



Dear Sir:

I am writing to you about three sightings I have made and my theory of what the UFO's are. First, my sightings.

- (1) I saw a yellow-gold colored object. I don't even remember the time of year. The property objects of the same color were seen to come out of the thing. This object was very far away.
- (2) One Tuesday in January of 1967, and and his brother in and I were looking at the moon through the telescope. There were about five stars in the entire sky at that time. There were a good many clouds in the sky at that time and the sun was setting behind the mountain. From behind a cloud, Randy saw a circular object heading down to the mountain top (see drawing "A" at end of letter) at an angle. It had a vapor trail and there was no noise at all. We took a picture of it through the telescope on black and white film. The object was about the size of the full moon that we had been watching. The thing that puzzles me the most is that there was a trail. If the picture comes out, it should show a whitish thing very close to the trees.
- (3) I saw this object on April 13, 1967. As I was coming from a friends house at about 8:15 P.M., I noticed a blinking red light about as bright as Sirius, the brightest star. It was like two stars sitting side by side. It was a nice

Now that I have finished with my sightings, I will start with my UFO theory. You have heard about Jean Dixon, the Washington, D.C. woman who predicted J.F.K.'s murder? In many cases people have communicated with space beings through "mental telepathy", a type of E.S.P. I believe that clairvoyants like Jean Dixon are probably the first of people on earth to have "the gift of prophecy". I also believe that in the near future somebody will invent "nonrocket intersteller travel". I think that we aren't too far behind our space neighbors, I say about 25-50 years. I would like to have any information you have on UFO's.




