 not that we have any wish to have the flour
 but to the contrary - I so obligeing on the part
 of this to write me to care of Haydock & Sonkins
 give me a statement of what they has to & of what
 they has ship for us & when that we may know
 whether it has all arrived or not & also they amount
 of Convoiment - it is probable we may need some
 more what to this winter - but no more flours
