These two divisions were to orbit the islands of Miyako and Ishigaki, preventing any enemy aircraft the use of the five fields. No airborne enemy aircraft were observed.

The islands were circled at 15,000 feet but when no anti-aircraft was encountered the flights gradually relaxed caution and occasionally as low as 3500 feet over the objectives. The observations so made were of value on subsequent strikes. An airstrip, cleverly camouflaged and in apparent use was located by Lieut. Myers by watching the travel of trucks. The location, approximately 5 miles west of Nariyama on Ishigaki, was promptly transmitted to the Officer in Tactical Command.

Runs were made at high speeds and altitudes with evasive retirement to avoid anti-aircraft fire. Generally starting from 7500 feet, pull out was effected at 500 feet after a 50 degree, 300 knot run.
