Termination of War funds.

c. Return of equipment will be reported to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, showing the complete inventory number and description for each machine or piece of equipment, Occupation Force Organization from which equipment was returned, and the code number, name and address of plant to which equipment was returned for storage. This information will be furnished by the Using Occupation Force Unit.

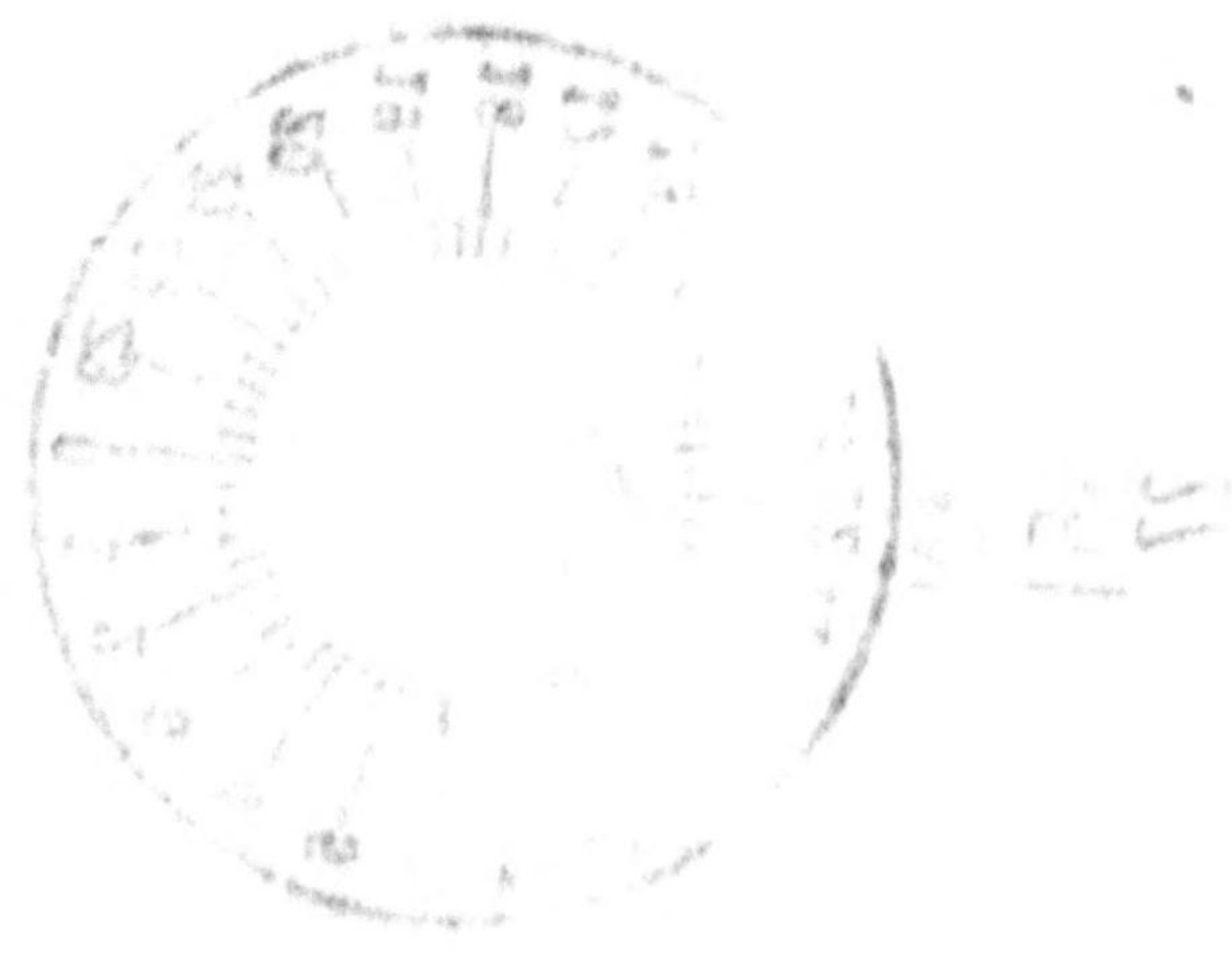

b. Operational Directive 11, Civil Affairs Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, subject: "Industry", dated 10 April 1950.

2. Under the present existing policies, arsenal reparations equipment released from custody as melt down scrap, reverts to the status of Former Military Supplies and, therefore, can be further released to the Japanese Government as such by the Regional Post Engineers under Operational Instructions #5, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, dated 10 April 1950.

3. The Japanese have been informed that upon receipt of the release from the Regional Post Engineers, the reparations equipment will be destroyed. A physical inspection will be conducted by the Kyushu Civil Affairs Region to insure that the items are rendered permanently unserviceable prior to removal from the custodial area.

4. In compliance with the above reference the Japanese Government must submit a report to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within

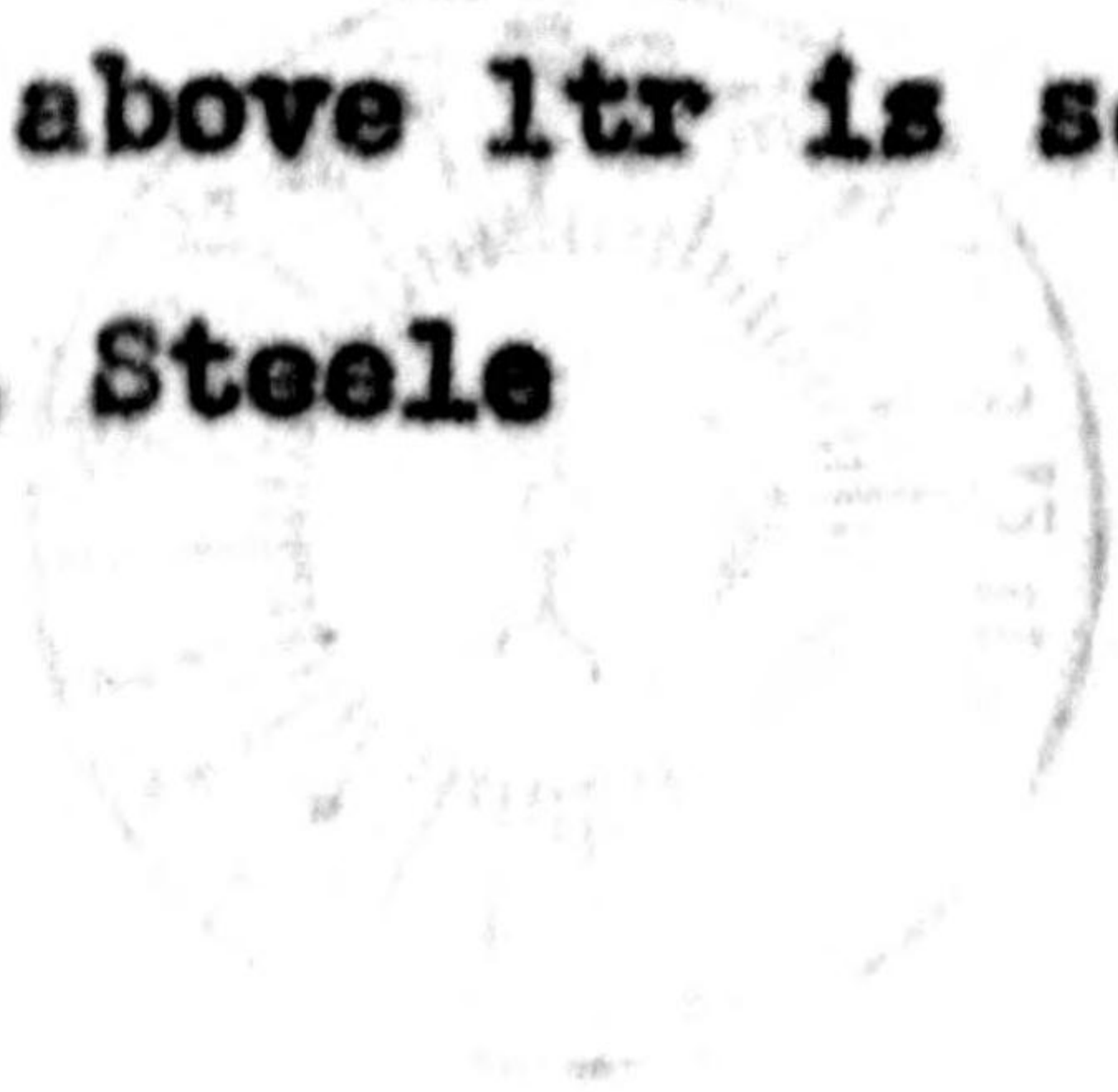


