The " Black Sand " Wonders of Gold Bluff. California has witnessed some excitement since the "gold fever" first started the tide of emigration hitherward, but she has seen nothing that compares with the "black sand" fever which just now seems to affect the entire community. Instead of the questions, "How is your health?" and "What is the news?" which all Yankeedom propounds when meeting a friend, the only inquiry now is, "What do you think of the black sand from Gold Bluff?" From the male gold seekers, the excitement has naturally spread to the female population, and we yesterday heard one little woman urging her husband to engage in the enterprise, and offer to furnish the money herself to fit out an expedition, by way of experiment! It is discussed with coffee at breakfast, estimates of incomparable magnitude are made at dinner, and discovered, and will open to the miner a field dreamed of at night.

And what has caused "all this commotion?" Why, a company chartered the Chesapeake, went up to "Gold Bluff," and brought samples of "black sand" which appear to be exceedingly rich in glittering ore. A company, consisting of some thirty persons, was immediately formed, books opened, and a few shares. only, all the stock-holders would consent to dispose of, were put in the market, and up they went, like a mainmoth balloon inflated with gas. The condescension of the share-holders in permitting a few others to pay their hundred dollars each for an interest in the treasures which were to make them all Rothchilds and Barings-on paper-was highly commendable.

The stock was divided into 12,000 shares. of \$100 each, and 1000 shares were thrown into the market, for which the original holders expect to realize \$100,000 -a very small compensation for a division of their prospective wealth. The sand was displayed throughout yesterday in all its richness, and numberless were the American eagles that changed hands at KENDIG & WAINWRIGHT'S. The entire store had the appearance of a mass meeting. The result will be of course, unless the whole thing turns out to be a stupendous humbug, as is not unlikely, the original stockholders, about thirty in number, will take the proceeds of eleven thousand shares, while those who make up the aggregate of \$100,000 in cash, against the fictitious capital of the others, will receive a dividend upon one thousand shares! The proportion is as about as a hat full of sand for the latter, to a ship load for the former! When a division is made, we would not be disposed to give a sizeable bundle of "old exchanges" for the proceeds which fall to the gentlemen who put the cash into the pockets of the benevolent thirty citizens!

There may be, and undoubtedly is, an immense deal of "black sand" at Gold Bluff -enough to load all the ships in the world, unless the bottom of the earth should fall through into Chida,-but the richness of it all, is a matter of extreme doubt. But as those engaged in the speculation have come to California for the purpose of making a "pile," there is probably as little objection to their accomplishing their object by dividing the spoils of plunder at one hundred dollars each share, as in any other way. The loss then falls lightly on each, and can be stood without "caving in" by any. "Who bids for a few shares of Gold Bluff stock? Last call, gentlemen: only one hundred dollars each: and if it's not all right, we'll make it right in the spring!"

Proposed Union Meeting.

We have been shown a call which will be circulated to-day, amongst all citizens, without distinction of party, for a Union meeting, to be held at the California Exchange, corner of Kearny and Clay streets, on Monday evening next.

The object of the meeting is the same which prompted the mass gatherings of the people in New York, Philadelphia, and other cities of the Atlantic States, and we have no doubt will be equally as well attended here, and that the same patriotic sentiments will find utterance. We shall look to the proceedings of the proposed meeting with much interest.

The call, with the signatures, will be published on Monday morning.

PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE.—By the legislative proceedings of Thursday, we perceive that the Senate made choice of Hon. D. C. BRODERICK, of this District, as its presiding officer, in place of the Lieutenant Governor, who is now the Executive, by the resignation of Gov. BURNETT. The choice of Mr. BROD-ERICK, for so responsible a position, does credit to the good sense of his colleagues. He is an experienced and capable legislator, and will preside over the deliberations of the Senate with impartiality.

THE NEW COLLECTOR .- Hon. T. BUTLER King, the new Collector of the Port, will probably enter upon his duties on Monday. Some of the new appointees were sworn in yesterday. Mr. K. brings with him his son. a young man of intelligence and capacity, as his private Secretary.

"OLD BLOCK" ABOUT TOWN.—On the first page of to-day's paper will be found a few local whittlings from "Old Block's" Pen-Kaife. The same hombre will have his "say" on Monday, about the famous "black sand" Mining In the San Josquin District.

Hon. S. Purdy, the present efficient Mayor of Stockton, called on us vesterday morning, and among other items of intelligence, placed us in possession of some facts in regard to mining, in the San Joaquin district, not generally known, and which have only recently ranspired.

Heretofore the attention of our mining population, has been directed to the bed of the stream, as the point most likely to afford an adequate return for their labor, while he shores of the river have been neglected; but within the last ten days, it has been discovered that the banks of those streams are made up of a succession of layers, in some instances as many as five in number, varying from one to three feet in thickness, and from one hundred to four hundred feet in width, each one of which has at some remote period of time, formed the river bed, and received the bulk of the deposits. This has given currency to the opinion that the gold so far gathered, was not the direct washings from the mountain, but that which the action of the stream has taken from its

Since this discovery, explorations have been made in several quarters, which have all resulted in confirming the opinion that far more abundantly than any heretofore for future operations, as extensive in territorial limits, as it is rich in deposit.

Resignation of Gov. Burnett. By the proceedings of the Legislature in another column, it will be seen that Gov. BURNETT sent in his resignation to that body on Thursday, and that Lieut. Gov. McDov-GAL was inaugurated Governor, at a joint convention of the two houses.

In parting with the late State Executive, as officially connected with the good weal of the State, we take pleasure in bearing testimony to his kindness and integrity, and his sincere desire, on all occasions, to perform the arduous and responsible duties devolving upon him with strict fidelity, and an honest solicitude for the permanent welfare of California. He leaves the Executive chair with the warmest wishes of all who know him, for

In announcing the resignation of Gov. BURNETT, we will take occasion to say that his place will be most ably filled by Lieut. Gov. McDougal, whose prompt and close attention to business, and his intimate knowledge of the affairs of the State at large, eminently fit him for so prominent and responsible a position.

STREET RENCONTRE.-We learn from the San Jose Journal that Mr. BRODERICK, of this city, and Mr. Moore, of the Assembly, had a rencontre in the street on Wednesday afternoon, growing out of words spoken in debate in the Joint Convention.

From our correspondent, we learn that Mr. Broderick was met by Mr. Moore, as the former was passing the Treasurer's office, when the latter stepped in front of him, inst., for the gold regions of Oregon. and drawing a pistol, exclaimed, "I'll blow your brains out, you damned thief?" Mr. Broderick looked him steadily in the eye, without moving, and answered, "Shoot, you lamned assassin; shoot, I have no arms." But Mr. Moore's courage failed him, and after a few minutes, he was taken away by his

The cool intrepidity of Mr. Broderick, with a loaded pistol within two paces of his head. was creditable, and evinced the true courage of the man.

A PAINFUL FACT .-- It is a lamentable fact, that in this land of plenty, where industry and enterprise are so well rewarded, that there should be hundreds of beings in a destitute condition. There are a great number of persons in this city who live by what they can pick up in the streets, and in auction rooms, and who lodge in the saloons. An old man, well known to the attendants of the different saloons on the Plaza, has for the last twelve months, slept in a chair, or on a table, and has no other means of subsistence save the scraps he can gather in different places. The great wealth of the country, and the certain reward that meets well-applied labor, would certainly preclude the idea that there are many whom dissipation and disease have so far reduced, as to make them dependent upon the cold charities of the world for their support.

THE PRICE OF A BEATING .-- A man rushed into the Third District Station House on Saturday, almost out of breath, and demanded of the officer in attendance the price of thrashing a man! Some one had called him a thief and a scoundrel, and he wanted to know the cost of beating him for the offensive words. The officer told him it depended somewhat upon the amount of damage done, and the fellow left, but whether he put his determination into execution, and ran the risk of "sizing his pile" in the operation, we did not learn.

EAGLE OR OWL .-- A couple of gentlemen. in wandering over Telegraph Hill yesterday afternoon, captured a large bird of the eagle or owl species, which, after quite a fight with the feathered stranger, they conveyed alive to the Carlton House, corner of Kearny and Pacific streets, where it may be seen in all its native majesty. It appears quite indignant at being deprived of its liberty, and assumes a haughty crest towards its captors and their race, which augurs much in favor of its Eagleship identity.

THE WEST POINT .- We understand that Capt. WAKEMAN, the late popular captain of the New World, takes command of the West Point, after to-day. He makes his first trip

News from the San Jonquin Valley. The Stockton Times of the 8th instan learns from Mr. Robert Dowling, that the whole of the mining district at the head waters of the Stanislaus, Moquelumne, and Calaveras, has been thrown into a state of great excitement by a sudden irruption of

the hostile Indians. The Times adds: " For some time past, horses, mules, &c., had been missed by the miners, but on Saturday immense swarms of Indians poured down and drove off every animal they could find, The miners at once assembled and immediately detached parties in pursuit to work a terrible vengeance upon the Indian tribes. Two hundred old Mexican campaigners from the Calaveras, and about an equal number from the eighborhood of Moquelumne Hill are out on the Indian trail. The Garde Mobile, too, are evincing that spirit for which they have obained a world-wide celebrity. No sooner was the cry for vengeance made than one hundred of them filed out and tendered their services to the Americans. It appears that the Indians have occupied a strong position on the North Fork of the Stanislaus. The camp is situated on a high hill, the ascent to which is exceedingy difficult. Casouse, an Indian chief, remains riendly, and is assisting the whites."

FATAL AFFRAY. -On New Year's day, a man said to be from Texas, entered the house of Sexton & McLaughlin, on Woods' Creek, about two miles below Sonora, in a very intoxicated state, and created some disturbance. He was ordered away by Mr. Sexton, but afterwards reture to the door, and thrust his hand into his breast, as if to get a pistol, told Sexton that he intended to take his life. Hereupon Sexton struck him under the ear rnd knocked him down. Either the blow or the fall proved fatal. Sonora Herald.

CALIFORNIA LEGISLATURE.

THURSDAY, January 9 IN SENATE. - The Senate met at 10 o'clock, the President in the chair. Mr. Tingley introduced a bill to repeal "An act for the better regulation of the mines, and the government of foreign miners," approved April 12th, 1850: which was read for the first time, and on motion of Mr. Crosby, laid over until the proper committee was appointed and

ready to act. The President proceeded to lay the resignation of the Governor before the Senate.

RESIGNATION OF THE GOVERNOR. Circumstances entirely unexpected and un forseen by me, and over which I have no control, render it indispensible that I should devote all my time and attention to my private affairs. I therefore tender to both Houses of the Legislature my resignation as Government of the State.

I leave the high office to which I was called by the voluntary voice of my countrymen, with out one only regret that my feeble abilities have allowed me to accomplish so little for the State. In the humble sphere of a private citizen, I shall still cherish for her that ardent attachment she so justly merits. Within her serene and sunny limits I intend to spend the remainder of my days, many or few; and should an unfortunate crisis ever arise, when such a sacrifice might be available and necessary for her safety, my limited fortune and force, and my life shall be at her disposal.
