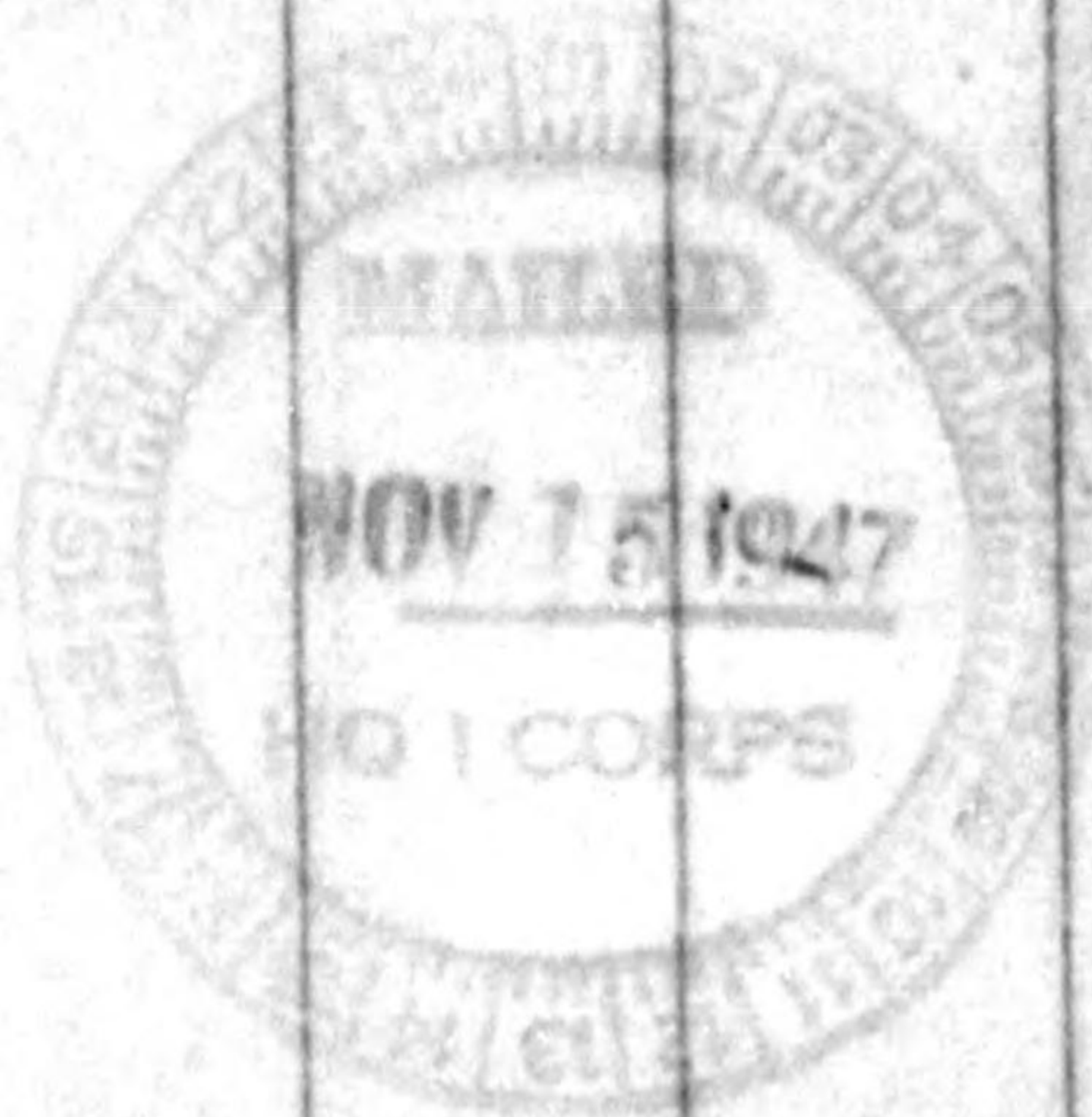

SUBJECT: Disruption of Staple Food Collection Program.

THRU : Commanding Officer, Tokai-Hokuriku Mil Govt Region, APO 710.

TO : Commanding Officer, Nara Military Government Team, APO 25.

1. Mie Prefecture is now preparing its 1948 Rice Collection Program. Difficulty is anticipated in completing the large quota required, and this Unit is making every effort to assure collection of the full quota. Large amounts of staple foods are being carried from Mie Prefecture to Nara by blackmarketeers. Mie Prefectural Police are cooperating by maintaining check points at principal stations throughout Mie Prefecture. However, since blackmarketeers operate in large numbers and exercise considerable ingenuity in avoiding detection, it is impossible for this Prefecture alone to stop the outgoing flood of staple foods.

2. It is requested that Nara Police be instructed to make seizures of excessive amounts of subject food at Yagi and Nara Stations. It is further requested that Military Police maintain surveillance to insure that the Japanese Police carry out their assignment.

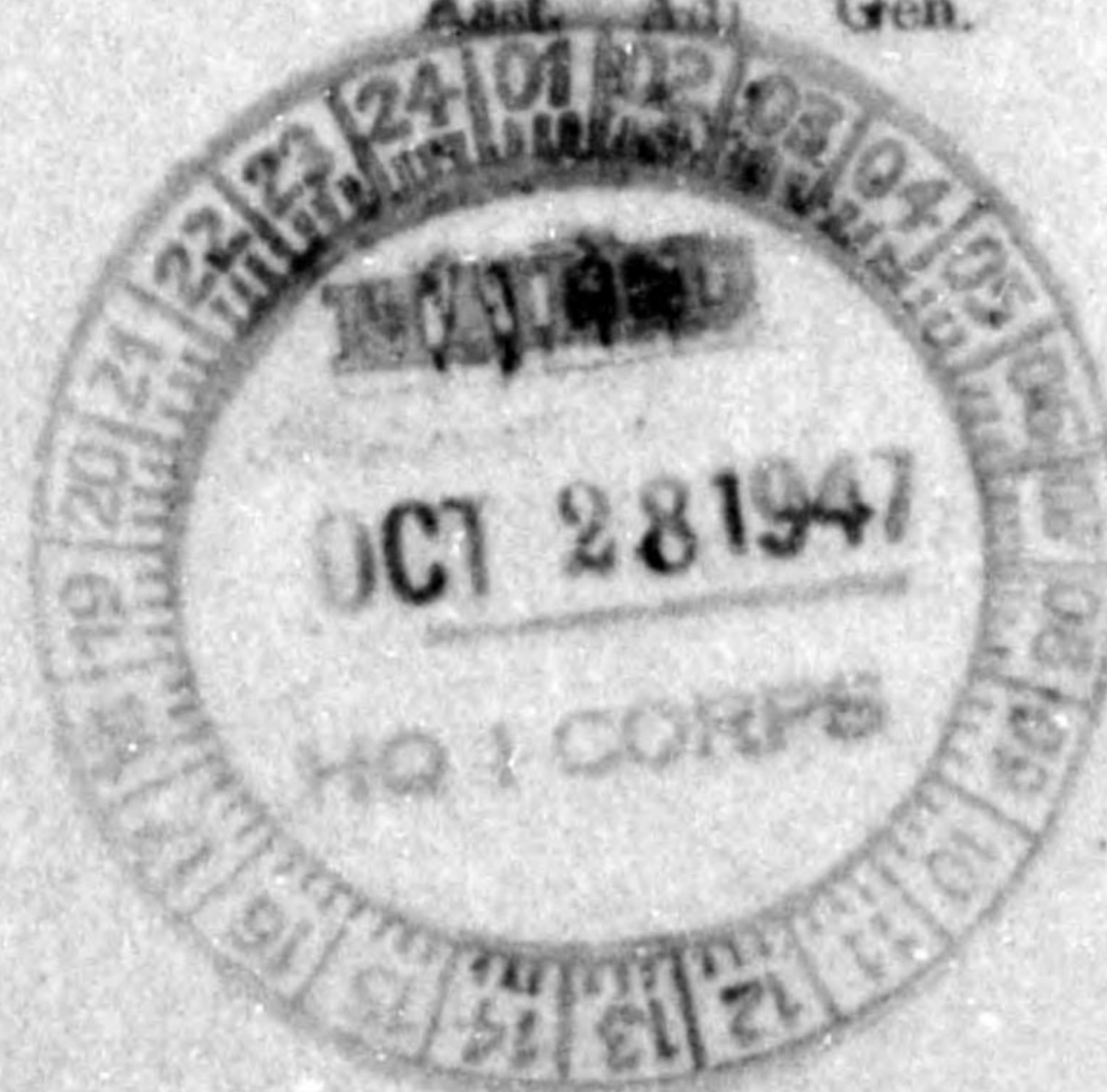

1. At the present time there are 43 policemen and 53 'Economic Inspectors' working in connection with the prevention of illegal sale and transportation of critical items. The control plan formulated by Prefecture officials calls for 68 policemen and 53 Economic Inspectors. Police officials state that the shortage is due to the fact that there are not enough qualified men available.
2. Check-points at Oji and Nijo, both key rail centers in the illegal transportation of critical items, have been enlarged recently. Two new check-points have been established at the Prefecture Boundary of Narasaka and Minami-Tahara.
3. A special team of police has been operating at Yagi Station for some time and has recently been enlarged. The police has been making seizures of excessive amounts of food at Nara Station and other strategic points. Spot checks are made on the trains of the Kansai-line at regular intervals.
4. Special emphasis has been placed on the large scale operators and brokers or sellers of blackmarket materials in order to prevent staple food and critical items from leaving the Prefecture.
5. Japanese police have been instructed to increase their efforts to control the transportation of blackmarket materials. It is expected that they will cooperate to the best of their ability and that the situation will be improved.

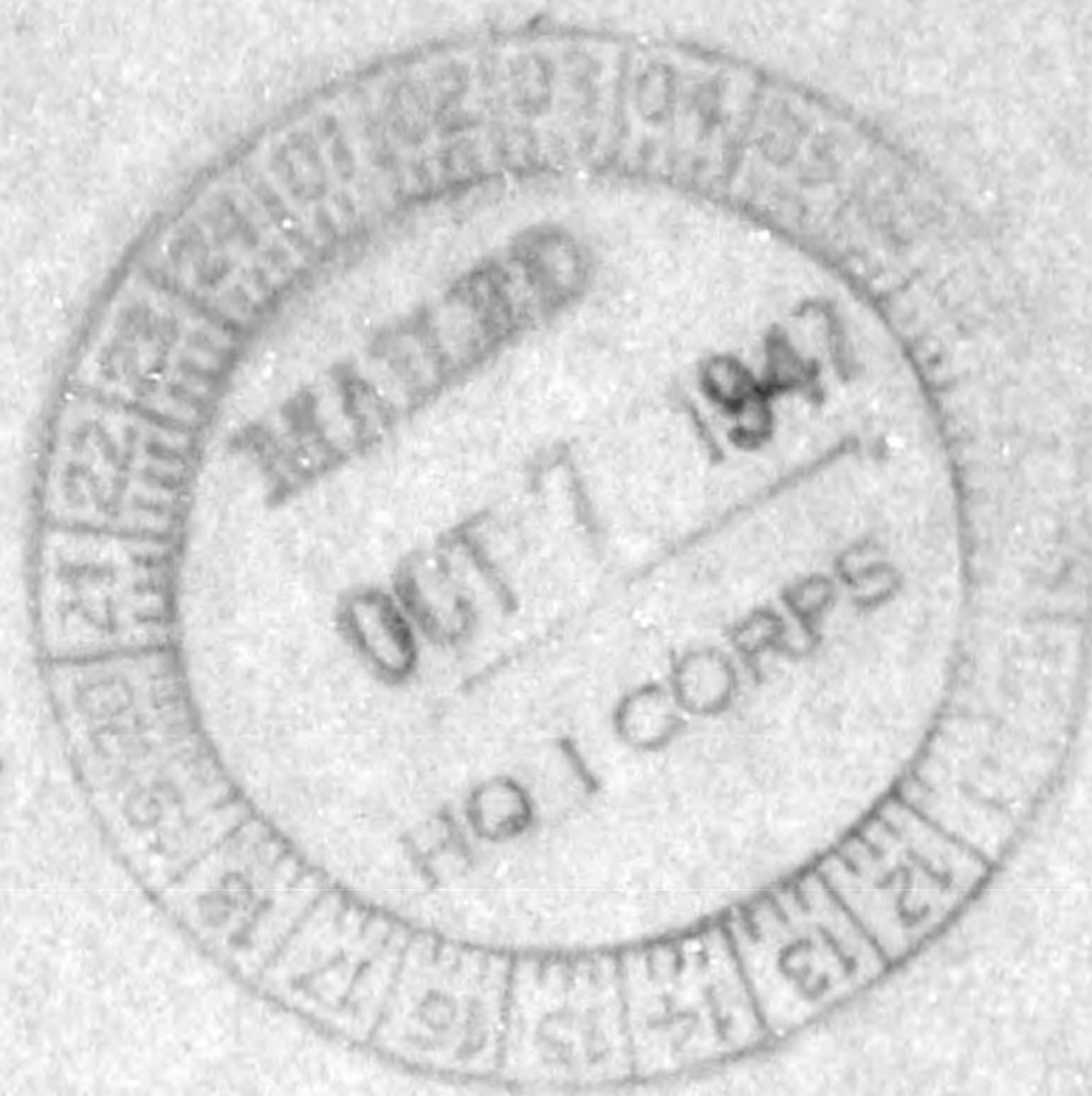

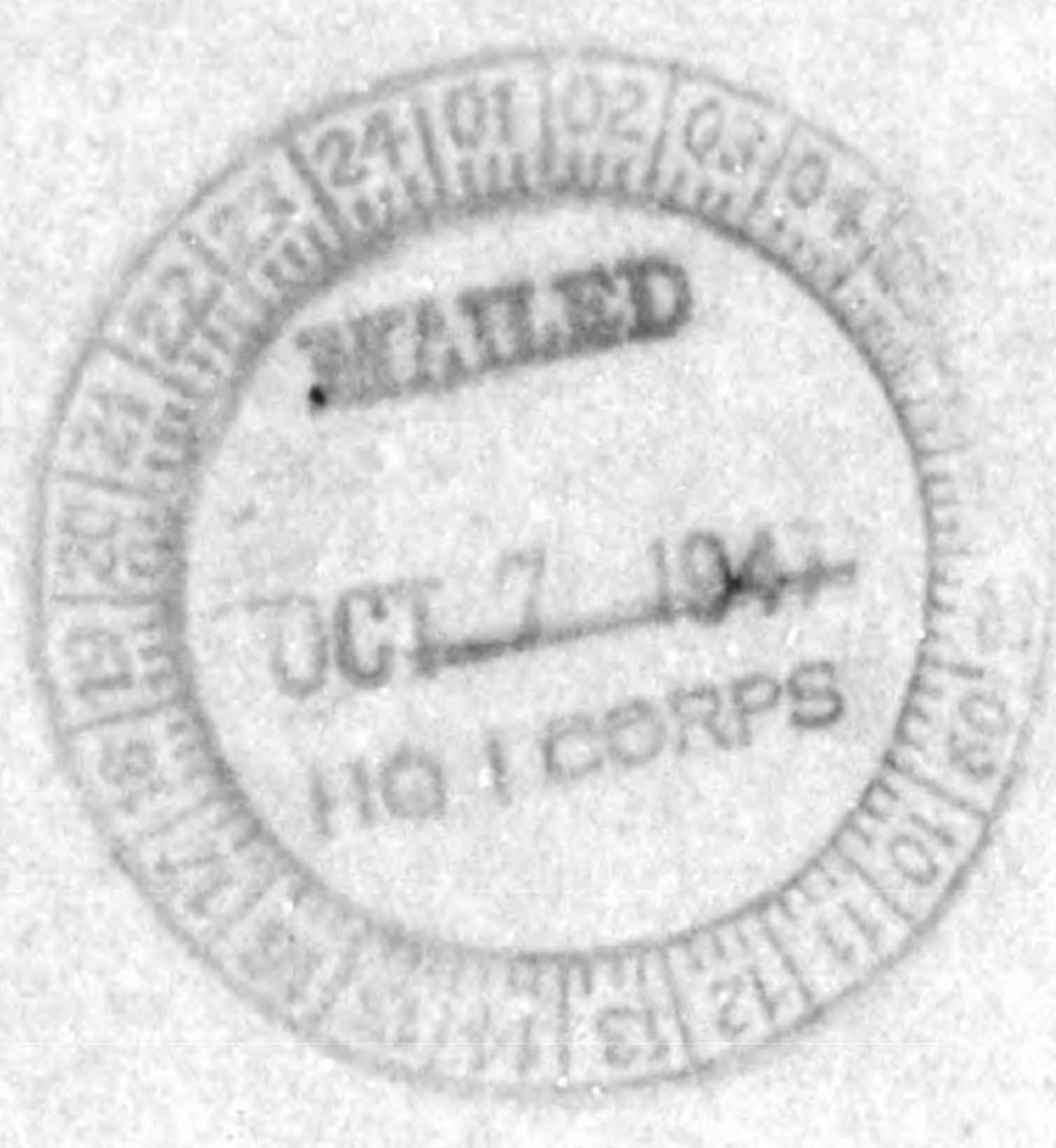

SUBJECT: Delayed Release of Butter to Foreign Nationals

TO : Commanding General
I Corps

1. Following receipt on 25 September of a complaint from the Foreign Nationals' Food Distribution Center that Japanese were withholding release of the September butter ration pending an expected increase in price, an investigation was made by this headquarters.

2. Original charges by the Distribution Center specified that requests for the September butter ration were made to the Kobe Branch of the Hokkaido Rakuno Kyodo Kabushiki Kaisha (distributors of dairy products, known as Kono Kosha) on the 1st, 10th, 20th and 25th of September. The Hokkaido Rakuno Kyodo K. K. repeatedly asked for delay in delivery.

3. An interview with Mr. Yoshiyasu, manager of the Kobe Branch of the Hokkaido Rakuno Kyodo K. K. disclosed that 20,000 pounds of butter had been in storage in Osaka (from which Kobe draws) since August. Delays in delivery had been ordered by the Tokyo branch of the company (Mr. Seo, Tokyo To, Chiyoda-ku, Nihonbashi Edohashi 1 chome 15) in anticipation of an increase in official prices. According to Mr. Yoshiyasu the increase was necessary because the government subsidy for butter was discontinued at the end of August. Notice was received on 27 September that prices had been increased from ¥ 88 to ¥ 200.25 per pound carton, and delivery to the Foreign Nationals' Distribution Center was made on 29 September.

4. Three issues are involved in the above situation:

a. Whether or not the butter should have been delivered for rationing at the price existing up to 27 September, and prior to that date.

b. Since the butter was available at the company's distribution point in Osaka during the ration period, whether that butter delivered on 29 September should be paid for at the former or present price.

c. If, because of withholding, the butter was considered as not available, should Ken authorities have substituted canned butter, as permitted by SCAP directives, despite the fact that no release of "A" class foods had been made for the period July, August and September.

2. The subject 4,714,459 kilograms of imported powdered skim milk has been released to the Japanese Government to supplement present food supplies for distribution to school children as part of the school lunch program. Distribution will be made in accordance with the following plan.

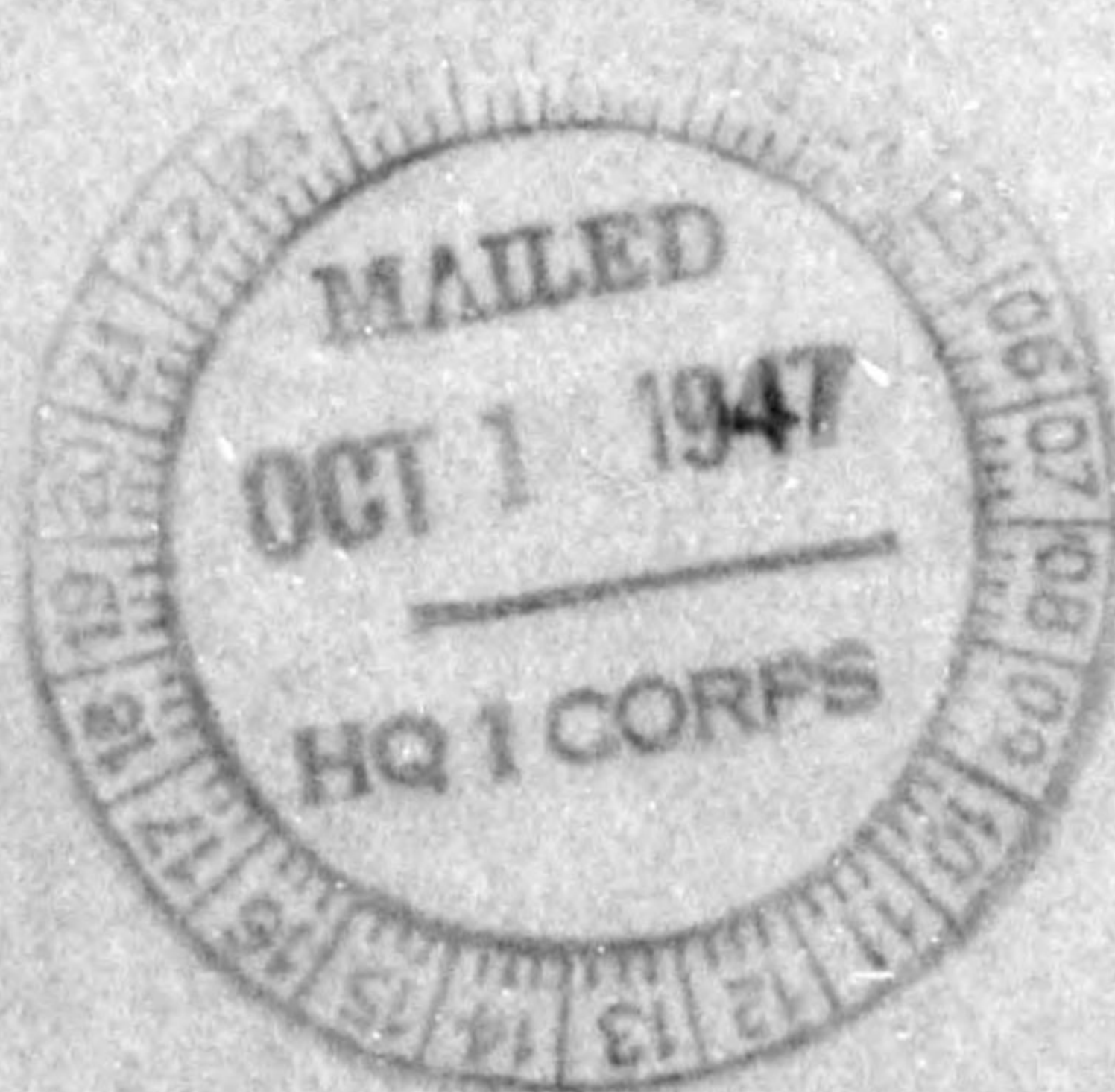

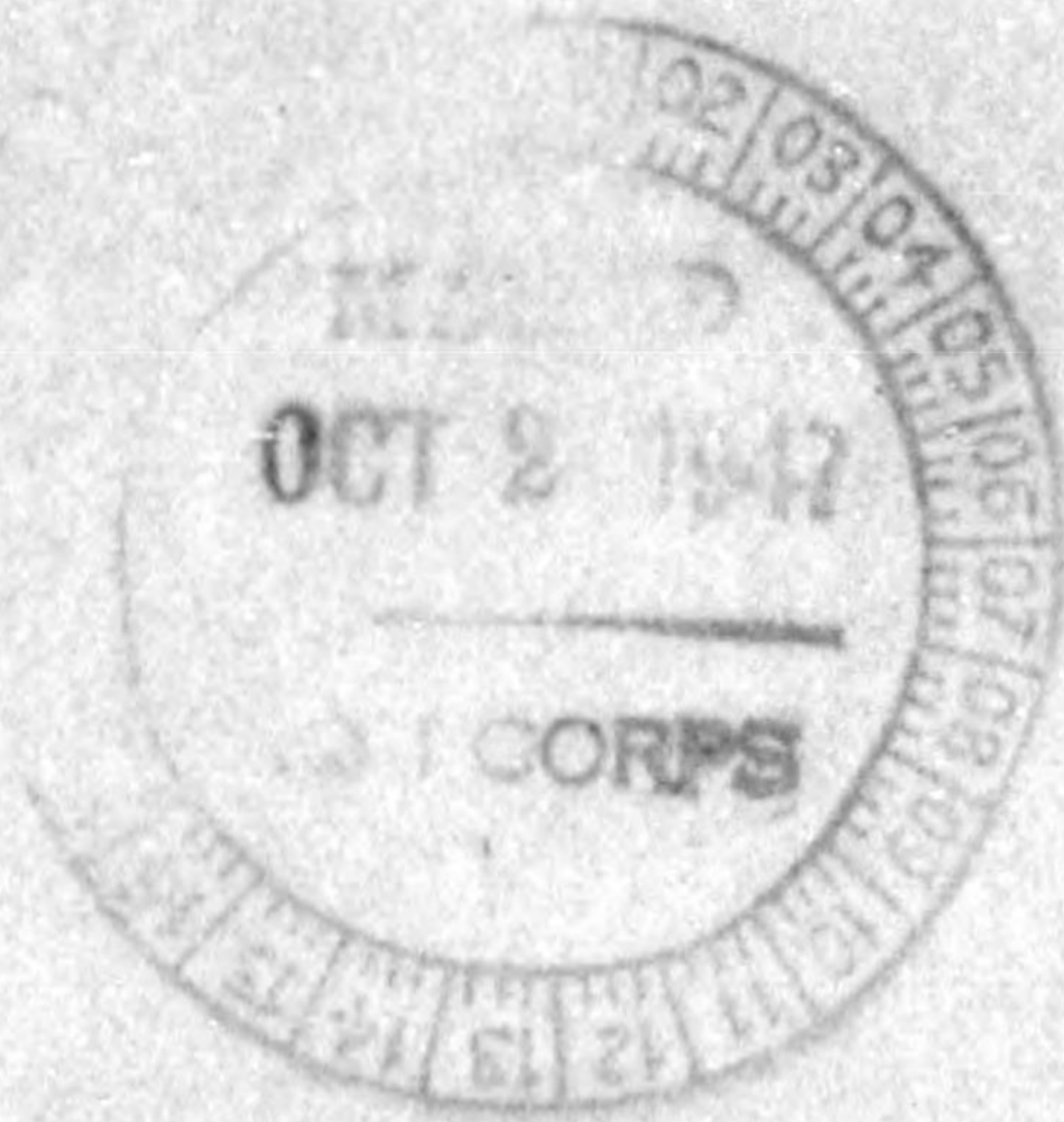

 - Shochu - 1½ bottles
3. Persons found at the time of investigation:
 - a. Rin Hamasaki (Japanese) - manager
 - b. Son and sister of above person
 - c. One Jap. female servant
 - d. Two Jap waitresses
 - e. Two friends of the waitresses and three guests drinking cider and soft drinks.
4. Rin I Jin (Chinese), representative of the above mentioned tea shop, was called in for investigation. He stated that he did not know much about the business of the tea shop, and denied the sale of liquor by anybody of the shop.
5. The case was turned over to the Japanese Police, who - after thorough investigation - referred the matter to the Procurator's Office on 24 October 47, with charges against Rin Hamasaki on violations of the Price Control Laws.

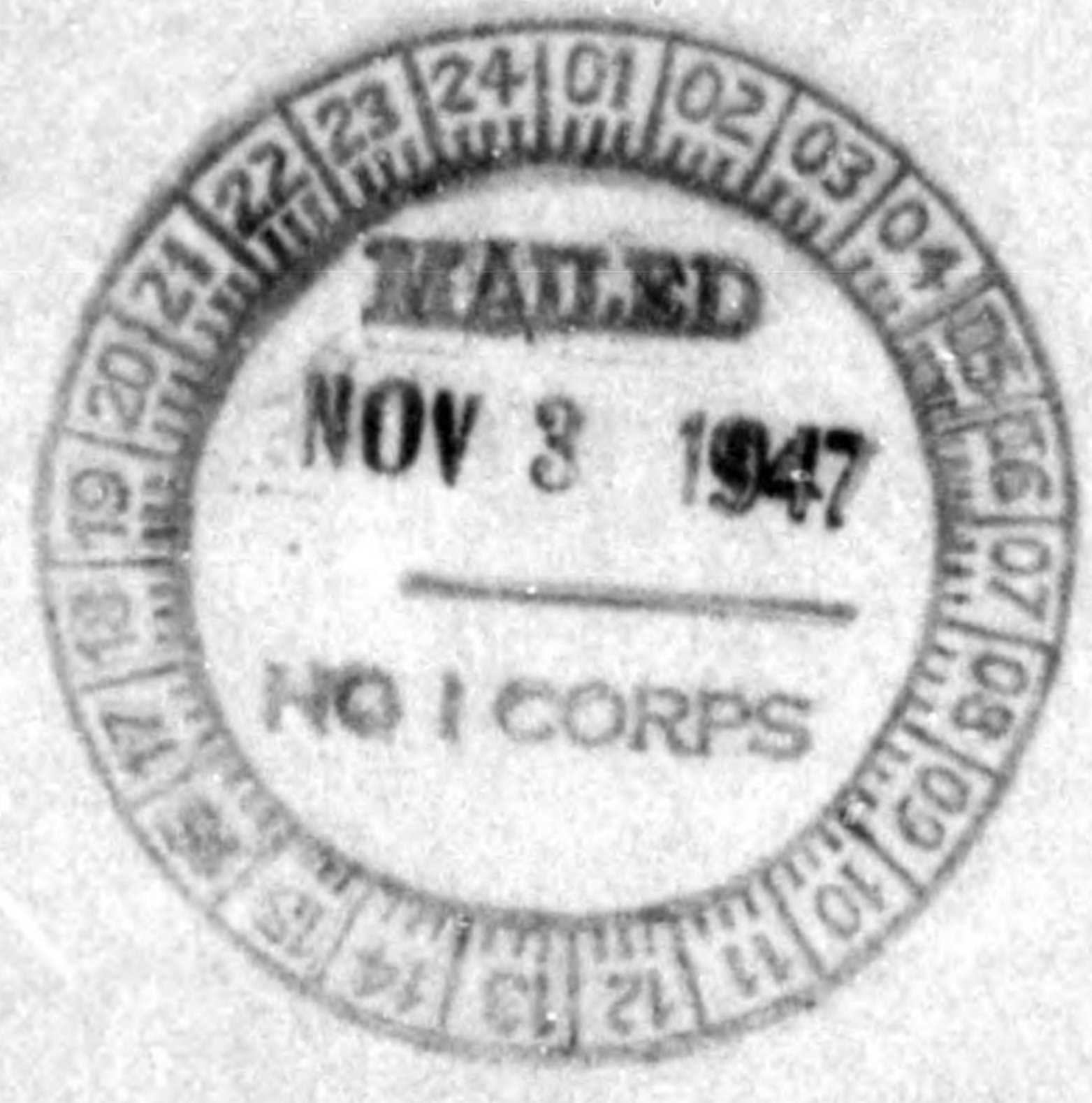

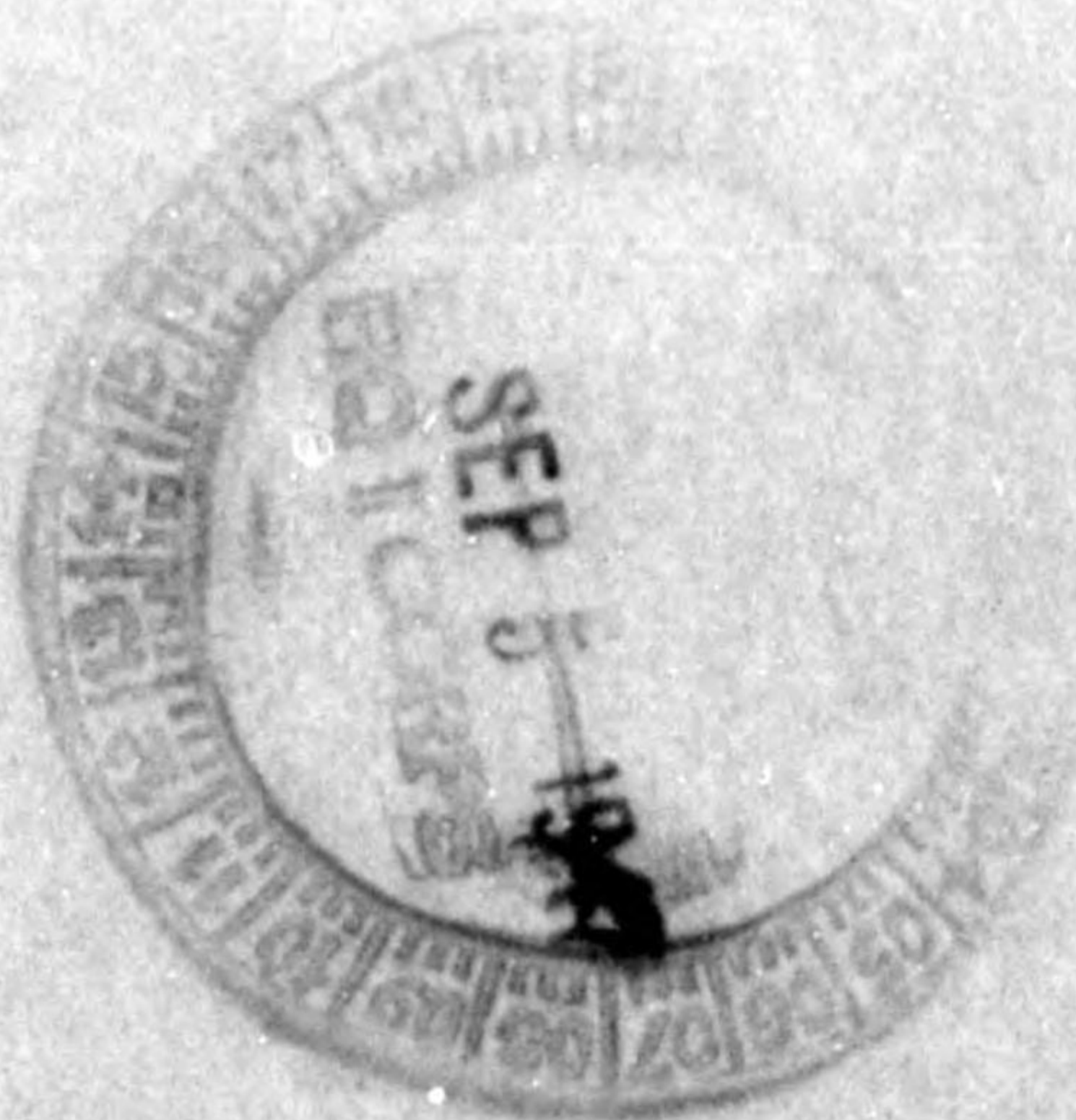

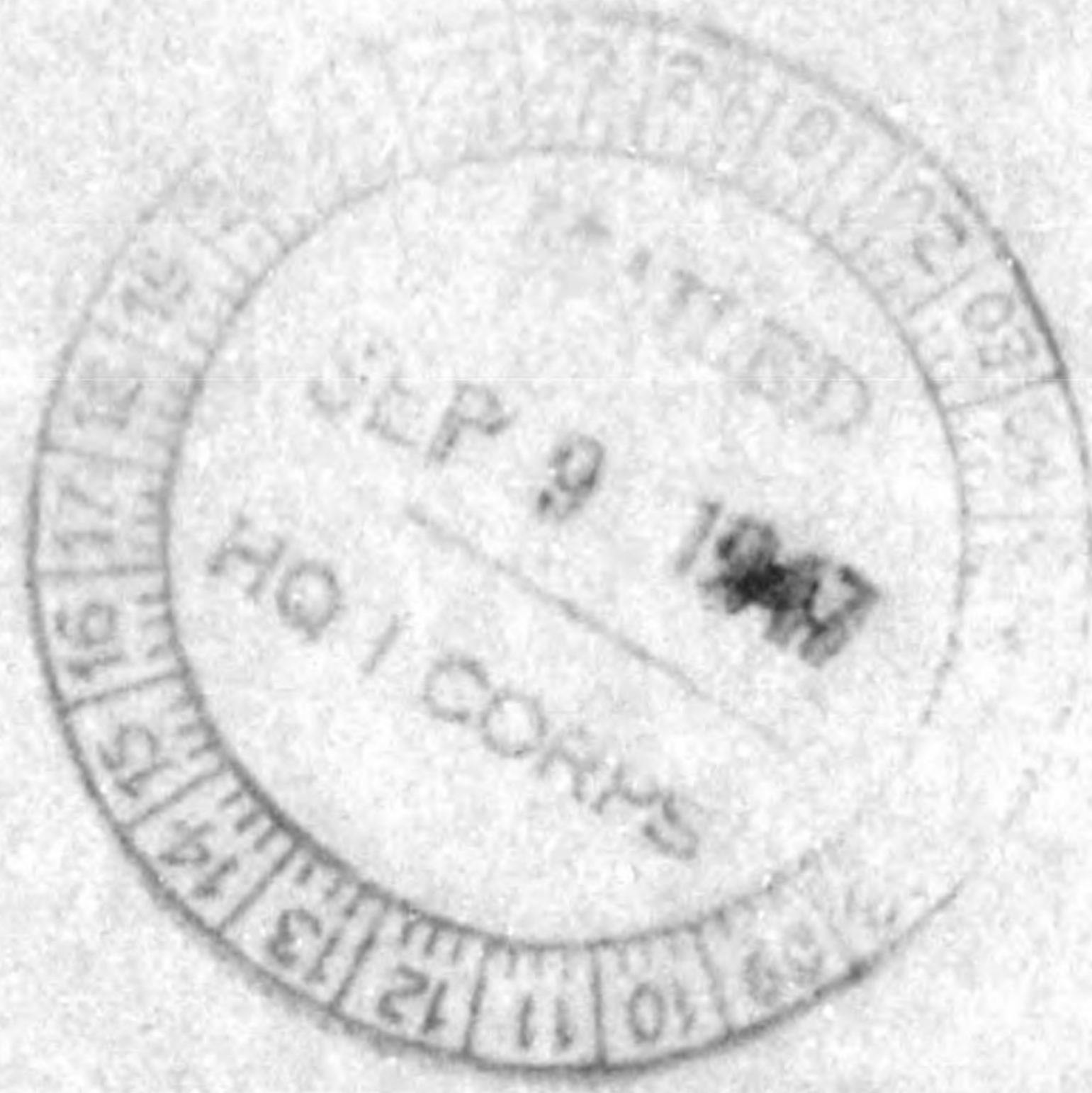

2. It is claimed that this committee will operate without additional cost to the Japanese Government for reprocessing of food. The chief advantage claimed, is that it would provide expert instead of inexperienced government clerks to examine canned goods. The purpose of the examination is to (1) prevent spoilage of food stuffs, (2) perform sorting of goods into various classes, (3) keep warehouse space utilization on an efficient basis, and (4) reprocess goods so that they can be stored for longer periods of time.

3. This headquarters is opposed to the establishment of subject committee for the following reasons:

- a. The structure of the committee resembles the usual Japanese Control Association. Approval by military government of this organization would not be consistent with recent SCAP policy which tends towards elimination of Control Associations.

b. Such a committee would tend to exert pressure to gain control of goods for reprocessing which could ordinarily be released in their original form.

d. The creation of such a committee would tend to shift the burden of responsibility, with attendant laxity and loss of control on the part of government officials.

4. Since the decision in this case will undoubtedly create a pattern for other prefectures in I Corps Z/R, this application is forwarded for further consideration and statement of policy.

1. Seven hundred and seventeen (717) cases (48 cans per case, 14.5 oz. per can) of evaporated milk was received by the Shiga Prefecture Welfare Section on 11 - 12 August 1947. Of this thirty - one cases were a total loss due to spoilage, four point three percent (4.3%). About two percent (2%) of the remaining six hundred and eighty - six (686) cases were spoiled.

2. Spoilage is believed to have been caused by rough handling. One can breacking causing the others to rust through. This milk was packed in the U.S.A. in 1944 and 1945. The spoiled milk was disposed of by the Prefectural Veterinary. Distribution has been made through official rationing channels of the unspoiled milk with a six point three percent (6.3%) reduction in the ration. This was the July ration.


1. Reference paragraph 3 a, Basic Communication.

The Central Food Association is no longer using the neighborhood associations in collecting and distributing food. Spot checks made throughout the city reveal that local, volunteer associations have been formed. Whether any of these are in some manner related to the old association, we have not been able to determine.

2. Reference paragraph 3b, Basic Communication.

The spot checks made of families did not reveal that membership in the neighborhood associations is required for drawing of rations. Some of the locally formed group collect from members in order to purchase their rations. This is the only collection of funds of which we are aware.

Dear Sirs:

Despite the fact that the system of the Neighborhood Association was abolished on 1 June, 1947, the Central Food Control Association here is still using the system of the Neighborhood Association to save trouble in distributing rationed foods and although we should not be required to, we also have to collect money for the association. We believe that such a procedure is against the objectives of the Occupation Army and we hope you will instruct our food association not to violate the regulation.

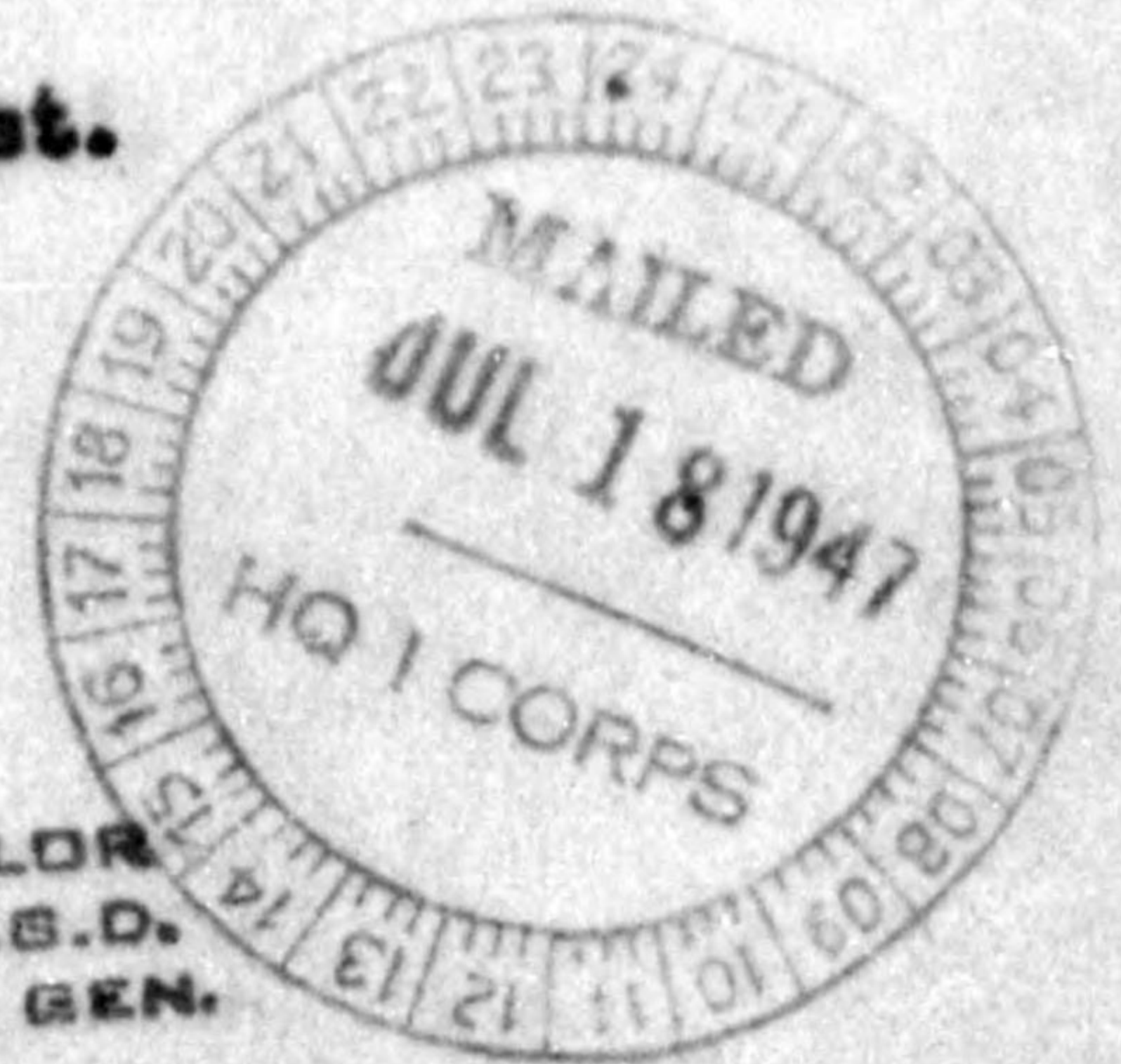
