

22.	Daily newspaper stories were written by the officials of the Prefectural Government and published in two local newspapers. With the cooperation of the theatres in the prefecture "slides" were shown daily encouraging people to vote. The day before the election 200,000 leaflets were dropped from airplane, announcing the names of the candidates and urging people to vote. MG worked with the Prefecture authorities in planning the use of movie "slides" and the distribution of leaflets by plane.
23.	Number of violations reported to you:
	As of the present no violations have been reported to this office.

24. No criticism has come to our attention regarding the activities of

the observation teams.

It is the opinion of this office that the local administration committees have done a splendid job of conducting the elections and deserve a great deal of credit for the high percentage of voting and the low percentage of invalid votes. In the first election (Governor) the percentage was 77% vote and 4% invalid; second election (Councillors) there was a 71.4% vote and 6.9% invalid vote.

The four election bulletins enclosed give only the names of two candidates. The election officials explain that the other candidates did not submit their application and information soon enough to have it published in the election bulletin.

The only criticism of the election by the people is that there are too many elections in one month and it does not give the people enough time to become acquainted with the qualifications of each candidate.
