Explanation

The photograph at the top (A) shows the alter of a Kannon-do, (a sort of Buddhist Chapel) constructed by Gen. MATSUI at Izusan, Atami city.

The image at the center is Kwanzeon-bosatsu (a Buddhist saint, usually a symbol of mercy). The two mortuary tablets before the image symbolize the spirits of the Chinese as well as Japanese soldiers who died in the Sino-Japanese Incident. (B&C)

The two other photographs below show the details of the above tablets. The one on the right (C) bears an inscription which reads: "The Japanese soldiers who fell in the Sino-Japanese Incident." The other on the left (B) reads: "The Chinese soldiers who fell in the Sino-Japanese Incident."

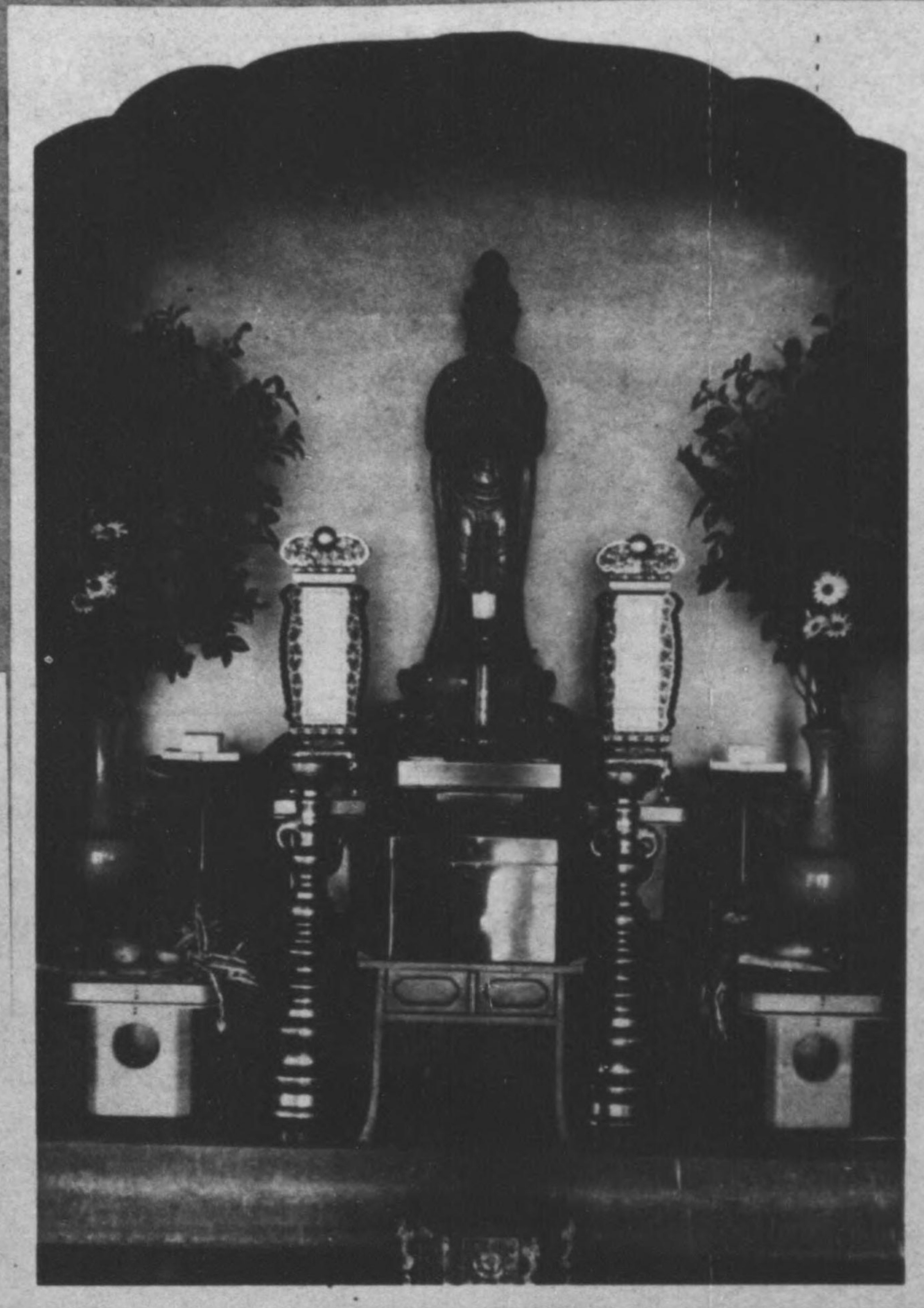

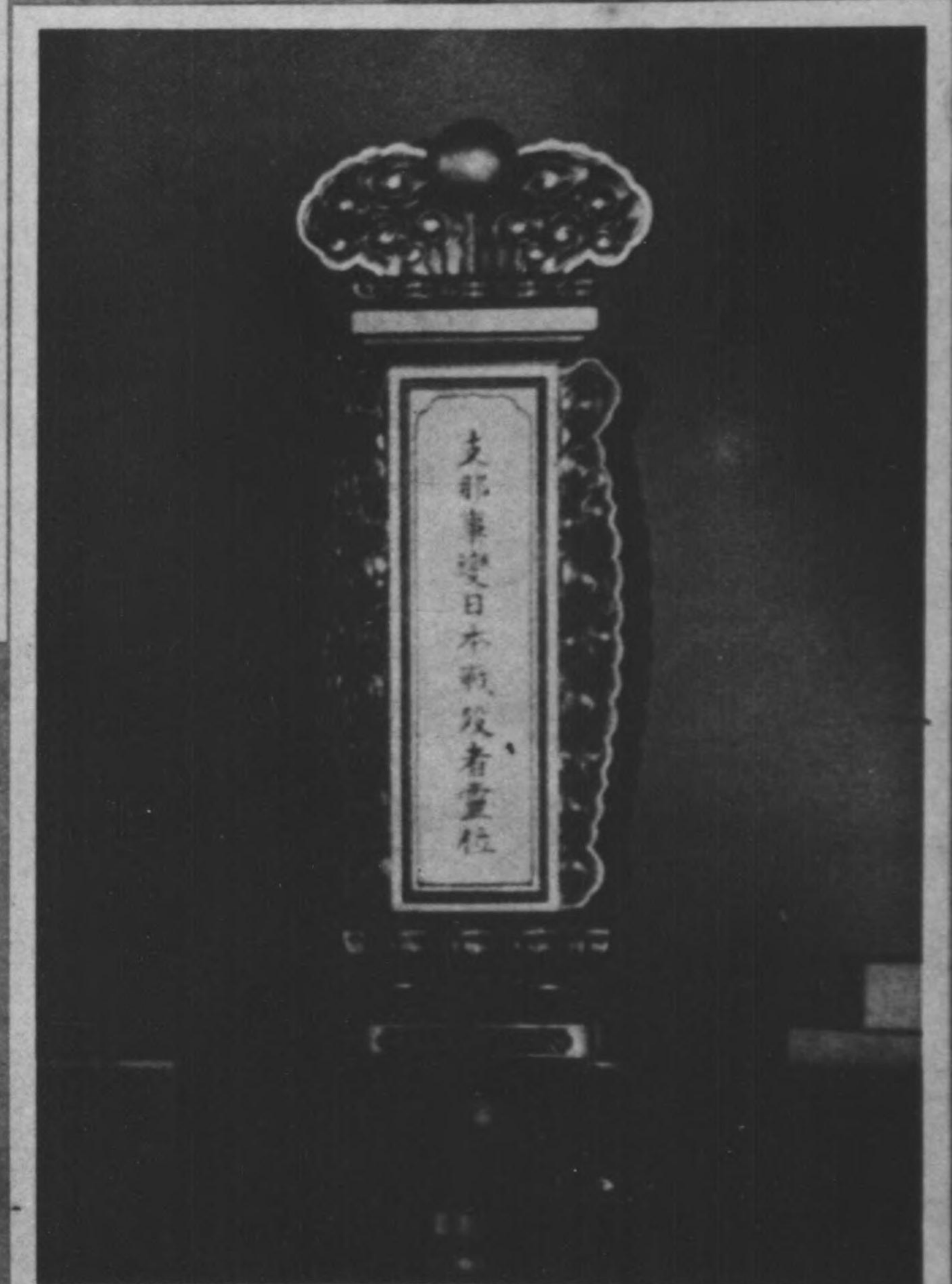
