THE Lodge in the Park was taken from the Arch of Octavia. Arch. Mr. Adam.

The Columns of the Portico to the House were proportioned from those in the Pantheon at Rome ; they are thirty feet high, three feet diameter ; several of them in one Stone.

The Steps are ten feet long, two Steps in one Stone.
