

SUBJECT: Salvage of Hidden Goods, Sasebo Harbor

TO : Commanding Officer, Kyushu Mil Govt Region,
Hq & Hq Det., APO 929
(ATTN: Economics Section)

1. Reference is made to the extensive program now in effect to locate and return to the Japanese, hoarded, hidden and excessive critical materials. In their execution of this program, the Japanese have uncovered a large amount of hoarded and hidden materials in, and around the Sasebo area. Sasebo, was once the home of the Sasebo Naval Arsenal, a large ex-Japanese Naval Base.

2. This Headquarters, the 34th Infantry Headquarters Sasebo, and the Fleet Activities U.S. Navy Sasebo, have all received numerous applications to search for and salvage, materials hidden in the Sasebo bay. Many persons claim they have knowledge of materials such as coal, steel, platinum, industrial diamonds etc., concealed in the bay. Although it is the responsibility of the E.S.B., and the procurators office, to salvage these goods, they report it is practically impossible for them to do so, due to lack of funds, proper boats equipment etc. As a result, there is an inclination for these agencies to permit the individual informants to locate and salvage the materials, their remuneration being the informants fee or reward for turning in the materials.

3. Fleet Activities, Sasebo, have expressed a strong protest to having individuals carrying on salvage operations in Sasebo harbor, as one of their primary missions is the security of the harbor. With many individuals operating from various bases around the area, it would be practically impossible to control their operations, and it is felt the security of the harbor would be jeopardized.

4. A conference was held in Sasebo on 30 April 1948, with representatives from this Headquarters, Fleet Activities and the 34th Infantry Sasebo, and all concurred on the following in regard to salvage operations in the Sasebo harbors

- a. One salvage company be designated to accomplish salvage operations in the harbor.
- b. Company to operate from one base.
- c. Operations to be during daylight hours only.
- d. All activities must be coordinated with Fleet Activities Sasebo.
- e. Salvage boats be marked in a manner distinct from other Japanese craft.

- g. Daily reports of operation be submitted by the salvage company to:

- (1) Nagasaki Military Government Team
- (2) S-2, 34th Infantry, Sasebo
- (3) Fleet Activities, Sasebo

h. In addition to the above, Fleet Activities recommends should one company be designated, they have no connection with the local Maritime Bureau. This due to officials of the Bureau once being officers of the Ex-Japanese Navy, and stationed in the Sasebo Naval Arsenal.

5. This headquarters recommends that Higher Headquarters request the Central Government designate one salvage company to carry on salvage operations in Sasebo harbor, and it be instructed to comply with paragraphs 4 b, c, d, e, f, g, and h above. In addition, it is recommended that informers be

1. In compliance with Par. 3, basic communication and
1st indorsement thereto, a report of the inquiry made into the
circumstances surrounding the "Alleged Seizure by CIC of Certain
Items from a Smuggling Ship" is forwarded.

2. It has always been the policy in this Area to lend
all possible assistance to the Kagoshima Military Government
Team, in any phases of investigation that they may be called
on to make within the scope of Smuggling Activities. In accord-
ance with this policy, Agents of this headquarters accompanied
Military Government personnel to observe and assist if necessary
in their investigation of the TOKO MARU, a suspected smuggling
ship, when it was brought into Kagoshima, during the latter part
of December, 1947.

3. A report, S/I KAG 1-202 (11), Subject: "Alleged
Smuggling Activities by Formosans" dated 2 January, 1948, was
forwarded through CIC channels.

4. After the preliminary investigation, CIC, in an ef-
fort to determine whether information of CIC interest resulted,
requested to be notified when the investigation was completed.

5. In the early part of January, 1948, Capt. KELLY,
Cpl. ATKINSON, Sgt. VOLPE and Mr. IKEDA, visited the Kagoshima
Police Station. The Police told them that the Formosans, who
were in detention had gold and some other metals on their per-
son, and refused to give them up, because as they put it, they
were Chinese Nationals and did not come under the jurisdiction of
the Japanese Police. Capt. KELLY reminded the Police that these
metals may come under the classification of Precious Metals, and
that there was a SCAPIN out, directing their disposal. Capt.
KELLY suggested that they be turned over to the Military Govern-
ment and at the same time volunteered to carry the metals over
for the Police. (SEE STATEMENTS of Mr. IKEDA, Japanese Police,

The TOKO MARU was released to the KUSHIKINO FISHING ASSOCIATION, Kagoshima-ken by Civil Merchant Maritime Commission and the following is the disposition of her crew members: two (2) Formosans escaped; six (6) Formosans and one (1) Japanese were released on 20 January, 1948; and the remaining six (6) Formosans were sent to Sasebo, Nagasaki-ken, on 26 January, 1948 for deportation to Formosan territory.

7. Other items seized by the Japanese Customs were as follows: medicines, cosmetics, machinery, stationery, clam meat, electric light bulbs and clothing. (SEE STATEMENT OF Japanese Customs Chief attached as EXHIBIT 7).

I affirm that, according to my conscience, I will speak the truth, adding nothing and concealing nothing. I declare as follows:

I am an interpreter for CIC Area 1, and, at the present time, am living at Kagoshima-ken, Kagoshima-shi, Shimoaratacho #2294. One day, during the latter part of December 1947 or the early part of January 1948, in my capacity as interpreter, I accompanied Captain Kelly and two other members of CIC Area 1, to the Kagoshima City Police Station, to assist in the investigation of some Formosan smugglers, who were detained there. The police official in charge of the investigation told Captain Kelly that he would be unable to carry out a thorough investigation, because Formosans are Allied Nationals. The police official asked for the Captain's help, and, upon receiving an affirmative answer, conducted a thorough search of the Formosans. This search revealed that the Formosans had been concealing gold rings, gold pieces and other jewelry on their persons. They refused to surrender these articles, saying that, because of their nationality, they were not subject to orders from the Japanese Police. Captain Kelly told the Formosans that, according to a SCAP directive, gold was contraband, and the jewelry was thereupon confiscated by the police. It was turned over to Captain Kelly, who said that it would be given to the Kagoshima Military Government Team for proper disposition; we then left the Police Station.

I affirm that according to my conscience, I will speak the truth, adding nothing and concealing nothing. I declare as follows:

I am at the present time, Chief of the Ozarki Police Station, but in December 1947, I was in charge of the Public Safety Section of the Kagoshima City Police. On or about 22 December 1947, I received a call from the Prefecture Police Public Safety Section, to put some Formosans and one Japanese, arrested by the Yakushima Police, in jail for smuggling. They refused to go in their cells, saying, "We are Formosans, hence we are Allied Nationals; therefore, we are not subject to Japanese laws." We asked for the assistance of CIC and Military Government, and with their permission, we locked the men up. When we searched their persons and possessions, we found gold rings, gold pieces and other precious metals on them. Gold, at that time, was contraband, so we confiscated the jewelry, and handed it over to Captain Kelly of CIC, to turn it over to the proper authorities. Six of the Formosans and the one Japanese, were temporarily released on 20 January 1948, and the remaining six Formosans were sent to Sasebo on 26 January 1948, for deportation to Formosa.

One day during the latter part of December 1947, or the early part of January 1948, Special Agent Atkinson, Captain Kelly, Ikeda Chikaji (interpreter), and I, went to the Kagoshima City Police Station to interview a group of alleged Formosan smugglers. During the course of the interview, a search of the prisoners was conducted by the police, and a quantity of jewelry, consisting of gold rings, and other pieces of precious metals, was found on the persons of those being searched. Captain Kelly said that, since it was contraband, we could pick the jewelry up, and give it to the Kagoshima Military Government Team for evidence and ultimate disposition. After the interview, we brought the jewelry to Hq, CIC Area 1, and itemized it. The following day, Captain Kelly and Atkinson took the jewelry to Military Government.

When asked what he was doing with the metals, he replied that they may be precious metals and Military Government should take custody of them. When asked why he brought them to CIC, he replied that the Military Government offices were closed for the day, and that he was going to turn them over to Military Government the following day.

To the best of my knowledge, the metals were then placed in the safe at CIC Area 1, and were taken over to the Military Government offices on the following day.



TRANSLATION OF HAN STATEMENT

City of Kagoshima

Prefecture of Kagoshima

I affirm that, according to my conscience, I will speak the truth, adding nothing and concealing nothing. I declare as follows:

I, as Chief of the Kagoshima Branch Customs, investigated the files of this office, regarding the Toko Maru, and state the following:

The Toko Maru, fifteen tons, thirty horse power, registered at Tansuichi, Formosa, stopped at Yakushima, in Kagoshima-ken, on 17 December 1947, because of engine trouble. It was apprehended by the Yakushima Police, and the crew and passengers were jailed on suspicion of smuggling. At the time, there were one Japanese and fourteen Formosans on the ship, and on 22 December 1947, the ship and men were taken to Kagoshima-shi, by the Hatsugari, a coast patrol ship. Two of the Formosans escaped while they were in the custody of the Police in Kagoshima-shi. Six Formosans (the crew) were sent to Sasebo, in Nagasaki-ken, on 26 January 1948, for deportation to Formosa, because of their illegal residence in Japan, and, of their possessions, those that could be classified as merchandise, were confiscated, with the permission of the Kagoshima Military Government team. Those things that were sellable, were sold. The articles belonging to the others, who were released on 20 January 1948 (22 drums of Nagano carrots; 34 packages of machinery parts; 1 trunk of dental materials; 1 evaporator; and two washing basins), were all returned to their owners. The confiscated items consist mostly of: medicines, cosmetics, machinery, stationery, clam meat, electric light bulbs, and clothing. Also, the Toko Maru was sent to Kushikino, in Kagoshima-ken, by the Maritime Bureau, with the approval of the Military Government Team. The above statement is the truth.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

I, Joseph D. Kelly, Capt, USAF, A047578, in the early part of January 1948, was stationed at 1st Area CIC, Kagoshima Shi, Kagoshima-ken, (Kysuhu) Japan.

During that period, I had occasion to observe the searching of a number of Formosans, their property and persons by the Japanese Police at Kagoshima-Shi.

During the search, some metals were discovered which appeared to be gold, silver, and platinum. The Japanese Police were at a loss as to what to do, as the Formosans claimed to be Chinese and did not come under Japanese law.

The materials were handed over to Mr. Atkinson, Cpl Volpe, interpreter "Scott", and myself, all of 1st Area CIC. The articles were taken to 1st Area CIC Headquarters, and thence to Kagoshima Military Government Team for disposal. It was not known to the undersigned at the time, whether or not the metals were to be used as evidence against the Formosans or not.

The undersigned, with Mr. Atkinson, personally handed the metals to Lt Col McMurray, Kagoshima M. G. Team Commanding Officer and a receipt for same was secured. Subject receipt was deposited in the safe at 1st Area CIC hq to the best of my knowledge and belief.

The undersigned had no official part in the investigation of the Formosans, was not assigned to the case, but merely was an observer to the proceedings.
