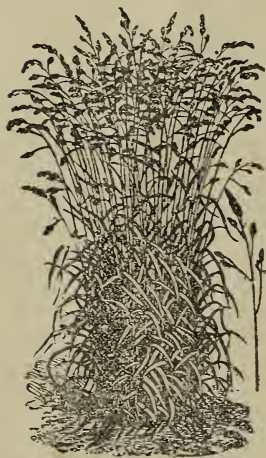

SEED CORN

We call your attention to the value and importance of procuring good varieties, and also that which is grown in the heart of the great corn belt, where the climate and soil not only develop great vigor of stalk and richness of kernel, but where the season at that special time of year ripens and preserves it for seed to the greatest vitality and strength.

Ripens ten days earlier. Seed corn grown at Sioux City will positively ripen **ten days earlier** than corn grown in southern Iowa or Nebraska, or from the east. One of the largest canning companies in the west report to us that our Stowell's Evergreen last season was ready for use **ten days earlier** than they were able to use that brought from the east, all planted at the same time. Owing to this fact and to the superior quality of our corn, they early in the season placed an order with us for a carload.

Headquarters for Seed Corn—Field and Sweet. We not only have the **best climate** for ripening seed corn, but we have more varieties of our own growing than any other firm in the United States.

Drying Cribs and Seed Corn Houses. We have this year added another immense seed corn drying house, now giving us the largest capacity for drying and storing seed corn in the United States. In ten minutes we can shut up the sides of the cribs from rain or snow, so that our corn is always **kept dry**; in ten minutes the houses can be opened to the sun and winds.

Hand Selected. We hand select every ear of corn that is shelled—and tip and butt. No small grains in our seed corn.

TERMS OF SALE

Credit—Orders from unknown correspondents must be accompanied by remittance or satisfactory reference.

Grass and Field Seeds, Potatoes and Onion Sets are invariably net cash.

Garden Seeds—Cash June 1st for all shipments made prior to that date; subject to sight draft after that date. We allow a discount of 1% per month for all bills paid before June 1st. This discount applies to garden seeds only.

All Shipments made in good order and receipts taken, after which our responsibility ceases, although if any shipments do not reach customers promptly we should be immediately notified, as we can often trace and hasten delivery of same.

Bags will be charged as follows: Two bushels 16c; half bushel 6c; quarter bushel 5c.

Remitted for—All bills must be remitted for promptly when due, either by draft or express money order. Personal checks not accepted unless made payable with exchange. If we are obliged to make draft, which we do on date named on invoice, exchange and collection charges must be paid by party on whom we draw.

Box Seeds—We have, since commencing business, sold seeds in papers, and this season we are putting up four handsome and finely assorted boxes, full description and contents of which will be found on page 15.

Mailing Seeds—Where customers order small quantities of seeds they can be sent by mail at eight (8) cents per lb. and postage will be charged on the invoice.

Freight Equalized—There are many merchants east and south who would like to handle our Superior Garden Seeds. To all such we will equalize **freight rates** with your nearest purchasing point.

Varieties in **Heavy Faced** type are of superior merit.

Vegetable Seeds

Owing entirely to the fact that there is a very heavy shortage in Beans, Peas, Corn, Vine Seeds etc. prices are, especially on these are much higher than for a number of years.

A shade higher price will be charged for seeds in ounce or $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. quantities or lots less than $\frac{1}{8}$ of a bushel.

We supply a reasonable number of **Seed Catalogues for merchants free.** Place for the merchants name and address appears on these catalogues.

To assist our customers in building up their seed business, we send free with large bulk orders a liberal supply of fine seed catalogues for the merchant to distribute among his patrons. The pricing in this catalogue is very complete and handy for ready reference. NOTICE—There is no standard weight on Sweet Corn, but it is sold per measured bushel, shelled.

We repeat here that Sweet Corn grown at Sioux City will positively be fit for table use **ten days** in advance of eastern corn or corn grown in southern Iowa or Nebraska. This from actual test last year. You ought to buy for your trade only this northern grown corn.

These seeds are sold outright—not consigned; but in order that dealers may not sell seeds too old to germinate, or be at the loss of destroying them, we agree to mark all papers the date at which their vitality expires, and on the date so marked, to replace an equal number of papers for the number destroyed, free of charge. All seeds must be destroyed by our agent at time of his annual visit, or the purchaser can destroy all perishable papers and send us a statement of the number destroyed. The full amount of bill is payable June 1st.

All papers are marked with a single figure on the back showing the year the vitality expires, and our agents when visiting you will carefully look over your boxes and destroy all that are dated for that year, so that there is no loss to the dealer, and he has the satisfaction of knowing that he is selling fresh seeds. All our seeds are packed in handsome lithographed bags, and present a very tasty appearance. Boxes are decorated with a beautiful lithographed label, and altogether we think we can truly say that our seeds are put up in the most attractive manner of any sent out. No Charge.—We make no charge for the cases in which seeds are packed. The prices quoted are net.

HOW TO SORT UP BOXES.

We print following this a complete line of all the varieties we put up in lithographed packets of the 5 cents, 10 cents and 20 cents. We also print a summary of the contents of four regular boxes we put up. If you do not care to sort up your own box you can select the size box you want and we will send you a box made up to suit your latitude.

But we advise you to select the size box you want and then change the contents if they do not suit you. **You know** what you want better than we do. Select your own varieties.

We recommend that you use only 5c flat papers, and leave out the corn, beans, peas and turnip seed in the larger sized packets, and take these four kinds of seeds in bulk. You will find it much more satisfactory to your trade.


