2. The Home Ministry reports on the subject property as follows:
  - a. No required information has been obtained, despite the thorough investigations as described in the succeeding subparagraphs.
  - b. The name lists of the Cabinet Personnel Section and of the Demobilization Bureaux were examined, but no trace of S. IZUMI referred to in Paragraph 3. of the reference Memorandum could be found.
  - c. Further investigation revealed that the command in the Borneo area was transferred from the Army to the Navy on 1 August 1942 and that the Army unit concerned seemed to be the Sakaguchi Unit. One of the staff officers of the above Unit, Manabu IWAHASHI, was found to be working presently in the Borneo Remaining Affairs Department of the Inage Home Depot Affairs Office (Rusugyomuebu), Chiba Prefecture. Through IWAHASHI various persons were contacted, and it was finally ascertained that the "governor" S. IZUMI was Major Suematsu IZUMI, retired. IZUMI had been engaged in commerce in the southern regions and had become "governor" of Pontianak. It was said that IZUMI was incarcerated on Labuan Island, Northern Borneo, as a war criminal suspect, and that his wife was repatriated in March or April this year, but she could not be located.
  - d. On the other hand, Asaji Matsuki (1, I-chome Iriarai, Ozori-ku, Tokyo), civilian attached to the Expeditionary Forces in Borneo was interrogated, and it was revealed that IZUMI had been repatriated and that his home was at Okamasha, Honcho, Shiogama-shi, Miyagi Prefecture.
  - e. IZUMI was then called to Tokyo and interrogated. He stated that in May 1942 a native official (name unknown) discovered the subject painting and several suits of clothes

and brought them to him. IZUMI placed the articles in a trunk and stored the trunk in a warehouse at the site of a former bank. Since a navy unit took over the area, IZUMI states he does not know of the ultimate disposal of the subject property. He also states that he did not bring the subject property to Japan, nor does he know of its present whereabouts.

Thanks to the sympathetic arrangements on the part of the Allied Powers, most of the Japanese nationals in various Southern areas have been and are being repatriated far more speedily than were anticipated at the time of surrender. However, there still remain 13,500 Japanese in the areas under the control of the Netherlands Forces, and they are being employed as labor corps. On the basis of a comprehensive study that has been made of reports of repatriates and of representatives of the International Red Cross Committee on their actual conditions much has become known as to their general situation, which is described in the attached statement, together with the desires of the Japanese Government in connection therewith.

2. It is earnestly requested that the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, be good enough to accord favorable consideration to the desires of the Japanese Government set forth in the above statement and convey the matter contained therein to the proper authorities in the South East Asia so that prompt action may be taken from the humanitarian point of view. The main points of the Japanese Government's request are acceleration of repatriation and better treatment including increased ration of food, daily necessities, clothing, etc., improvement of medical facilities and of labor conditions and simplification of procedure for correspondence.
