## THE CONVENTION.

Mr. Mayne reported that he would be at the House, in re-consideration of the section relating to the audience required, in order to be eligible to the office of Governor, and of that giving the appointment of Secretary of State to the Governor and Senate.

Mr. O'Brien's motion to refuse leave of absence, was rejected after considerable discussion by a vote of 31 to 28.

The convention then took up the 9th section of the old Constitution, relating to the Governor's right to issue executive orders, and to the power of the Legislature to veto them.

Mr. Hubble moved to strike out the words "judges, and others."

Mr. Duse moved to divide the question.

COUNCIL OF MUNICIPALITY NO. ONE.—At a regular meeting of the Council on Monday evening last, a motion was received from the Mayor, requesting the erection of a suitable building for the protection of the public schools of the Second District, at the corner of Broad and Canal streets, for the accommodation of the male and female pupils of the public schools of the Second District, which was referred to the Finance Committee.

A resolution was adopted for the Exchange Alley, from Customhouse to Bienville street.

The ordinance against keeping and playing of the game of key or lotto, was rescinded.
