



Dear Sir:

I wish to report the performance of an odd aerial object sighted by a friend and me from the yard of his home at approximately 1830, 20 August near the northern outskirts of Fresno, Calif.

While talking to this friend in his yard, we were attracted by a loud jet-like sound, and looking up toward the South, we saw an unrecognizable aircraft approaching at apparently high speed. It was traveling northerly; but we could not ascertain its altitude, because we could not decide on its dimensions. The machine approached in speedy, jerky movement to a position which seemed about 30 degree angle from where we stood.

It paused momentarily, and moved erratically sideways to its left; then forward, and then sideways to its right, and finally backward at high rate of speed until it was out of sight in the southern haze. It did not actually turn on its axis.

The complete maneuver can best be described as a square course at constant elevation; but its manner seemed much too fast for any ordinary production 'copter, and far too erratic for any production conventional fixed wing jet aircraft we've ever seen or read about. The craft seemed to pause logically at the corners of the square. It was emitting a very loud JET TIRE noise. We could discern none of the 'whipping' sound of conventional 'copter rotors, probably because of altitude; nor could we actually see rotors moving in their arcs. We thought we could see a sort of fuselage and pair of rotors tilted in opposite directions. This view was not a good underside view; but sort of profile. The object was not near enough to reveal any outstanding features or configurations such as control surfaces, landing gear, or compartments. One point is clear. The machine seemed to have executed the whole maneuver without changing longitudinal or directional position of its fuselage. The craft was also seen by neighbors who were as perplexed as we were. We think the object was of brownish color. Color was hard to ascertain.

A little about my background: I've read some of the material on the so-called 'flying saucers, and discs'; but have not been 'trying to see' these unusual sky objects. I hold a valid airmen's certificate (No. 677121) with some 150 hours of flying in light planes over a several years period. I've seen nothing like the aforementioned object. Perhaps, many people ARE seeing atmospheric phenomena. Some MUST be seeing definite physical objects in the sky other than distorted views of weather balloons, high-flying aircraft, etc. Frankly, we are stumped on what WE saw. We do agree that in all likelihood, we saw an earth-made machine; because despite its fast speed and sudden movements, it didn't seem entirely unreal, or too illogical, or unfeasible.

In summary, we were fascinated by the loud jet-like roar of an unusual aircraft; and being not unfamiliar with fundamental aerodynamic principles associated with both 'copters, and fixed-wing craft, we could not understand

how a 'copter type could be propelled at apparently HIGH SPEED by jet power. The jet sound was the big thing that attracted us, and several neighbors to see this machine approaching our locality. (The Fresno Bee, newspaper carried at least 2 accounts of persons seeing odd aerial objects above Fresno during the same week).


Our report was not made to the newspapers, for the reason we did not want the publicity involved.

We thought this information might be of interest to the proper authorities. We have no design on publicity whatsoever, and wish to remain unquoted. If this machine we saw is some advanced type of American aircraft--fine! If it is of foreign or unknown origin, the U. S. Air Force should be informed, we believe.



FRESNO WOMAN SEES 'FLYING PAN' IN SKY OVER CITY

Mrs. Grace Wiggins goes the flying saucer sighters one better.

The one she saw from her home at South Fourth Street and Braley Avenue last night looked to her "like a broken saucer or a badly dented saucepan, because it had something like a handle sticking out in front."

She said she saw it from her window at about 11 PM and then went outside to confirm her experience. It was about the color of a harvest moon, she explained, but very bright.

The object was in the southwest, she reported, and moved upward, curved downward behind some clouds, rose again, then disappeared. She was not impressed by its speed, however.

She said she has studied the sky and the stars all her life and is sure she never saw anything like it before.

In compliance with AF Letter 200-5, dated 29 April 1952, the following information is submitted:

(1) Object was round, appeared to be the size of a small bicycle wheel, and emitted a bright yellowish light. Only one object was seen. No aerodynamic features, trail or exhaust noticed nor was there any visible propulsion system. Speed varied from zero (hovering) to a speed comparable to that of a jet fighter aircraft. Object performed shifting maneuvers, moving from side to side, giving an appearance of being swing in a pendulum-like fashion. Object disappeared by gradually fading away, apparently moving beyond range of vision. Lights observed within or on the body of the object and gave appearance of either pulsating or rotating in a circular pattern.

(2) Time of sighting was 2100 hours, CST, 20 August 1952 and was observed for approximately five minutes.

(3) A visual surface observation without optical or electronic equipment was made.

(4) Observer was at her residence, [REDACTED] San Antonio, Texas. Object was first observed in the North sky and travelled in a NW direction. Distance and altitude unestimated.

(5) Object observed by Mrs. [REDACTED], reliability unknown. Mrs. [REDACTED] has worked at Kelly AF Base as a Civilian Employee for seven years and states that she is quite able to recognize conventional aircraft.

(6) Fair weather prevailed at the time of the sighting.

(7) No activity or condition, meteorological or otherwise, known to have existed at the time which may have accounted for the sighting.

(8) No physical evidence of the sighting.

(9) No interception or identification action taken.

(10) Location of any air traffic in the general area at the time of the sighting unknown.

STATEMENT

On Wednesday, 20 August 1952, at approximately 9:00 P.M., I took my dogs in the backyard of my home, [REDACTED], San Antonio, Texas, for their exercise. I was carrying one of the dogs in my arms and I stooped to place her on the ground. As I raised up, I was attracted by a peculiar object in the North sky. This object seemed to be suspended in space.

The object was circular in shape, illuminated with bright yellow lights. These lights seemed to glitter or pulsate but not going entirely off at anytime. The lights appeared to revolve around inside the object. The center appeared blank or at least was a dark spot. The object appeared quite large, about the same size as a bicycle wheel. The object was swaying to and fro, in a pendulum-like fashion, covering an area of what appeared to be approximately ten or fifteen feet, possible more.

I observed this object for approximately five minutes or more, then suddenly it shot out in somewhat of an upward slanting course at a very high rate of speed. I could not tell if the lights were still revolving at this time. It traveled in a Northwesterly direction, and soon faded out of sight. I did not hear any sound nor did I see any trail or exhaust.

It was not difficult to differentiate between this object and any type of conventional aircraft, for it did not resemble such, nor operate in the manner of any plane I have ever seen.
