AMERICAN PRISONER IN MEXICO.

The controversy between us and the Vice-Consul of Mexico, *Senor Don Savary Peart* (for whom it is his orthodox allies), according to the grand sequence of Mexican diplomacy, has now drawn to a close. His letter in last evening's *Courier* has disengaged us of any resentment towards him. Indeed we rather pity than dislike him. His connection with the Mexican Government has not improved his influence in the country which gives vigor and consideration to the character. How shall he do?

He has succeeded as evidence to the fact of peace of Mexico. The triumph of the laws, the good order and proper spirit animating the national army, the road and public highways are in a condition to bear every measure to impress the world. The Mexican Government has already received considerable importance being acknowledged by the Spanish powers, by nearly all the other European powers, as well as by the United States.

Money matters are getting worse; and we regret to see the failure of our old and most important course in this respect. Their abilities are variously estimated at \$40 to \$70,000.

Our merchants are much disappointed that their European correspondence, by the steamship *Sabres*, has been lost. It would have been a great convenience to us to have had a passage to the port of Coatzacoalcos for the purpose of recovering the valuable messages to the Balize, as they are held for the purpose of getting to sea, whereas the river boats are compelled to remain during the prevalence of bad weather.

The *Courier* is nearly as full of the news of the time as the *Times* is of the news of the 8th. We will, at all events, the day occasioned in the transmission of important letters and documents not to occur again.

FOREIGN MARKETS.

Per shipment *Nauvoo*.

Nauvoo, FEBRUARY 14, 1842.

Receipts of New Orleans from Liverpool market for every department of trade have been in a dropping state, which is owing in some degree to the *Cornwall*, whose cargo people seem more inclined for amusement than for business. Our stock of new sugar increases rapidly, but we have no market for it. The price of cotton for account of Spanish houses, the same price as when above those which may be quoted as per ruling prices—say of 100—while we put down of 10 as these effects, and, in like manner from other quarters being so low as 100, we have no market for them.

Exports to New Orleans from Liverpool this year reach 2,500 boxes, against 700 boxes at the same time in 1841. On the contrary, there is a great falling off in the exports of cotton, which have only 30,000 boxes shipped to New Orleans, while the exports of cotton to Liverpool are 1,000 boxes less than in 1841. The two cottons, however, demand a higher price than the others.
