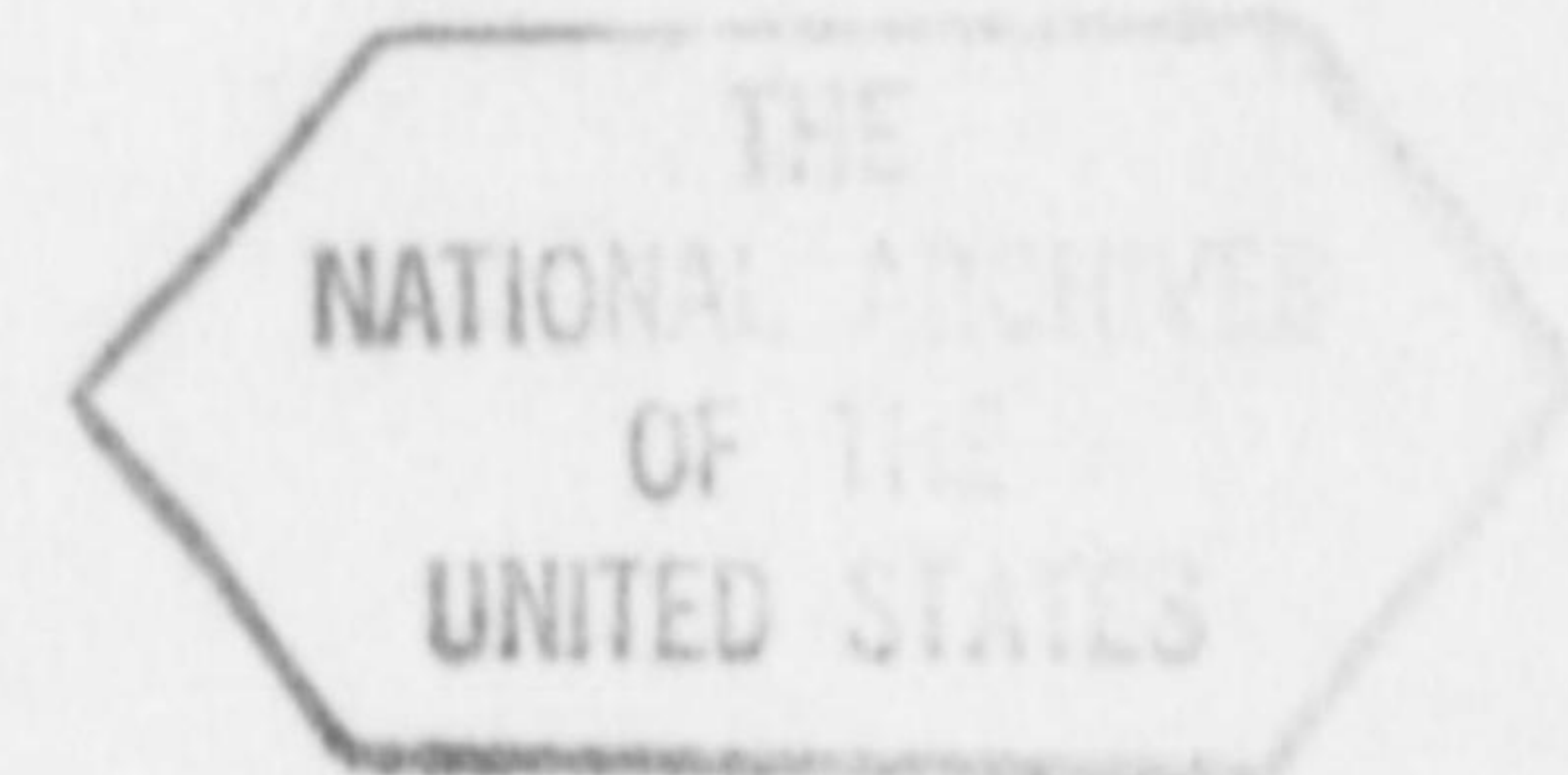

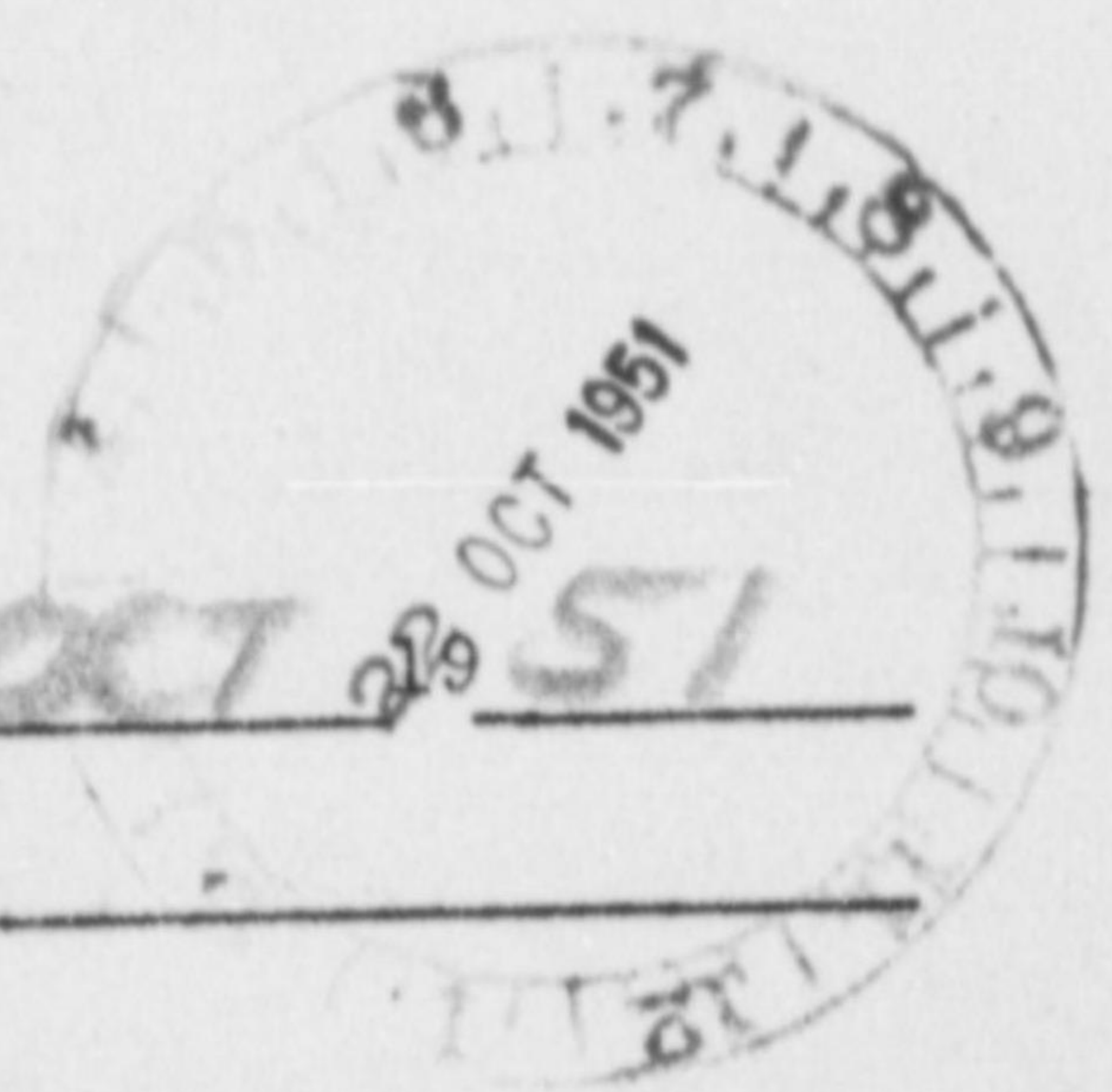

SUBJECT: Target Requirements

1. Study has been conducted by this division to determine the requirements for targets and related equipment to complete range firing prescribed in current NPR Small Unit Training Program. Summary is presented in paragraph 2.

2. Summary of Requirements:

<u>a. Type of Targets</u>	<u>No. Required</u>
(1) Tank, 1000-inch	83,000
(2) MG, 1000-inch	105,000
(3) Sub MG, silhouette, type E	22,000
(4) Sub MG, silhouette, type F	6,800
(5) Sub MG, silhouette, type M	1,500
(6) Sub MG, Olympic M-type, National Match Firing	1,500

b. Necessary lumber, ropes, pulleys, and hinges with which to construct target frames and accessories.

3. Estimated cost, furnished by Logistics Division:

a. Targets	¥ 1,500,000
b. Target Frames and Accessories	¥ 5,000,000
Total	¥ 6,500,000

4. Funds are available.

5. Recommendations:

a. That procurement of the targets in the number specified in paragraph 2a above be authorized.

b. That authorization be granted to direct local purchase of related equipment specified in paragraph 2b above.

SUBJECT: Graphical Training Aids

1. In order to maintain the interest of NPR enlistees and at the same time to present training material in such a manner that it cannot fail to be clearly understood, it is proposed to develop and issue a series of graphical training aids for use by NPR instructors.

2. Subjects selected for presentation through the use of GTAs are:

First Aid
Personal Health
Concealment and Camouflage
Barbed Wire Obstacles
Map Reading (Compass Device)
Elementary Map Reading
Drills and Formations
Scouting
Courtesy

3. Each subject is covered by a set of approximately 25 charts. In the preparation of the charts, the following limitations will govern:

- a. Photographs or drawings must depict Japanese personnel.
- b. Legends will be printed in Japanese.
- c. Equipment shown must be limited to that actually issued or available for issue to NPR.
- d. Combat conditions will not be shown. Emphasis will be placed upon situations which could reasonably be expected to be met with by the NPR.
- e. Photographic and printing work will be done by Japanese contractors.

SUBJECT: Graphical Training Aids (Cont'd)

f. Clarity of presentation and uniform understanding of the subject will be the objectives for which the charts are published.

4. In arriving at the number of sets required, it was considered that an issue of 2 sets per 1000 enlistees, plus a reserve of 10 sets at each region headquarters and at General Group Headquarters, would be adequate. Issue on this basis will require 200 sets.

5. Preliminary investigation indicates that the charts and posters in the quantities desired can be produced at a total cost of ¥9,900,000.

6. Recommend procurement of 200 sets of GTAs listed in paragraph 2 be authorized.

MEMORANDUM FOR: General Shepard

SUBJECT: Projectors and Film Strips

1. The need for visual aids to supplement the scanty supply of training aids and instructions now available to NPR instructors is considered by this division to be urgent. This opinion is supported by frequent requests received from the field and by references in region and inspection reports to the inadequacy of training aids. In order to improve this situation, it is proposed to procure and furnish still projectors and film strips to each camp.

2. A comprehensive study has been conducted by this division to determine:

- a. Feasibility of procuring projectors and film strips.
- b. Processes involved in making film strips suitable for use by NPR.
- c. Cost of projectors and strips.

3. Examination and test of Japanese projectors has disclosed that a satisfactory projector can be obtained in quantity. The type projector believed by this division to be most suitable is described in Tab "A". Commercial photographers can be employed to make necessary photographs. Drafting Branch, CAS, is available for necessary lettering. Translation and editing can be accomplished in the Operations Division, CAS-A, working with the Operations Division, General Group Headquarters, NPR. Subjects suitable for presentation on film strips are almost unlimited. However, subjects considered to be most appropriate for use at this time are listed in Tab "B". Estimated cost of initial requirements of projectors and film strips is \$4,181,740. Breakdown of requirements and cost is shown in Tab "C".

4. Recommend procurement of 150 projectors and 100 copies each of 40 selected film strips be authorized.

2. Cost

a. Cost of the projector and attachments described in Tab "A" is ¥11,230 in quantities of 100 or more. Cost of 150 projectors, therefore, would be ¥1,784,500.

b. Cost of converting U.S. film strips listed in Tab "B" to Japanese and reproducing strips is estimated to be ¥62,431 for 100 copies of each film strip, double-frame size. This estimate is based on discussions with representatives of one of the largest Japanese commercial

photographic and reproduction firms. Cost for 40 sets of 100 each is estimated to be ¥2,497,240.

c. Total cost of projectors and film strips in the quantities proposed is ¥4,281,740.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

1. In telephone conversation, this date, with Lt Col Thames, Signal Section, GHQ, the subject of cost of rescoring in Japanese certain U.S. Army training films for use in training the NPR was discussed.

2. Col Thames stated that it was his understanding that no cost to the NPR would be involved. He mentioned that he had talked with General Shepard and that he knew that no dollar credits were available to cover training aids for the NPR. Col Thames stated, further, that funds were available to the Signal Corps for this type of project.

3. With respect to the radio to the Department of the Army, which this section proposes to send, Col Thames stated that this is a necessary administrative procedure which he regarded as routine. He mentioned that his office had furnished to Civil Affairs Section a form of message which he believed would be satisfactory. SUBJECT: Maps for NPR Training

1. Study has been completed by this division to determine the type, number and cost of maps suitable for training NPR personnel. In order to provide for realism in training, only maps of areas where enlistees are, or will be, located have been considered. In arriving at the number of sheets to be obtained, consideration has been given to the scale of the map and the number of enlistees to receive instruction. Since basic instruction should begin with large scale maps and because of the smaller area covered by these maps, a considerably larger number of large scale maps is believed to be necessary.

2. The following information is pertinent:
