



## Dedication


There's a story behind cadet training that is heard only in barracks and in the little groups on the flight line.


They spent 9 long months waiting and working for their first ride. Then the pace caught up with them, and they were men enough to know it, and take it.

#### Our Flying Instructors



By way of introduction—this gentleman's name is Igor Beever.





After the war, they hope to go dual through the thermals and downdrafts of life.






