DISPLACEMENT CRISIS
687 170 forcibly displaced people in Niger of which²:
335 277 IDPs in total
269 922 total refugees³

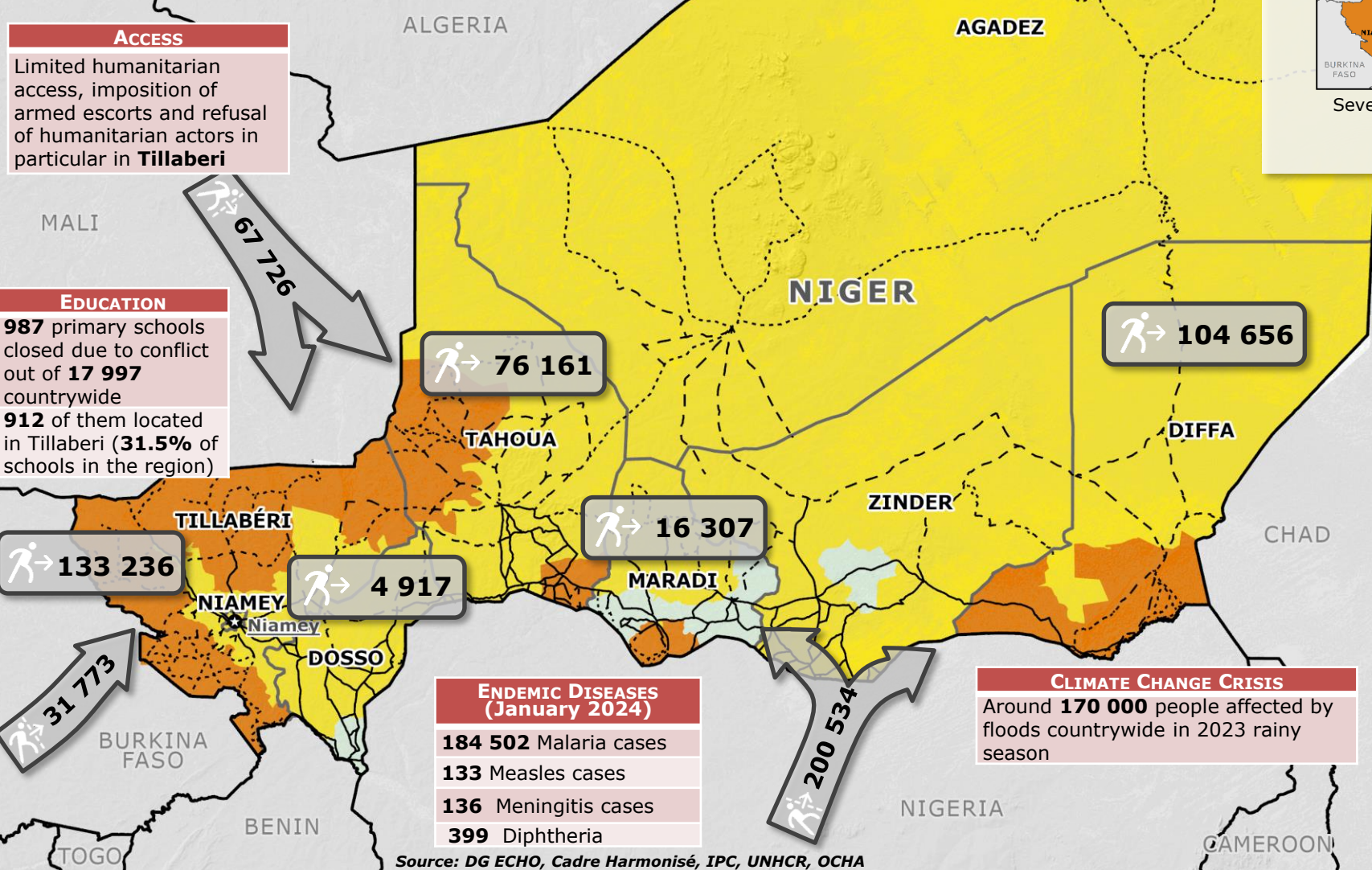
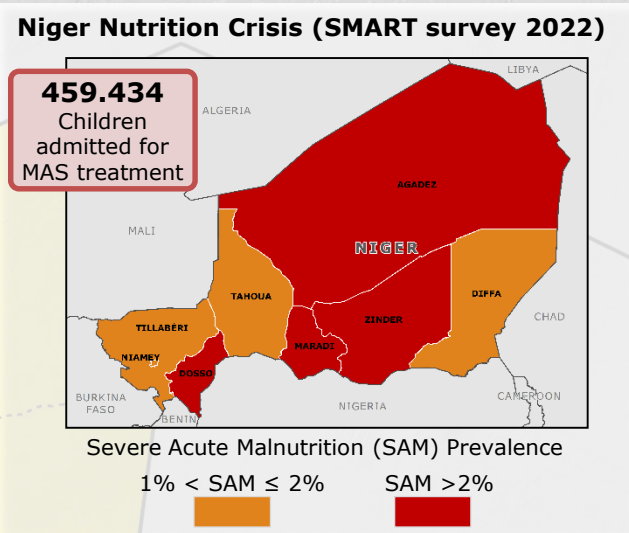
FOOD INSECURITY
 Currently **2.3 million** people in food crisis (phase 3-5) and **3.2 projected** in **June-August 2024** on a population of 25 million people

DEMOGRAPHIC CRISIS
3.7% population growth rate (the highest in the world)

MIGRATION CRISIS
9 191 migrants expelled from Algeria in 2023 (+25% increase compared to 2022 if the trend remains constant)

ACCESS
 Limited humanitarian access, imposition of armed escorts and refusal of humanitarian actors in particular in **Tillabéri**

EDUCATION
987 primary schools closed due to conflict out of **17 997** countrywide
912 of them located in Tillabéri (**31.5%** of schools in the region)

184 502 Malaria cases
133 Measles cases
136 Meningitis cases
399 Diphtheria

CLIMATE CHANGE CRISIS
 Around **170 000** people affected by floods countrywide in 2023 rainy season
