HEADQUARTERS 25TH INFANTRY DIVISION Office of the Ordnance Officer (Osaka, Honshu) 31 January 1948 Discovery of Military Explosives Commanding Officer TO: Wakayama Wilitary Government Team APO 25 In accordance with letter, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 7 August 1946, AG 601 (MG), subject: "Release of Former Military Installations, and at your request the following installation was inspected 29 January 1948 and the military (former Japanese Navy) explosives listed on the inclosed inventory were discovered in storage: Kii Interceptor Force Powder Magazine, Yura-mura, Arita-gun. (Coordinates: 1012-1205) 2. It is recommended that S-2, 27th Infantry be advised of this to determine whether the installation was ever seized by tactical troops as a military target, and if so, whether any of the explosives were returned to the Japanese Home Ministry for use as commercial explosives. If some of the explosives had been legitimately returned. they should have been removed from the installation 60 days after release. 3. However, a majority of the explosives (i.e. Otsu "B", Picric Acid, and probably K-2) are "military explosives", and should be destroyed by an Ordnance Bomb Disposal Officer. Black powder, safety fuze, and blasting caps are authorized for return to the Japanese. 4. Further recommend that in case the installation had not been seized that a Moint inventory of the contents be made by S-2, 27th Infantry, Japanese Government representative and explosive technician. and an Ordnance Bomb Disposal Officer, and at that time disposition be determined, and the installation eventually cleared for return. 5. Spot checks were made of the "commercial type explosives" and they are believed suitable for commercial use. Once each month the Office of the Prefectural Chief of Police will consolidate munitions reports and forward two copies to this office. Reports so consolidated will reach this Headquarters on or before the 3rd of each month beginning 3 December 1946 covering the month of November and continue in this manner thereafter. d. Alert the public through the medium of speech or press to the hazards of subject munitions present and the proper procedures for reporting same. b. Fost warning signs near and rope off all areas in the immediate vicinity of any explosives or explosive ordnance which are discovered and reported. This is of utmost importance and will save lives and prevent injuries. Suitable signs for display where explosives have been found, written in both English and Japanese, are scheduled for delivery to this office in the near future. Posters to be displayed in all police stations and other public gathering places are also expected at an early date. These posters will serve to indoctrinate the uninitiated public in the identification and the absolute necessity for reporting all munitions as well as educating the public to positively refrain from any tampering with explosive ordnance. In the meantime, improvised signs should be used. 4. All police and public officials are invited to give their personnal attention to this matter in order that there may be no accidents from explosives within this prefecture. Some concern is being felt by higher headquarters

as well as this office, for the safety of the public due to unauthorized handling of explosives; such as, duds (artillery shells), hand grenades, bombs, both fire and demolition, as well as land and submarine mines. Numerous reports indicates that unauthorized and inexperienced personnel are attempting to remove and dispose of explosive items. Three such accidents are enumerated below for the information of all concerned.

## a. TSURUGA (Fukui Prefecture)

amining a dud US incendiary bomb, it exploded. Casualties: Four children killed, three seriously injured. Remarks: This particular bomb was uncovered by a farmer while plowing his field. He neglected to report it to the police or military authorities; instead, he picked it up and placed it between some nearby logs where it was later found by the unfortunate children.

# b. MUROTO SAKI (Kochi Prefecture)

a floating mine to sea when it detonated. Casualties: One fisherman killed, one fisherman injured. Remarks: The fishermen should have reported the mine to the Japanese Police or Occupation Forces immediately; only skilled technicians are qualified to handle or transport underwater ordnance.

# o. Near NAGASAKI (Nagasaki Prefecture)

Several boys discovered a number of small antitank mine fuzes which had washed ashore. One boy threw a fuze against a stone wall, causing it to detonate. Casual-

Remarks: Small items of explosive ordnance, though apparently harmless, have destructive powers which should never be underestimated. 2. It is directed that the Prefectural Police Department advise all police activities of the hazards connected with disposal of explosives by persons inexperienced in handling explosive materials. It is strongly recommended that suitable notices be published through the medium of newspapers, speech, radio or press in order to educate the general public to the hazards present with any type of unauthorized or improperly identified explosive. 3. In the near future, instructions will be issued by this office, governing actions of police authorities or public officials when explosives of any nature are discovered in their respective areas. 4. Suitable signs should be immediately erected in case explosives are discovered in order that preventable accidents may be avoided. Immediately upon discovery of such explosives, detailed report giving description, location etc. should be made to this office. It is expected that suitable warning signs written in both English and Japanese and posters will be supplied in the near future in order to facilitate the proposed education program.
