## P R E F A C E.

---

THE book which is now laid before the Members of the Camden Society contains an account of moneys received and expended for what are termed "the secret services" of King Charles the Second and King James the Second, from the 30th March, 1679, to the 25th December, 1688. The account was rendered by Henry Guy, Esq. some time after the accession of William the Third, probably under an order from the new Government. The accountant acknowledges to have received during the nine years and three quarters to which his account relates the sum of 565,573*l.* 15*s.* 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ *d.*, and the account now printed sets forth the expenditure of the whole of that large sum, except a balance of 341*l.* 5*s.* 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ *d.*

The payments are scarcely of the kind which would be expected from the title of "secret services." They are principally divisible into two great classes: 1. Extraordinary expenses incident to the management of the King's private estate, and the repairs and improvements of the royal residences; and 2. Payments and allowances to private persons, for services rendered to the crown. Under these two heads the great majority of the payments made by this accountant may be classified. Disbursements for what may be termed private personal expenses of the sovereign were made through other

agents, to whom, as for example to William Chiffinch, moneys were occasionally paid over by the present accountant. The ordinary royal household salaries and expenses were also provided for in another manner.

The circumstance that the latter class of payments is not comprised in the present account has prevented my taking advantage of some papers which relate to those payments exclusively, which were kindly forwarded to me for consideration by the noble President of the Camden Society. The papers to which I allude have a value of their own, and will, I hope, be made public; but it seemed to me to be better not to intermix them with the present account, which is of a nature altogether distinct. As a specimen of the papers sent to me by Lord Braybrooke, I beg to subjoin one of them. Its curiosity and historical importance will, I am sure, be universally acknowledged and understood.

The present volume is transcribed from a manuscript book in the possession of William Selby Lowndes, Esq., of Whaddon Hall, Bucks, to whom it has descended from his ancestor William Lowndes, Esq., of the Bury, near Chesham, Secretary of the Treasury in the reign of Queen Anne. It will, at a glance, be seen that it comprises numerous entries of considerable interest. Among the earliest are the sums bestowed upon Titus Oates, who, quartered in Whitehall, receives 48*l.* per month, while his satellites are allowed stipends, and sums are paid to various individuals for "discovering Popish priests." These items appear in singular and repulsive contrast with the sums lavished by Charles upon his female favourites. Among these, the payments to the Duchess of Portsmouth are most conspicuous. No less a sum than 136,668*l.* 10*s.*

appears to have been bestowed by the profligate monarch on this woman within the space of one year,\* and this at a period when the wages of the servants of the royal household were doled out by beggarly instalments. It will be some relief to the reader to find interspersed with entries equally shameful, items of sums paid to the humble instruments of Charles's escape after the rout at Worcester. The family of Pendrell was not forgotten; even collateral branches of it experienced the royal bounty.

Notwithstanding the part played by Nell Gwynne during the lifetime of Charles, she does not appear, at least from this record, to have been so much indebted to her royal admirer as what is known of her history would lead us to infer. Some of the entries afford us new facts relating to her career. We find in the year 1685 a sum of 729*l.* 2*s.* 3*d.* paid to Richard Graham, Esq. for the purpose of discharging the claims of "several tradesmen, creditors of Mrs. Ellen Gwynne, in satisfaction of their debts, for which the said Ellen stood outlawed." In the same year two sums of five hundred pounds each are paid to her as bounty. Two years afterwards the following entry occurs:—

Here is evidence that the injunction of the dying monarch, "Don't let poor Nelly starve," was not disregarded by his successor. A little later another entry shews that her career had ended.

The object of a preface like the present is, however, rather to direct the attention of the reader than to satisfy it. Such entries as those alluded to are intermixed with a great variety of others of kinds which it would need a volume to develope. There are but few incidents of the period to which this account relates which do not receive illustration from its pages, and the most conspicuous actors in that troubled and disastrous time will be found noticed in it in one way or another. As an addition to our historical materials it has two recommendations: first, that it is believed to be the only account of the kind that has yet been printed; and, second, that it is unquestionably authentic. When the account was rendered there was no longer any necessity for concealment or disguise. On these grounds, as well as on account of its intrinsic historical importance, it is submitted to the candid consideration of the members of the Camden Society and the public.

III. The Pylgrymage of Sir Richard Guyllforde to the Holy Land, A.D. 1506. From a copy believed to be unique, from the press of Richard Pynson. Edited by SIR HENRY ELLIS, K.H., Sec. S.A.

A curious work, upon a subject at all times of great interest.

The learned Archdeacon of London having expressed his willingness to edit for the Camden Society this curious document, the Council readily embraced the offer, glad of the opportunity of securing the publication of so important a record under the editorial supervision of a gentleman so peculiarly fitted for the task.

In bringing to a close this account of their stewardship during the past year, the Council trust that the Society will see, both in the Works which have been issued to the Members, and in those which have been projected, not only that due regard has been paid to the important objects for which the Camden Society was originally instituted, but also unquestionable evidence of the service which it is by such publications daily rendering to historical students, and its consequent claim to be regarded as among the most useful and the most popular of the literary institutions of the country.

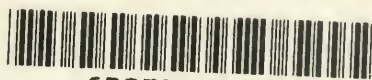
