Dear Sir

On the 29th we sent you
14 Bales by Steam boat to Albany and
thence by Railway and herewith enclosed the
bill of the same - which we have found -

We have your letter this morning - as
you probably would like to decide before Mr
Whitman can see you - We would say
that we would supply the Mill with Cotton
if you can arrange to have the goods man-
ufactured baled up and delivered and the
Railway not to cost over 2 1/2 cts per yard
We will take them in this way until
1st of May should the Mill not be
sold, and if you choose to divide with
us the profit is less you can do so -
We will buy the Cotton without loss
charge and sell the goods at 5% Com.

The goods we should of course expect
would be well made, and we will take
