2 **Unemployment Insurance – Maryland Department of Labor – Accountability**
3 **and Oversight**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Labor to ~~submit a report post~~
5 on its website certain reports on the administration and operation of the State's
6 unemployment insurance laws ~~to certain persons on or before a certain day each~~
7 ~~month~~; at certain regular intervals; requiring the Department to retain certain
8 weekly reports on its website for at least a certain number of weeks; establishing
9 when a disaster exists for the purposes of certain provisions of this Act; requiring the
10 Department to monitor the Unemployment Insurance Fund for a disaster; requiring
11 the Department, when a certain determination is made, ~~to initiate a certain plan and~~
12 to comply with certain reporting requirements; requiring that the disaster ~~plan~~
13 reporting requirements remain in effect until the Department is able to process at
14 least a certain percentage of certain payments within a certain time period in
15 accordance with certain guidelines for a certain period of time; requiring the

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

24 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

25 (e) “Benefits” means the money that is payable under this title to an individual
 26 who is unemployed.

27 (j) “Claimant” means an individual who submits a claim for benefits.

28 (m) “Department” means the Maryland Department of Labor.

29 (m–1) “Determination” means a decision made by or on behalf of the Secretary under
 30 this title.

2 (a) On or before January 1 of each year, the Secretary shall submit to the
3 Governor an annual report on the administration and operation of this title during the
4 previous fiscal year.

6 (1) a balance sheet for the Unemployment Insurance Fund;

7 (2) a table that shows the amount of any benefit that was ineffectively
8 charged or not charged to the experience rating record of an employer;

9 (3) the reason for not charging the amount of any benefit to the experience
10 rating record of an employer;

11 (4) by category of disqualification, the amount of any benefit that was paid
12 after a disqualification under Subtitle 10 of this title; and

13 (5) any recommendation for an amendment to this title that the Secretary
14 considers proper.

8 MADE WITHIN 21 DAYS AFTER THE WEEK ENDING DATE OF THE FIRST COMPENSABLE
9 WEEK IN THE BENEFIT YEAR;

10 (IV) CLAIMS CLOSED;

11 (V) CLAIMS RESOLVED BY ADJUDICATION; AND

12 (VI) CLAIMS FOR WHICH THE CLAIMANT ENCOUNTERED
13 TECHNOLOGICAL PROBLEMS WITH THE ONLINE PORTAL.

18 ~~WEEK IN WHICH THE DETERMINATION IS BEING MADE AND THE 4 IMMEDIATELY~~
19 ~~PRECEDING WEEKS, THE RATE OF INSURED UNEMPLOYMENT, NOT SEASONALLY~~
20 ~~ADJUSTED, IS AT LEAST 6% IF THE DEPARTMENT, FOR 4 CONSECUTIVE WEEKS, FAILS~~
21 ~~TO PAY AT LEAST 82% OF FIRST PAYMENTS WITHIN 21 DAYS AFTER THE WEEK~~
22 ~~ENDING DATE OF THE FIRST COMPENSABLE WEEK IN THE BENEFIT YEAR.~~

23 (B) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL MONITOR THE UNEMPLOYMENT
24 INSURANCE FUND FOR A DISASTER.

25 (2) WHEN THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF THE DIVISION OF
26 UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE DETERMINES THAT THERE IS A DISASTER, THE
27 DEPARTMENT SHALL:

6 ENDING DATE OF THE FIRST COMPENSABLE WEEK IN THE BENEFIT YEAR, IN
7 ACCORDANCE WITH GUIDELINES PUBLISHED BY THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF LABOR.

16 THE PRESIDING OFFICERS, THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE, AND THE HOUSE
17 ECONOMIC MATTERS COMMITTEE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF THE STATE
18 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE:

19 (I) WITHIN 7 DAYS AFTER THE DISASTER DETERMINATION; AND

20 (II) EVERY 30 DAYS THEREAFTER WHILE THE DISASTER IS
21 ONGOING.

22 (2) THE REPORT SHALL INCLUDE:

23 (I) THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE FUND BALANCE
24 IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE DISASTER DETERMINATION;

25 (II) THE CURRENT BALANCE OF THE UNEMPLOYMENT
26 INSURANCE FUND;

27 (III) THE DEPARTMENT'S ANTICIPATED OFFICE STAFFING
28 NEEDS OVER THE NEXT 30, 60, AND 90 DAYS;

29 (3) THE DEPARTMENT'S PLAN FOR ~~NAVIGATING THE DISASTER~~
30 MEETING STAFFING NEEDS; AND

31 (4) AN UPDATE ON FEDERAL FUNDING AND SUPPORT FOR THE
32 UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE FUND.

1 ~~(C)~~ **(D)** DURING A DISASTER, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

2 **(1)** BE EXEMPT FROM REQUIREMENTS UNDER THE STATE FINANCE
3 AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE FOR STAFFING; AND

4 **(2)** HIRE ~~100~~ ADDITIONAL FULL-TIME OR PART-TIME STAFF WHO ARE
5 STATE EMPLOYEES ~~OR~~, CONTRACTUAL EMPLOYEES, OR INDIVIDUALS UNDER
6 CONTRACT WITH A THIRD-PARTY VENDOR AS NEEDED TO MEET STAFFING NEEDS
7 AND TO RESPOND TO ISSUES RAISED BY CLAIMANTS AND EMPLOYERS.

8 ~~(D)~~ **(E)** DURING A DISASTER, THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY FOR THE
9 DIVISION OF UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE SHALL OVERSEE COMPLIANCE WITH THE
10 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
12 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
13 been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to
14 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
15 enacted.
