1. No legal objections.

2. Subject bill would permit graduates of certain schools providing for more than three years medical training and with special entrance requirements to take the preliminary examination under the Medical Practitioner's Law formerly permitted to be taken only by one who has graduated from a foreign medical school or obtained a license of a medical practitioner in a foreign country. This exception to the provision of Article 12 of the Medical Practitioner's Law is to apply to preliminary examinations to be held within five years from the date of enforcement of such bill. Creation of such an exception to the previous qualifications for taking the preliminary examinations is purely a question of policy within the jurisdiction of Public Health and Welfare Section, SCAP, and does not raise any legal question.
