## SCAPIN

- 1997 ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFICIAL EXCHANGE RATE FOR JAPANESE YEN, dated 23 April 1949. (ESS/EX)
  - Directions to put into effect an official foreign exchange rate of 360 Japanese yen to one U.S. dollar. Rages for other currencies will be based on this rate translated into the U.S. dollar values of such currencies as registered with the International Monetary Fund. This rate will be the basis for all permitted foreign trade and exchange transactions, including transactions for which military conversion rate is now applicable, as well as deposits to the United States Aid Counterpart Fund for Japanese Stabilization.
- REVISED METHOD OF HANDLING PRESS MESSAGES FROM JAPAN DESTINED TO THE UNITED STATES, HAWAII AND MANILA, dated 23 April 1949. (CCS)

Press messages from Japan to the United States, Hawaii and Manila may be sent from Japan on a prepaid or on a receiver-to-pay basis at the option of the sender. Concurrence of the administration of destination is requisite to the transmission of press messages with charges payable at destination.

ADOPTION OF A PROCUREMENT ACCOUNT CODE TO CONTROL FUNDS APPROPRIATED FOR OCCUPATION FORCE REQUIREMENTS, dated 3 May 1949. (OGA)

Informs the Japanese Government that in order to accomplish the objectives outlined, the Occupation Forces have adopted a procurement account code to include the specified terms.

- JAPANESE POLICE RADIO STATIONS, dated 4 May 1949. (CCS)
  Directs the Japanese Government to initiate immediately specified program to reduce the number of radio stations operated by Japanese police to those that conform to international regulations and can be relied upon to provide service under emergency conditions.
