MEMORANDUM REPORT
Re: Blotter Entry # 133

SUBJECT: Alleged Concealed Explosive

TO: Provost Marshal, Headquarters I Corps, APO 301, U.S. Army.

1. Reference is made to Blotter Entry #133, dated 3 August 1946, which reads as follows: "Sgt. Suzuaki, Provost Marshal's Offices, Hq I Corps, accompanied by two (2) members of Koreans Residents Association, came to this office with report regarding alleged concealed explosives. Stated person having knowledge of place of concealment now held in Fushimi jail. Requested C.I.D. investigate immediately." (Exhibit 1).

2. On 3 August 1946 the undersigned Agents proceeded to Fushimi Police Station. There the Agents learned that person having knowledge of explosive had been transferred to the Procurators Office for trial.

3. On 3 August 1946 the undersigned Agents proceeded to the Prosecutors Office. There obtained the release of Saburo Kasai.

4. On 3 August the undersigned Agents, accompanied by Saburo Kasai, proceeded to a town of Chara-Mura, There the Agents located the explosives.

5. On 5 August 1946 the undersigned Agents accompanied by Inspector Tahara, from the 2nd Criminal Section of Kyoto Prefectural Office, proceeded to the location of the explosives. Inspector Tahara suggested that his office make a complete investigation and will submit a report to the C.I.D. office.

6. On 16 August 1946 the undersigned Agents received a complete report from Inspector Tahara. (Exhibit 2).

7. CONCLUSION:: Nothing further to report.

1. Kind and Quantity of the Explosive.

2. Cause of the Accident

When these seven injured mentioned above ~~were~~ passing along the road behind Nagoya Railway Bureau Administration Office on their way to swimming place about 0.30 p.m. on 16th July, Ichiro Tateishi found a blind incendiary bomb in between the lumber at the lumber collecting place of Nagoya Railway Kogyo Co. Ltd., then he, out of curiosity, kicked the tip of the incendiary bomb by his foot, on a sudden, the bomb exploded with a great sound and he was seriously injured due to the flame showering over his whole body, and at the same time six others nearby were seriously or slightly injured.

3. Cause of the bomb found in the area.

The bomb actually located at the site belonging to Nagoya Railway Bureau Administration Office, had not been found by the Police Station. Investigation shows the bomb was dropped in the rice field unnoticed on the 12th of July last year when Tsuruga City was bombed. In May this year the farmer, Asajiro Miyamoto, Minami Tsunai, Tsuruga city, finding the bomb in his field interfering his cultivation picked the bomb up and placed on the low footpaths between rice fields. The reason for farmers not reporting to the police regarding the bomb was that the bomb found half smashed and appeared harmless.

4. Action taken by Police

Immediately after the case was reported the chief of the police with his men rushed to the spot and investigated the accident and at the same time have the victims carried to Tsuruga Hospital and given the first aid treatment. As of today we still have under our custody those dangerous blind fire bombs in and outside of Tsuruga City as have already been reported to Mil. Govt. under separate cover. In regard to those still existing ones we have erect ~~red~~ ^{red} flags around them showing the sign of danger and notified public strictly not get in the area. Moreover anticipating the dangerous explosives afloat in the sea near the swimming centers of Tsuruga City and neighboring Higashiura and Jogu, we informed the people concerned by bulletin board to arouse self-guarding spirit and to encourage

to inform police, without fail, as soon as discovered. Thus we are trying our best to prevent any further accident.

5. Conditions of Victims after first-aid

1. Ichiro Tateishi (11 years old)
passed away at 3:20 PM on July 16.
2. To-oru Kageyama (8 years old)
passed away at 8:00 PM on July 16
3. Shigeo Kageyama (13 years old)
passed away at 5:20 AM on July 17.

The four remaining both seriously and lightly injured victims are being treated at Tsuruga Hospital and expected to recover within 2 weeks.

6. Other references;

It is claimed that the exploded fire bomb had already been reported to the Police by one of the employees of R. R. Administration Office, but the police has never received such report.

SUBJECT: Report on Explosion of Fire Bomb.

TO : Commanding General I Corps APO 301
ATTN: Mil Govt Section.

1. At approximately 1230 on the 16th of June 1946 seven children of the City of Tsuruga were seriously injured by the explosion of an incendiary bomb, presumably the M 69. Three of these children have already died and a fourth is not expected to live.
2. This particular bomb had not been previously reported to the Police or to this Military Government Office but was within 1200 ft of a posted area. A farmer while ploughing his field had uncovered it, picked it up and placed it between some logs and these children later on, found it and played with it causing the explosion.
3. This organization has, by telephone and as per attached list reported numerous other bombs to the 25th Division at Osaka and to the 3rd Bn. the 35th Infantry at Maizuru. In addition, a member of the I Corps Bomb Disposal team was passing through Tsuruga on 12 July and he took a copy of the attached list to I Corps.
4. In order to avoid any further mishaps of this kind it is requested that every effort be made to expedite the removal and demolition of all bombs and mines.
5. A vigorous campaign is underway with the objective of having all bombs properly marked and reported. The schools are also conducting a campaign to educate the students against the dangers of playing with any portions of bombs or mines.
