

Hallowell Sept 21. 1834

Dear Wife

I have just returned to Hallowell for the purpose of attending the Kennebec Conference at Litchfield to morrow, & the Baptist Association at Fayette the next day, & I improve a leisure moment before going to bed to say, that Mr Shepard, called at Preston Shepards for the bundle of which you spoke, & it was not there, & so he has not brought it. If you sent it therefore, it either came too late, or miscarried. In either case you had better send for it & get it back to Wrentham, & I will get along without it for the present. This I can do, by buying a pair of drawers & one or two pr of stockings. I found in my trunk a pair of white worsted stockings, marked E. H. - whose are they? The good cause is making goodly progress I think in this state. What a shameful article that review of Mr Child in the last Spectator is - It was written by Bacon & is as redolent of Colonisation venom as any thing he ever wrote. I shall be in this region until after convention. Write me here on the receipt of this.
