Miss McCann called from New York and talked with Mrs. Mellor regarding the application of Mr. Leslie Cecil Dennis who is going to Japan to represent the interests of the Standard-Vacuum Oil Company.

Miss McCann asked if the number of the Military Permit issued in Mr. Dennis' name was available and she was given the number by Mrs. Mellor. Mrs. Mellor informed Miss McCann that as soon as the Company could inform the Department of Mr. Dennis' departure date the Department would make arrangements to have the exit permit requirements waived in his case. Miss McCann said Mr. Dennis was not leaving on the CALIFORNIA BEAR as the Department had been advised but would definitely leave by Pan American Airways from San Francisco on October 8. Miss McCann was also told that the Department would request that his re-entry permit be sent to him at San Francisco as soon as his alien registration number could be obtained, which would simplify matters for INS. Miss McCann said she would obtain it from the British Consulate the first part of the week. She inquired about Mr. Dennis' military permit and Mrs. Mellor told her that a letter had been drafted forwarding it to him but in view of the information she had just given it would have to be re-drafted and it would be sent Monday. She said that was quite all right; just so they got it about the middle of the week.

Miss McCann will call again the first of next week as soon as she has learned Mr. Dennis' alien registration number.



Mrs. Mellor called Mr. Ettele of the Standard-Vacuum Oil Company and informed him that a military permit had been received for their representative, Mr. Leslie Cecil Dennis to enter Japan between September 15 and November 15, 1948 for a stay of 60 days after entry. Mr. Ettele then said that it was Mr. Dennis' intention to stay in Japan three years. Mrs. Mellor informed him in that event he should apply to the military authorities upon his arrival in Japan for a semi-permanent residence permit.

Mr. Ettele stated that transportation was being secured for Mr. Dennis to sail early in October from California on the CALIFORNIA BEAR. Mrs. Mellor told him that if his Company will inform this Division as soon as Mr. Dennis' definite sailing date is known arrangements will be made to waive the exit permit requirements.

Mr. Ettele made a note of the telephone number of this office, said he would call as soon as the information was received, and thanked the Department for calling.

Mrs. Mellor called INS and talked with Mrs. Gazzara regarding a re-entry permit for Mr. Leslie Cecil Dennis a British subject who has received a military permit to go to Japan as a representative for the Standard-Vacuum Oil Company and intends to stay three years.

Mrs. Gazzara stated that if Mr. Dennis desires to leave the US without a re-entry permit he may do so, but when he desires to return to the US he will have to have another visa. A re-entry permit is valid for one year only but it may be renewed every six months, for which there is a charge of \$3.00 each time. Mrs. Gazzara stated if Mr. Dennis were absolutely certain he will stay three years, it would appear preferable for him to get a visa when he desires to return to this country, which he can do by applying to the nearest American representative. However, if he would prefer to have the re-entry document in his possession (in case a contingency arose whereby he might be called back to the US within the year) he can get it. In that event he could get on the ship to return without reference to any American Consul.

Mrs. Gazzara said further that a re-entry permit can be mailed in care of an American representative abroad, but only if the application form has been made out in this country by the interested person.

It would be a risky procedure to leave the US without a re-entry permit in many instances, but it is my understanding that the British immigration quota is large and not more than 5% of it is used each year.

My dear Mr. Ettele:

The receipt is acknowledged of your letter of September 2, 1948 addressed to the Passport Division of the Department of State regarding the application of your representative, Mr. Leslie Cecil Dennis, for permission to enter Japan. Your letter was referred to the Division of Protective Services for reply in view of the fact that Mr. Dennis is not an American citizen.

There is enclosed military permit number 10023 issued by the Department of the Army in the name of Mr. Dennis for permission to enter Japan between September 15 and November 15, 1948, valid for a stay of 60 days after entry. In this connection reference is made to a telephone conversation between you and a member of this Division on September 9, 1948 during which you stated that Mr. Dennis anticipates a stay of three years in Japan. The procedure which is followed in such circumstances is for the visitor to make application to the military authorities upon his arrival in Japan for a semi-permanent residence permission.

The Department now understands that Mr. Dennis expects to leave San Francisco for Japan by Pan-American Airways on October 8, 1948. Upon receipt of this information the Department arranged to have the Exit Permit requirements waived in his case.

In regard to Mr. Dennis' re-entry permit, reference is made to a telephone conversation between Miss McGann of your office and a member of this Division on September 10, 1948

MEMORANDUM

The Department of State acknowledges the receipt of a note from the Legation of Lebanon dated September 7, 1948 under cover of which there was transmitted to the Department the new application of Mr. Alfred Bridi, a national of Lebanon, for permission to travel to Japan.

The application under reference was transmitted to the appropriate military authorities and in reply the Department has received a communication stating that Mr. Bridi has been granted permission to enter Japan at any time during the month of November, 1948 for a stay of sixty days after his date of entry. It is noted by reference to Mr. Bridi's application that he requests permission to stay in Japan one year. In this connection you may inform Mr. Bridi that upon his arrival in Japan he may, if he wishes, apply to the occupation authorities for semi-permanent residence permission.

The Department assumes that the Ministry of Foreign Affairs will arrange to have inserted in the passport of Mr. Bridi a statement to the effect that he has been cleared

by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo for entry into Japan. In this connection there are enclosed two copies of a pamphlet published by the Supreme Commander's Headquarters entitled Guide for Commercial Entrants to Japan. It will be noted that there appears in the appendix to this publication the text of the Supreme Commander's Circular three of February 25, 1948. The statement which should be placed in Mr. Bridi's passport is required by paragraph III. 4.c. (1) of this circular.

I am writing on behalf of Rev. Jacob Kopp, S.J., a German national, now in transit through the United States en route to the Jesuit Mission in Japan. Father Kopp is booked to sail on the SS. GENERAL MEIGS of the American President Lines, leaving San Francisco on the 17th September and due at Yokohama on the 2nd October. As in previous cases of this kind, I should like to request that the Exit Visa be waived and that the Immigration Authorities at San Francisco be notified accordingly.

Several weeks ago I submitted to Colonel Scott at the Military Permit Section of the Civil Affairs Branch, Department of Army, a memorandum listing the various documents in possession of Father Kopp for his entry into Japan. Colonel Scott was satisfied that nothing further was required in the way of documentation from the Military Authorities.

While waiting his sailing date (perhaps uncertain because of the present west coast shipping strike) Father Kopp will be residing at the University of San Francisco, 2130 Fulton Street, San Francisco 17.

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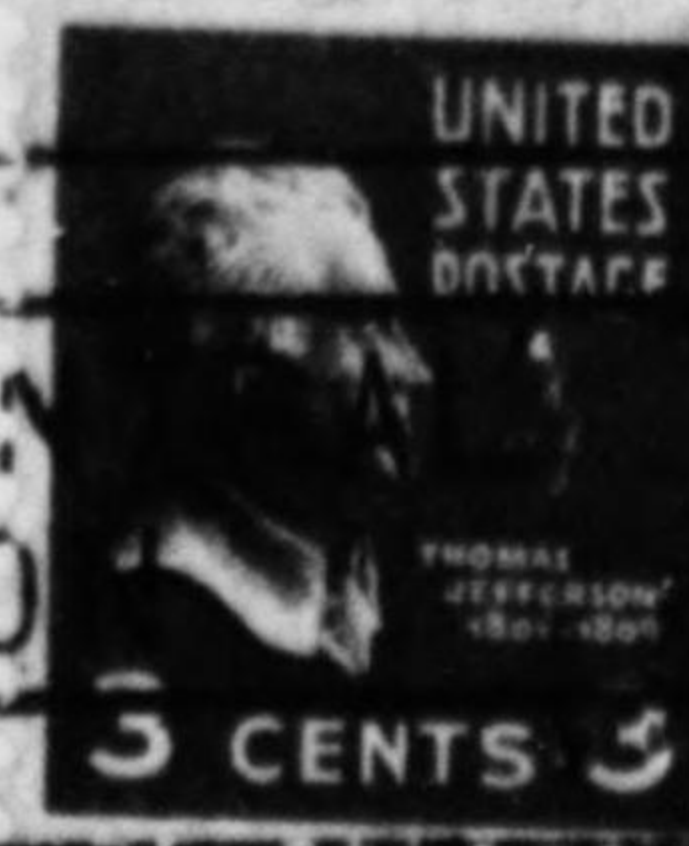

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

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

On September 9, 1948 the Department received a visit from Mr. Simon Fleiss (alias Solomon Staretz, see Embassy Despatch No. 378, March 31, 1948; São Paulo Despatches 43 and 80 of February 5 and March 8, 1948, respectively). Mr. Fleiss discussed the projected trip to Japan, under the auspices of Brasiltur, of some 800 Japanese now resident in Brazil, all of whom would have Brazilian passports and reentry permits for return to Brazil and who would spend 30 days in Japan visiting relatives. Fleiss said that the question of documentation had been cleared with the Brazilian Government. This subject is fully discussed in Embassy Despatch No. 623 of May 26, 1948. Fleiss' purpose in visiting the Department was obviously to see what could be accomplished in the way of meeting requirements of SCAP and he asked specifically for an opinion as to whether Japanese making the trip would be permitted to return to Brazil on the same boat after having spent some 30 days in Japan. He also asked whether any additional Brazilian-born Japanese, now in Japan, who desire to return to Brazil might do so if properly documented.

It will be noted that the story told by Fleiss is at complete variance with the information contained in Despatch No. 623 in that Brasiltur has now reverted to the idea of a 30 day tourist trip instead of carrying Japanese desiring to reenter Japan on a permanent basis, and that the Brazilian Government will grant the necessary documentation.

In view of the conflicting information above, the Department intends to do nothing about supplying Mr. Fleiss with the information requested until it receives further information from the Embassy as to just what the status of this proposed venture is at the present time. The

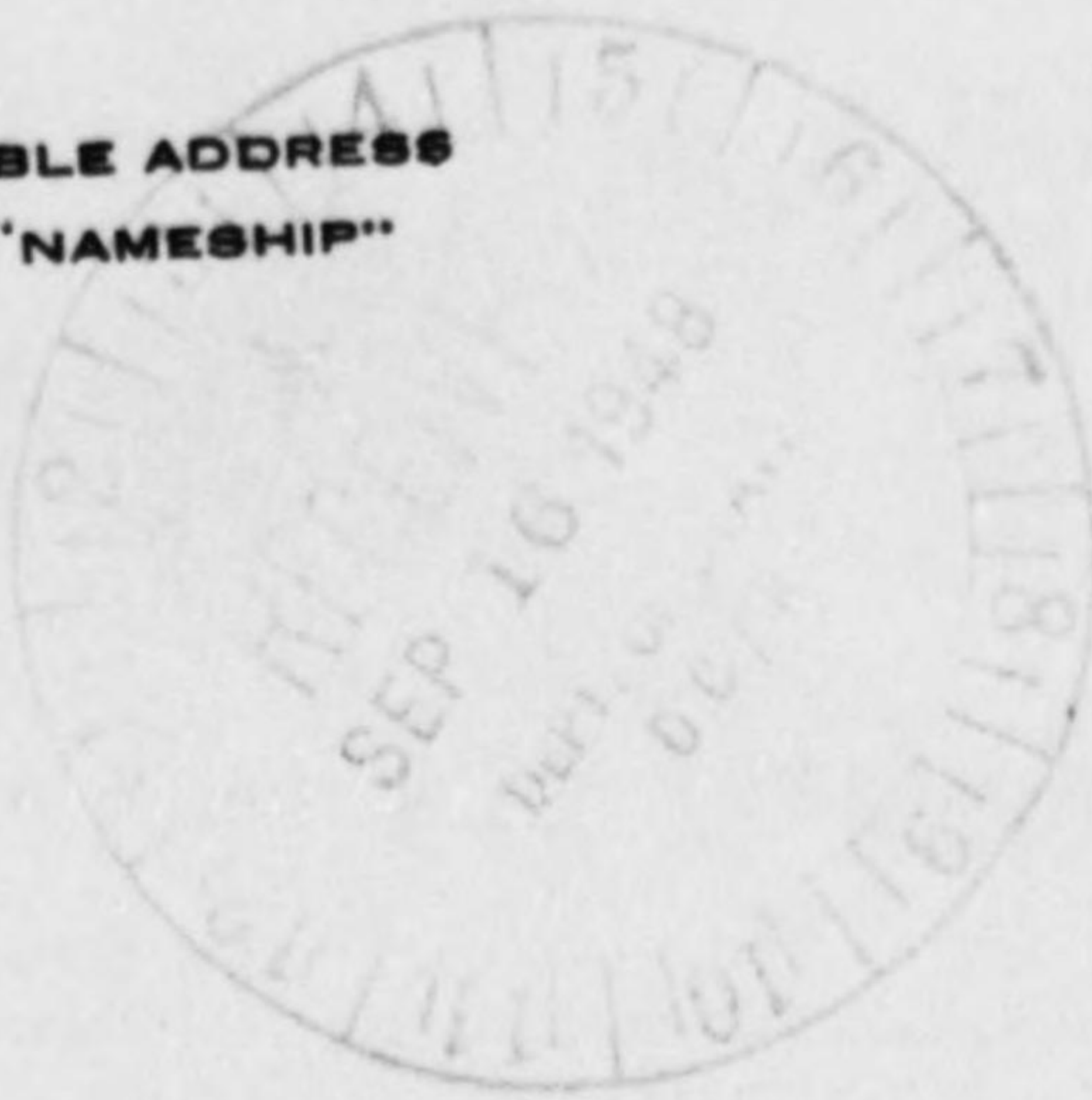

Sirs:

The receipt is acknowledged of your letter of September 16, 1948 in which you state that you have been informed by the Department of Commerce that the application of your Vice President, Mr. Ezra K. Zilkha to visit Japan has been approved, subject to final approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo and the Passport Division of the Department of State.

In this connection you are informed that the Department of Commerce is the agency of the United States Government which receives and transmits to the military authorities applications of private traders for permission to enter Japan as representatives of American firms. The letter which you received from the Department of Commerce does not constitute permission for your representative to enter Japan. It merely informs you that the Department of Commerce has placed its approval upon Mr. Zilkha's application and has agreed to submit it to the military authorities for consideration. As you were informed in the Department's letter to you dated August 30, 1948, permission to enter Japan is granted only by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo. When and if a military permit to enter Japan is issued to Mr. Zilkha, the Military Permit Section, Department of the Army, will forward it to this Division for transmission to Mr. Zilkha and the validity dates will have been stamped upon it. The specification of arbitrary dates between which applicants may enter Japan does not lie within the province of this Department.


