


THE LODGE in the PARK was taken from the Arch of Octavia.

Arch. Mr. Adam.

The Columns of the Portico to the House were proportioned from those in the Pantheon at Rome; they are thirty feet high, three feet diameter; several of them in one Stone.

The Steps are ten feet long, two Steps in one Stone.

The Hall and Saloon were after the Greek Hall and Dome of the Ancients, proportioned chiefly from the Pantheon at Rome, and from Spalatro. The Columns were proportioned from the three Columns in the Campo-Vaccino at Rome, supposed to have belonged to the Temple of Jupiter Stator.

HALL.

Sixty feet by thirty, within the Columns; sixty-seven feet three inches by forty-two feet, within the walls; and forty feet high: twenty Corinthian Columns of Alabaster, fluted, twenty-five feet high; two feet six inches diameter.

SALOON.

A circle, forty-two feet diameter; fifty-five feet high to the top of the dome; sixty-two to the Rose in the skylight; thirty-four feet six inches to the top of the cornice of a large Entablature at the spring of the Dome. Four Alcoves, eleven feet diameter, twenty-two feet high.

The Dome white Stucco, finished in Octagon Compartments with Roses.

Ceiling of the Alcoves, white Lozenge Compartment and Roses.

All Mouldings, Roses, and Ornaments, half gilt.

The Alcoves have Fireplaces representing Altars, adorned with Sphinxes and basso-rilievos.

The Candle-branches have basso-rilievos of Boys under them, after Raphael, Albano, Domenichino, Parmigiano, Poussin, Pietro di Cortona, &c.

The Stucco—by Rose.

The Doors have Scagliola Pilasters, Verd-Antique—Bartoli.

- Elizabeth, Widow of Sir John Grey (afterwards Queen) imploring Edward the Fourth to restore her Husband's Lands—from Angelica Kauffman, by Rebecca.
- Eleanora sucking the Poison from her Husband Edward the First's Wound—from Angeliea Kauffman, by Rebecca.
- The Bases and Capitals of the Door Pilasters are after the Temple of Ercetheus, King of Athens; 1409 years before Christ.
