


STANDARD VARIETIES AND NOVELTIES.

The characteristics of the Spencer Sweet Peas, grown under congenial conditions are: robust growth, the plants attaining a height of from 6 to 10 feet, requiring for full development to be not less than 6 inches apart; a foot apart is better. The flowers are giants among Sweet Peas, measuring 2 to 2½ inches across. They are beautifully formed and daintily waved. Three and often four or five of these queenly blossoms are borne on long, strong stems.


