1. Reference Allocation 3-21, Rolling Mill, Plant No. 01-58 Machine Inventory No. 1489.

2. On 12 August 1948, the packing inspector, Mr. Puckett, DAC, inspected the above rolling mill for progress in dismantling in compliance with Allocation 3-21. During this inspection one steel worm shaft, see attached sketch, which is an essential operating part to Machine 1489 was found in a broken condition.

3. Close examination indicated the fracture to be old, undoubtedly attributable to "metal fatigue" (crystallization) from long usage over approximately thirty years. The above shaft forms an integral part of subject machine and cannot be successfully repaired nor readily replaced.

4. It is the opinion of the packing inspector that subject damage can not be attributed to negligence and that no liability has been incurred by the Japanese Government under SCAPIN 1751. It is recommended that the recipient nation accept the machine in its present condition.

5. Request information regarding action to be taken on the disposition of subject machine.

1. Forwarded herewith, in accordance with par. 4 h, OD 21, Hqs Eighth Army, 30 Mar 48, is an application for the removal and use of 90 items of "EX" equipment from the Kariya North Plant (Kariya Kita Kojo) of the Toyota Motor Co (Code No. 01-46) as listed in Inclosure 1.

2. The applicant, Mr. Shinpachi Watanabe, holds a concession with the Nagoya Air Force Base Post Exchange for the repair and maintenance of private vehicles for Occupation Force Personnel in the Nagoya area. The Toyota Motor Co., owners of the equipment, have concurred in the application for use for the purpose indicated.

3. Owing to the difficulty of locating a concessionaire capable of doing the quality of work desired, and the scarcity of adequate equipment, the Nagoya Air Force Base Executive Officer, and the Post Exchange Officer have solicited the assistance of this team in obtaining expanded automobile repair and maintenance service by means of the proposed arrangement.

4. While it is desired to move the equipment from the present location in Kariya (about 15 miles from Nagoya) to

the new NAFB Post Exchange Garage in American Village, Nagoya, it is understood by all parties that in the event this application is approved, the equipment in all other respects will remain fully subject to regulations governing the custody and maintenance of reparations items. 5. In view of the local need by Occupation Force personnel for the services proposed to be offered through the NAFB Post Exchange Garage, it is recommended that this application be approved.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

1. Confirming conversations with Nagoya Air Force Base Executive Officer, and Nagoya Air Force Base Post Exchange Officer, the use of ninety (90) items of reparations equipment (enumerated and described in inclosure 1) owned by Toyoda Motor Co. (Toyoda Jidosha Kogyo K.K.) and operated by Mr. Shinpachi Watanabe as concessionaire of the Nagoya Air Force Base Post Exchange is agreed to. This understanding is being reached solely to augment the automobile repair services available to Occupation personnel of the Nagoya area, and is subject to the following conditions:

- a. That subject equipment will be located in the Nagoya Air Force Base Post Exchange Garage, American Village, Nagoya.
- b. That the equipment will be guarded in full compliance with existing regulations governing custody of reparations equipment.
- c. That existing regulations governing maintenance of reparations equipment in authorized use will be strictly adhered to.
- d. That all expenses incidental to the movement of subject items from and/or to their present location at Kariya North Plant (Kariya Kita Kojo) will be borne by the Concessionaire.
- e. That subject machines will be available for inspection at any time by persons accredited from Aichi Military Government Team.

2. It is further understood that this memorandum cannot, and is not intended in any way to modify the reparations status of subject equipment; that it remains in all

**SUBJECT:** Review of Items of Reparations Equipment in Authorized Use

**THRU:** The Japanese Liaison Office  
Tokai-Hokuriku Region, Nagoya

**TO:** The Governor, Aichi Prefecture

1. To establish a more accurate system of accountability of items of reparations equipment in authorized use, it is necessary for this office to review the status, and prepare a current list of each item of equipment otherwise subject to reparations allocation, which is now believed to be in "Authorized Use".

2. In connection with this action it will be necessary for each reparations plant to submit to this office a list in duplicate, indicating the following information:

- a. Inventory number
- b. Type of item
- c. Operating dimensions, serial and/or model number
- d. Purpose for which item is being used
- e. Number and date of permit under which item of equipment is operating

3. Supplementary to the foregoing lists, it will be necessary to submit copies of permits which authorize present operation. If authorization was verbal, an affidavit indicating the person authorizing use, his organization, and the approximate date of the verbal authorization, will be furnished.

4. This office will examine the evidence of authorized use submitted, and will return one copy of the list with formal confirmation of the items found to be in authorized use.

5. This headquarters is no longer permitted to determine authorized use. All items of equipment presently marked "U" for which formal confirmation from this office is not obtained at this time may no longer be operated. All future applications for authorized use will be submitted through this headquarters to GHQ, SCAP.

6. In view of the limited facilities of this office, it is requested that the submittal of the plant list be scheduled according to the priority of the probable allocation and removal of the equipment for reparations, beginning with arsenals and aircraft plants.

7. The intent of the foregoing memorandum is (a) to confirm previous informal authorization for use where such is found to be legitimate, (b) to provide owners with legal evidence of such authorization, and (c) to provide this office with a detailed and currently accurate list of all items of equipment in authorized use.

## REMARKS:

It should be noted that with regard to the number of unemployed personnel in each plant following reparations removal that all figures must of necessity come from Japanese sources. In some instances the plant reported that 100% of the present employees would be unemployed following reparations removal even though 100 or more nonreparations machines were presently owned by the plant--the apology for this being that the plant would no longer contain vital units necessary to the operation of the plant as an integrated facility. It is suspected that the Japanese plant owners have painted as dreary a picture as possible of post reparations conditions. In the absence of qualified industrial engineers this headquarters is unable adequately to interpret the correctness of the statistics submitted.


