WIKITHONS

Wikithons empower people to make edits to Wikipedia. We can run full Wikithons at 3.5 hours or condensed Wikithons, reduced to 1.5-2 hours.

Training is streamlined and focussed on specific interests, developed in partnership with the organisation. A 3 hour event is more comprehensive.

We can also accommodate events spread over two days. Events can be run fully online, hybrid or inperson.

WIKIMEDIA COMMONS

We can supply a Wikimedia Commons training pack for self-directed learning with email support. Commons training can also be offered as part of a Wikithon.



PLACEMENTS

Connected Heritage can offer training and support as students learn about wiki. We'll help you develop a Work Plan with clear objectives, combined measurable goals with thematic concerns.

RESIDENCIES
