Reference, attached letter from Commanding Officer, Wakayama C.A.T. Team. 2. Wakayama Prefecture came under the jurisdiction of this office on 1 June 1949, about the same time that the present austerity program was given impetus. 3. During August it came to our attention that the electrical installations in a number of houses created a serious fire hazard and from the reports of various inspectors, it is now believed that dependent houses number 705, 710, 711, and 712 are unsafe for occupation and should be condemned until necessary repairs are made. 4. It is estimated that the repairs will cost in the vicinity of 850,000 yen which is well within the authority granted at Post level for maintenance. 5. We have on our present manning table 15 electricians at Nara, 1 at Mie, and 1 at Wakayama. These few electricians can barely keep up with minor maintenance and are not available for major repair work as indicated. Only 50,000 Yen remains in PD 139, the Off Post PD. The material required to accomplish this work would have to be locally procured which would deplete the local purchase PD for the fiscal year. 6. Request authority to proceed with this work under PD 139 with the assumption that additional funds will be made available as requested in letter to your Headquarters on 24 October 1949. 7.
