Considering The Estimates

A Special Meeting of the City Council Held This Morning.

Ways and Means of Increasing the Civic Revenue Discussed.

The Board of Aldermen met in the committee rooms, City Hall, this morning at 10 o'clock to consider the estimates laid over last week. There was a full attendance of members, His Worship the Mayor presiding.

Applications were put in from the assistant fire chief, H. B. McDowall, and Messrs. Roberts and Farnon, the men employed on the street lighting. The former asked that his salary be raised, as at times he was wholly in charge of the department, and has been in the service 15 years.

His Worship said that \$1,000 had been saved this year in salaries, notwithstanding that they had raised some to the extent of \$600. Ald. Humphreys said the foremen of the carpenters employed by the city should be employed by the month instead of by the day, as it was possible they might be prolonged purposely.

Ald. Brydon moved that his salary be \$70 a month, which was carried. Ald. MacGregor said that the dog tax, income tax and revenue tax collector should be made a permanent official of the city, and given a uniform wage.

The Mayor said he would like very much to see the work done. Ald. Stewart proposed laying the matter over until the residents were approached on the matter. Ald. Hayward said that would mean that nothing would be done for a long time.

A STRIKE AND A CONFLAGRATION.

Steamer Humboldt Brings News of Fire at Dyea and of Labor Troubles at Skagway.

Twelve Thousand Dollars Damage by Conflagration at Gateway City. Seven Hundred Laborers on Yukon and White Pass Railway Quit Work.

Dyea Wants To Be a British City and Petitions Accordingly.

Late Arrivals From Dawson Talk About the Doings on the Creeks.

News was brought by the steamer Humboldt which reached the outer wharf this morning after a rough passage through the wind-swept inland waters from Lynn canal of another calamity which befel the unfortunate town of Dyea the day before she left and which, were it not for the support given to this gateway of the Dyea trail by the aerial railways operating over the Chilcoat Pass, would probably go a long way towards driving away what few remain of its already sparse population.

The men say they asked a continuance of the 35 cent rate for but 30 days longer, when the conditions of weather would make life more comfortable. Their request, if true, does not seem an exorbitant one.

WOULD BE BRITISH. Dyea Would Like to Have the Union Jack Flying Over It.

Another interesting piece of news brought by the Humboldt is that Dyea is desirous of becoming a British town. Its residents believe that should such a change be made it would have the effect of making a decided improvement in the condition of affairs existing there.

The petition is brief and makes no contentions, merely placing before the powers the desire of the petitioners to transfer themselves and their town to the British flag, and become a Canadian instead of an American entry port.

The Dyea Press, voicing the sentiment of the Chilcoat gateway, says: "The excitement produced by the proposed report of the sub-committee of the joint treaty commission to cede to the Canadians a seaport on the headwaters of Lynn Canal seems to have provoked a great deal of interest and opposition, especially at Seattle."

The same paper furnishes news of a great peace pow-wow to be held by Alaska Indians in August. It says: "The greatest gathering in the history of Alaska Indians is scheduled for August next at Klawun, on the Chilcoat river."
