\*\*\* The First Part contains an exposition of scales and intervals; of the fundamental consonant and dissonant chords; and of other various harmonic combinations which enter into the musical system; it treats of cadences; of transition and modulation; of rhythmic and tonal structure; of passing-notes and arpeggiatura; and of the adaptation of music to words.
