

Part II Narrative Summary

l June 1967: At 1000 a two plane section led by Major C. H. PITMAN departed Dong Ha on an observation flight of a zone intended for a recon insertion. Twelve miles northwest of Dong Ha (YD053709) small arms fire was observed from several bunker complexes. Without taking any hits Major PITMAN maneuvered the section away from the area back to Dong Ha.

That afternoon, on the third and final landing in the landing zone (YDO81651) the aircraft commanded by Major PITMAN came under heavy automatic and small arms fire. The medevacs were quickly carried aboard and Major PITMAN, obtaining maximum performance from his aircraft, made a skilled and rapid departure. During the three trips forty-nine medevacs from OLDFIELD LIMA were rescued by the two BONNIE SUE aircraft with no damage to either aircraft.

2 June 1967: An hour and a half earlier a 16 man recon team, code name AMBRIDGE II of the 3rd Recon Battalion, 3rd Marine Division had been

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inserted in landing zone YDO60709 with the mission of working their way to a downed UH-lE and establishing a defensive perimeter. At 0830 a call was placed for an emergency extraction. With fixed wing support Major C. H. PITMAN led a seven plane flight consisting of two CH-46's, two UH-lE's from VMO-2 and three UH-34's from HMM-363 into the area. The team was in the landing zone under heavy small arms and automatic weapons fire when Major PITMAN made the first approach, picked up eight team members and departed safely. lstIt. M. J. PEPPLE rescued the second half of the team with a courageous and skillful approach and departure. Neither of the two CH-46's received any hits.

Later that morning Major PITMAN made an attempted insert of the recon team FLATTSBURG II. With Lt. PEPPLE circling overhead and two UH-1E's from VMO-2 as escort Major PITMAN began his approach to the landing zone, YDO89566. The mission was aborted because of heavy enemy fire in the landing zone.


That afternoon on a routine resupply of RUGGLES DELTA coordinates YD153712, Major C. H. PITMAN received heavy small arms fire during transition to landing. Upon return to Dong Ha the aircraft was downed due to battle damage, eight hits were received.

3 - 4 June 1967: Normal operations, see daily SITREPS.

5 June 1967: Captain R. R. SIMMONS led a four plane flight consisting of two CH-46's and two UH-1E's from VMO-3 on an attempted insertion of the recon team RATTLER. While on final to the landing zone seven miles southeast of Khe Sahn, coordinates XD966378, Captain SIMMONS received small arms fire. A wave off was taken and the aircraft returned to Dong Ha with no hits taken.

That afternoon Captain SIMMONS again received small arms fire without taking any hits. During his climbout after delivering supplies to TODAY I flashes from enemy fire were seen southwest of the landing zone, coordinates YD075603. Climbout was continued and the two plane section returned to Dong Ha.

Departing Khe Sahn Captain P. E. BENNETT led a two plane section to hill 950 coordinates XD834464 on a emergency medevac. A VMO-3 UH-1E had previously reported that it had taken heavy automatic weapons fire in the zone. Captain BENNETT orbited over the landing zone obscured by clouds and finally made his approach when a clearing permitted visibility. Before his approach was completed he went IFR and





made an IFR climbout. His second attempt was successful, but as the medevacs were boarding, the zone again came under IFR conditions, forcing Captain BENNETT to depart through a layer of clouds. Because of good judgement and superior ability of Captain BENNETT the mission was successful.

6 - 7 June 1967: Normal operations, see daily SITREPS.

8 June 1967: Captain S. A. REED leading a two plane section with support from VMO-3 and fixed wing, attempted to insert an eight man reconteam, code name MOON I, at coordinates XD912348. On final with approximately 100 feet of attitude Captain REED received small arms fire from the perimeter of the zone. A left climbing wave off was immediately commenced before any hits were received.

9 June 1967: With support from fixed wing and VMO-2 UH-1E's Captain J. PIATT led the two plane section on the emergency retraction of a six man recon team, code name SUMMERSAIL II, at coordinates YDO64674. After air strikes of an area north of the teams position where enemy fire had been received, Captain PIATT began his approach while Captain K. G. HAYES circled overhead as SAR. Immediately after landing heavy enemy small arms and automatic fire was received from east, west and south of the zone. The team boarded while the crew chief, Corporal R. I. JOHNSON, and the gummer, Lance Corporal C. BENENTE, began suppressing the fire. Lance Corporal BENENTE is credited with one enemy confirmed KIA and Corporal JOHNSON is credited with one probable. Captain PIATT skillfully maneuvered his aircraft out of the danger area and returned to Dong Ha with three hits received.

10 June 1967: Normal operations, see daily SITREPS.

ll June 1967: The 0715H brief at Dong Ha was attended by the pilots of two VMO-2 UH-1E's and those from two HMM-265 aircraft. Captain C. R. BOHISCHEID, commander of EP-158, was to lead the flight on two recon extractions and four recon insertions. The only mission aborted was the insertion of STAINSPOT II; aborted because of the lack of a suitable landing zone. At approximately 1115H the flight departed Dong Ha on the last pre-briefed insertion and flew to the landing zone (YDO41681). After a zone prep by the UH-1E's Captain BOHISCHEID commenced an approach while Lt. D. S. ENGLE orbited overhead as SAR. At 400 to 600 feet of altitude, Captain BOHISCHEID's aircraft, apparently hit by enemy fire, went into extremely unusual flight attitudes, crashed in the ravine and burned. No survivors were spotted by crews from the UH-1E's and the SAR helicopter. Listed as MIA are the seven members of the





recon team, code name SUMMERSAIL I of the Third Force Reconnaissance Company, and the pilots and crew of EP-158; Captain C. R. BOHLSCHEID, Major J. S. OLDHAM, Private First Class J. M. HANRATTY and Lance Corporal J. J. GONZALES.

12 - 15 June 1967: Normal operations, see daily SITREPS.

16 June 1967: Captain R. R. SIMMONS led a two plane section from Khe Sahn to coordinates XD871487 on an emergency extraction of the eight man recon team, code name PARTYLINE II. While on a short final approaching the landing zone Captain SIMMONS began receiving enemy small arms and heavy automatic weapons fire. The approach was continued and a landing made while the recon team formed a defensive perimeter and attempted to suppress the fire. After a short delay the team boarded. Captain SIMMONS then skillfully lifted from the landing zone and flew his undamaged aircraft back to Khe Sahn.

That night Captain D. M. PETTEYS led a two plane section supported by two VMO-2 UH-1E's from Dong Ha to a position 22 miles southeast (YD428245) to extract emergency medevacs from RIDGEBEAM GOLF II. Because there was no landing zone available, Captain PETTEYS attempted to shoot his approach to a hover and hoist the medevacs to the helicopter. His first approach was aborted after he began to receive heavy enemy small arms and automatic weapons fire. The two UH-1E's attempted to suppress the enemy fire before Captain PETTEYS tried two more approaches, each time receiving heavy fire and forcing a wave off. After three unsuccessful attempts the mission was cancelled until daybreak.

17 June 1967: With the first light of day Major H. S. MCIELIAN led his two plane section supported by two VMO-3 UH-1E's to the RIDGE-BEAM GOIF II medevac area. After fixed wing preparation, Captain M. R. MILLER, who had flown as SAR on the same mission the night before and was familiar with the area, shot his approach, hovered over the pick-up point and hoisted the two medevacs into the helicopter. The medevacs were then flown to "A" Med Phu Bai.

Iater that morning Major H. S. MCLEILAN departed Dong Ha with his two plane section for an attempted insert of an eight man recon team "AMBRIDGE II" at coordinates XD858614. After a fixed wing prep of the landing zone Major MCLEILAN commenced his approach flanked by two VMO-2 UH-1E's. Prior to landing the aircraft began receiving enemy small arms fire, one round piercing the helicopter just below the starboard gun mount. The enemy fire was suppressed by the aircraft and

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recon team numbers while Major MCLELLAN flew the helicopter to safety.

18 June 1967: The area around the position of the recon team, code name AMBRIDGE II, had been hit by fixed wing with rockets. With the aid of VMO-3 UH-1E's Captain R. R. SIMMONS began his approach to the landing zone (XD934654) in response to the team's call for an emergency extraction. The helicopter landed, the team began to board and the enemy began to deliver fire. The guns of the helicopter and recon team returned the fire while Captain SIMMONS skillfully maneuvered the helicopter out the zone. The suppressive fire from the helicopter was effective and the aircraft returned to Dong Ha unscathed.


19 June 1967: The eight man recon team, code name MONOTYPE II, boarded the aircraft of Captain M. R. MILLER at Khe Sahn to be inserted at XD762505. Upon arrival at the landing zone the two VMO-2 UH-1E's made several low passes and observed no enemy activity. Captain R. R. SIMMONS orbited high as SAR while Captain MILLER commenced his approach along the ridge line. During the approach one of the recon members saw what he thought was enemy movement. After his wave off Captain MILLER, unable to point out the exact location of suspected enemy movement to the UH-1E's, made a low pass to mark the spot with fire. While on this pass he received heavy small arms and automatic fire from several different locations. After expending ordnance in the area the flight returned to Khe Sahn.

20 - 24 June 1967: Normal operations; see daily SITREPS.

25 June 1967: Captain J. PIATT completed an emergency extraction of PRIMNESS I from XD736444 with no hits received. lstIt T. P. BERRY completed an emergency extraction of PAGETITLE I from YD060405. Sporadic small arms fire received, but no hits taken.

26 - 29 June 1967: Normal operations; see daily SITREPS.

30 June 1967: An HMM-265 aircraft, EP-168, piloted by Captain J. A. HOUSE attempted to insert an eight man recon team, code name NETTLE-RASH II, at YC904962. Upon completion of a zone prep and the UH-1E's checking the zone, the aircraft approached the landing zone from the north through the valley. As Captain HOUSE's aircraft was about to touchdown, it received heavy automatic weapons fire from all sides. Captain HOUSE waved off, but the aircraft had been hit and set afire. The aircraft began to burn intensly, so Captain HOUSE was forced to land in 80' trees about 1000 meters from the recon zone. Captain HOUSE and four members of the recon team were killed in action. The



three remaining crew members, It. T. R. PITTMAN, ICPL G. R. SMITH, ICPL J. A. MICHAEISON, and the remaining four members of the recon team were injured and subsequently rescued.

Concurrently Captain M. R. MILLER the wingman, was on the radios talking to the DASC and MAG-16 S-3 (FWD), setting the wheels in motion to rescue the survivors. Airborne FAC's, more UH-1E's and additional fixed wing attack aircraft were on station within minutes. After a murried brief at Phu Bai MAG-16 FWD a 65 man SPARROW HAWK was inserted at YC894957 by four CH-46's and five UH-34's from HMM-163. It was hoped that the ground force might be able to reach the crash site.

Meanwhile, the airboxrne FAC's and UH-lE's spotted pencil flares and signal tracers from the crash site. Upon completion of the SPARROW HAWK lift, the lead CH-46, piloted by Captain D. M. PETTEYS went to the location and hoisted out the seven survivors and flew them to "A" Med at Phu Bai. However, as Captain PETTEYS moved off the crash site, his aircraft was followed by a number of air bursts but reached Phu Bai unscathed.

After the fate of those aboard the downed aircraft was learned, it was decided to retract the SPARROW HAWK. Four CH-46's, from HMM-265, led by Major D. E. SCHNEIDER and five UH-34's from HMM-163 made the retraction without incident.
