The following are excerpts from the opening address of the Chairman, Dr. Paul Monroe (page 23):

"The organization was founded from fifteen to seventeen years ago with the major purpose of bringing about a better understanding between the teachers of the World, with the idea that that better understanding between the teachers would facilitate and greatly improve and develop an understanding between the peoples of the world. *****"

(page 24) "Consequently, our programme this evening is on the general topic: 'Promotion of International Understanding through Education'. It will be discussed from the point of view of the culture of different peoples, each in its own way approaching this topic. Not all of the speakers are professional people. ***** (Page 25) The first of these

people comes from the land which is our very efficient and hospitable host on the occasion of this Meeting. He is the gentleman who is devoting most of his time to the furtherance of the object to which our organization is dedicated, and which is expressed through the purposes of the society which he has promoted

and conducted, the Japanese Society for International Cultural Relations. He is responsible for the Forum which was held at Lake Yamanaka, during the week or four days preceding the opening of this Conference, *****. It is a very great pleasure, indeed, to have you become acquainted with and have you listen to this Japanese leader in the promotion of international goodwill and international cultural relations. I take great pleasure in presenting to you, as the first speaker of the evening, Count Kabayama, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Society for International Cultural Relations."
