# Umarell

**Umarell** (Italian spelling of the [Bolognese Emilian](#) word *umarèl*, Emilian pronunciation: [umaˈreːl]; plural *umarî*) are men of retirement age who spend their time watching construction sites, especially [roadworks](#) – stereotypically with hands clasped behind their back and offering unwanted advice to the workers.<sup>[1]</sup> Its literal meaning is "little man" (also *umaréin*).<sup>[2]</sup> The term is employed as lighthearted mockery or [self-deprecation](#).

The modern term was popularised in 2005 by local writer Danilo Masotti<sup>[3][4]</sup> through three books and an associated blog.<sup>[5][6]</sup> In 2021, the word was included in the *Zingarelli* dictionary.<sup>[7][8][9][10][11]</sup>

Described as a "drab dark [brown](#)" and informally dubbed the "[ugliest colour in the world](#)", it was selected in 2012 as the colour for [plain tobacco and cigarette packaging](#) in [Australia](#), after market researchers determined that it was the least attractive colour.<sup>[2][3][4][5]</sup>

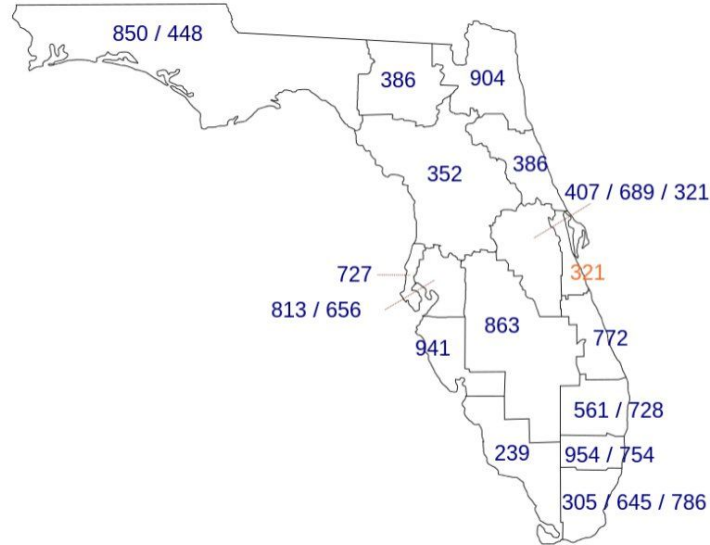

The area code has been in use since November 1, 1999; it was assigned to Florida (instead of suburban Chicago) after a successful petition led by local resident Robert Osband to commemorate the [Space Coast](#)'s impact on Brevard County. When it was activated in 2000, area code 321 was used as an overlay for the [Orlando](#) area. The code refers to the [countdown](#) sequence which has launched many [spacecraft](#) from [Cape Canaveral](#).<sup>[1][2][3]</sup>


# Jimmy Carter rabbit incident

This list covers innovation and invention in the mechanical, electronic, and industrial fields, as well as medicine, military devices and theory, artistic and scientific discovery and innovation, and ideas in religion and ethics.

## 15th century [ edit ]

---

- **Defenestration** is an act of throwing someone from a window. The first time<sup>[*citation needed*]</sup> the behavior was identified and named was in 1419, when several town officials were defenestrated from New Town Hall.
- **War wagon**, a heavy wagon developed by the **Hussites** in 1420 with fortified wooden sides and fire slits for early gun artillery, gunners and crossbowmen as crew. It could form steady mobile walls, which foiled several **crusades**.

## 18th century [ edit ]

---

- **Denis d'or** reportedly the first musical instrument in history that involved electricity was invented by **Prokop Diviš** in 1748.
- **Prokop Diviš** invented a "metereological machine" erected in Přímětice (now part of **Znojmo**) in June 1754. It is sometimes counted as an invention of **lightning rod**.

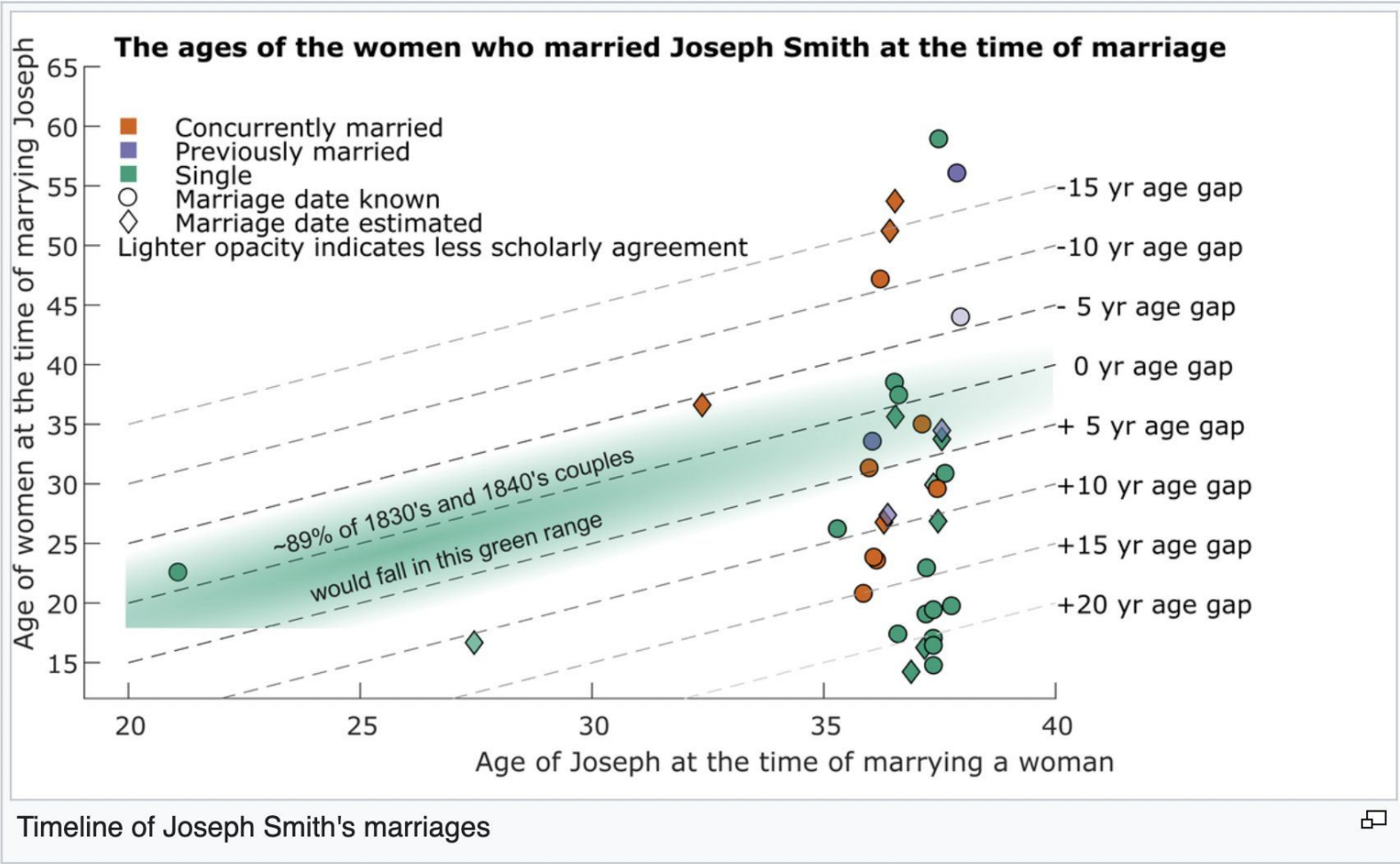

The **Kentucky meat shower** was an incident occurring for a period of several minutes between 11 a.m. and 12 p.m. on March 3, 1876,<sup>[1]</sup> where what appeared to be chunks of [red meat](#) fell from the sky in a 100-by-50-yard (90-by-45-meter) area near [Olympia Springs](#) in [Bath County, Kentucky](#).<sup>[2]</sup> There exist several explanations (from the plausible [blood rain](#) to the not so plausible vulture ejecta)<sup>[3]</sup> as to how this occurred and what the "meat" was.

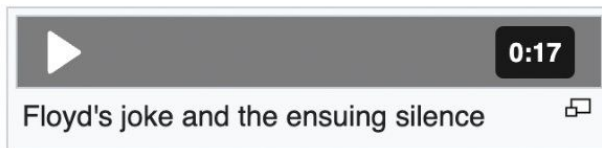

During oral arguments before the [United States Supreme Court](#) in *Roe v. Wade*, a major [abortion rights](#) case, Texas Assistant Attorney General Jay

Floyd began his remarks with a reference to his opposing counsel, [Sarah Weddington](#) and [Linda Coffee](#): "Mr. Chief Justice and may it please the Court.<sup>[a]</sup> It's an old joke, but **when a man argues against two beautiful ladies like this, they are going to have the last word.**"<sup>[2]</sup> The joke was met with silence in the courtroom and, according to abortion rights lawyer [Margie Pitts Hames](#), visible resentment from Chief Justice [Warren E. Burger](#). Widely viewed as sexist<sup>[3]</sup> and often considered "the worst joke in legal history",<sup>[4]</sup> Floyd's attempt at humor has been cited by commentators including Justice [Antonin Scalia](#) as a cautionary tale about attempting humor in court.

The **Kabul synagogue**, known by locals as the "Jewish Mosque",<sup>[1][2]</sup> is an abandoned Jewish *synagogue* in *Kabul*, Afghanistan. It was built in the 1960s, when *Afghanistan's Jewish population* numbered in the thousands. The synagogue fell into disrepair over the latter half of the 20th century due to the emigration of the country's Jewish population, damage during the *Second Afghan Civil War*, and persecution under the *Taliban*.

In the early years of the 21st century, the synagogue was home to *Zablon Simintov* and *Yitzhak Levin*, believed to be the last two Jews in Afghanistan, who served as the synagogue's caretakers. Levin died at the synagogue in 2005, and Simintov was evacuated from Afghanistan in 2021 after the *Taliban takeover* of the country.

The word **Hamburgevons** (or **Hamburgetonstiv** or **Hamburgetons**) is a short piece of meaningless [filler text](#) used for assessing the design and the appearance of a [typeface](#).<sup>[1][2]</sup> It contains all essential forms in a Latin alphabet, so that the character of the respective font can be recognized quickly.<sup>[3][4]</sup> It consists of the letters that are often first designed when [designing a typeface](#).<sup>[4]</sup>

The word is useful for [typographers](#) and designers during the design of a font, as the form of its letters include all of the curves and abutments normally found in a font.<sup>[5][6]</sup> As a test word, it is useful for determining the visual readability of a font chosen for a layout.<sup>[7][8]</sup> A version of it is often used as a standard word in the visual layout of fonts submitted to competitions and exhibitions.<sup>[9][10][11]</sup>

**Black hairy tongue** syndrome (BHT<sup>[4]</sup>) is a condition of the tongue in which the [small bumps on the tongue](#) elongate with black or brown discoloration, giving a black and hairy appearance. The appearance may be alarming, but it is a harmless condition. Predisposing factors include smoking, [xerostomia](#) (dry mouth), [soft diet](#), poor [oral hygiene](#) and certain medications. Management is facilitated by improving oral hygiene, especially scraping or brushing the tongue.<sup>[5]</sup>

The ***Donaudampfschiffahrtselektrizitätenhauptbetriebswerkbauunterbeamtengesellschaft***<sup>[a][1]</sup> (German: [ˌdoːnaʊˈdampfʃɪffaːɐ̯tsʔɛlɛktʁitsɪˈtɛːtəˈhaʊptbɛˌtʁiːpsvɛɪkbauˈʔʊntɛbɛˈʔamtŋgəzɛlʃaft] <sup>ⓘ</sup>; lit. 'Association for Subordinate Officials of the Main Maintenance Building of the Danube Steam Shipping Electrical Services') was a supposed suborganization of the *Donaudampfschiffahrtsgesellschaft* (DDSG), a [shipping](#) company based in [Vienna](#) that transported passengers and [cargo](#) on the [Danube](#) before World War I. The DDSG still exists today in the form of the now-private companies DDSG-Blue Danube Schifffahrt GmbH (passenger transport) and the DDSG-Cargo GmbH. However, there is no evidence that the *Donaudampfschiffahrtselektrizitätenhauptbetriebswerkbauunterbeamtengesellschaft* ever existed.

It was discovered on 25 August 2008 by astronomers at the [Andrushivka Astronomical Observatory](#) in northern Ukraine.<sup>[1]</sup> The asteroid **was named after the online encyclopedia Wikipedia in** January 2013.<sup>[2]</sup>

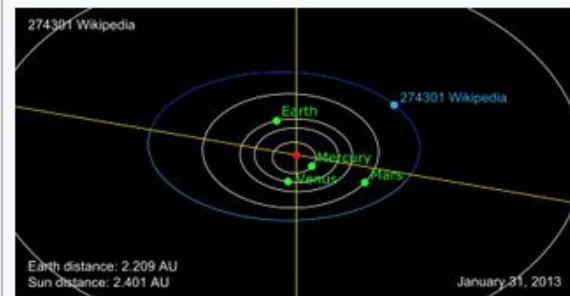
## Etymology  [ [edit](#) ]

The decision of the [Committee for Small Body Nomenclature](#) to assign the name "Wikipedia" to the asteroid was published in the [Minor Planet Circulars](#) on 27 January 2013 ([M.P.C.](#) 82403).<sup>[7]</sup> The asteroid received the number 274301.<sup>[8]</sup> The name was proposed by Andriy Makukha, a board member of [Wikimedia Ukraine](#). It was submitted to the Committee by the owner of the observatory, [Yuri Ivashchenko](#).<sup>[9]</sup> It reads:

Wikipedia is a free, [copyleft](#), collaboratively edited online encyclopedia launched in 2001. In 11 years of its compilation it became one of the largest reference works and one of the most visited web-sites on the Internet. It is developed in more than 270 languages by enthusiasts from all over the world.

**Claude Émile Jean-Baptiste Litre** (1716-1778) is a fictional character created in 1978 by Kenneth Woolner of the [University of Waterloo](#) to justify the use of a capital L to denote [litres](#).

The [International System of Units](#) usually only permits the use of a capital letter when a unit is named after a person.<sup>[1]</sup> The lower-case character l might be difficult to distinguish from the upper-case character I or the digit 1 in certain fonts and styles, and therefore both the lower-case (l) and the upper-case (L) are allowed as the symbol for *litre*. The [United States National Institute of Standards and Technology](#) now recommends the use of the uppercase letter L,<sup>[2]</sup> a practice that is also widely followed in [Canada](#) and [Australia](#).<sup>[*citation needed*]</sup>

**Koumpounophobia** is the term used to describe the [phobia](#) of clothes [buttons](#).<sup>[1]</sup> This phobia regularly leads to feelings of fear and disgust when sufferers are exposed to buttons either visually or physically.<sup>[2]</sup> It is estimated that less than one percent of the U.S. suffers from this phobia.<sup>[3]</sup> The most common forms of treatment for koumpounophobia are behavioral therapy and cognitive-behavioral therapy.<sup>[4]</sup>

## Notable koumpounophobes [\[ edit \]](#)

[Steve Jobs](#), the co-founder of [Apple Inc.](#), had an aversion to buttons, which manifested in a dislike for buttons on computer hardware and his choice to wear a [turtleneck](#) shirts instead of shirts with buttons. Some have speculated that this influenced the trend towards [touchscreens](#) and [virtual keyboards](#) in the design of Apple devices.<sup>[5][6]</sup>

## Koumpounophobia in popular culture [\[ edit \]](#)

In 2009, popular author [Neil Gaiman](#) released a promotional teaser trailer for the film *[Coraline](#)*, based on [his novella](#).<sup>[7]</sup> The trailer featured Gaiman addressing the nature of koumpounophobia and warning sufferers about the content of the film, which features characters with buttons in place of eyes.

A **zero-rupee note** is a [banknote](#) imitation issued in [India](#) as a means of helping to fight systemic [political corruption](#). The notes are "paid" in protest by angry citizens to [government functionaries](#) who solicit [bribes](#) in return for services which are supposed to be free. Zero-rupee notes, which are made to resemble the old [50-rupee banknote](#) of India, are the creation of a [non-governmental organization](#) known as 5th Pillar which has, since their inception in 2007, distributed over 2.5 million notes as of August 2014. The notes remain in current use and thousands of notes are distributed every month.
