Reference is made to your letter of August 16, 1949 requesting information concerning an extension of the validity period of your military permit to enter Japan. It is noted that you plan to leave for Japan either August 26 or August 28, 1949.

The matter of extending your permit was discussed with the Pacific Military Permit Branch of the Department of the Army. It was felt, however, that since your permit is valid until October 1, 1949 you have ample time to arrive in Japan before it expires and no extension is required. *M*

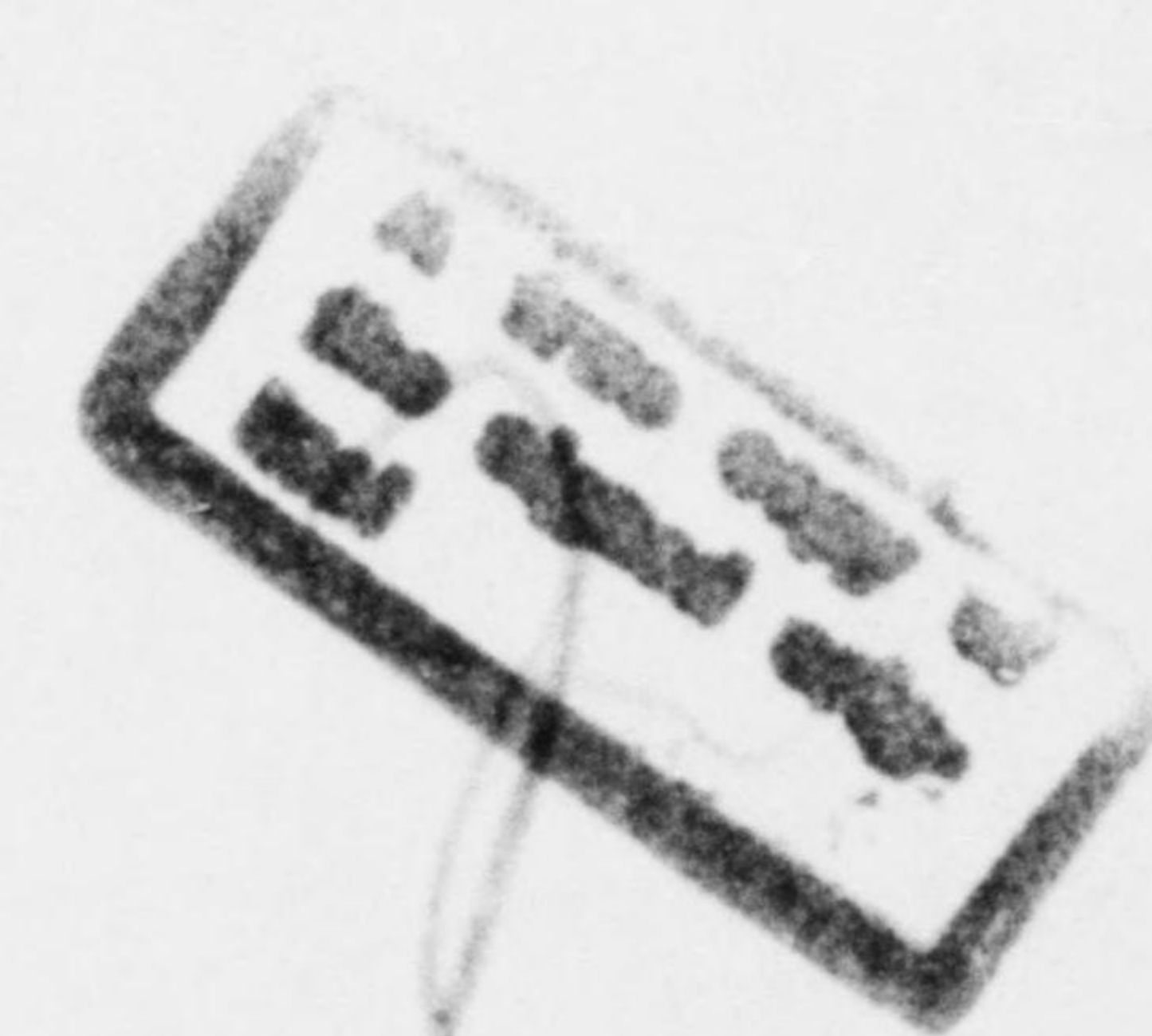

DS this date received Military Permit No. 2086 stating that Mr. Phiphatana Vanij Vongse, a Thai national, is cleared to enter Japan between September 1, 1949 and October 1, 1949 to stay there sixty days for trade purposes.

Mr. O'Brien telephoned Mrs. Flickinger and requested her to refer to the application Mr. Vongse submitted for this permission. It was his understanding that this application would show that Mr. Vongse is presently at Bangkok and should receive his documentation from the Thai Foreign Office. Mrs. Flickinger checked Mr. Vongse's application and confirmed Mr. O'Brien's understanding.

Mrs. Flickinger stated that it was satisfactory for the Department to immediately prepare a diplomatic note to the Thai Embassy informing it of Mr. Vongse's clearance and in response to Mr. O'Brien's suggestion stated that Mr. Vongse's clearance period could be changed from the above to September 10 to October 10, 1949. This would allow time for his clearance to be communicated without using up some of the validity period.

Mr. O'Brien stated permit No. 2086 would be returned to the Pacific Military Permit Branch and Mrs. Flickinger stated that upon its receipt a memorandum confirming this conversation would be sent to the Department for its files.

Mrs. Mellor discussed this case with Mr. Larkin (VD) yesterday and gave him a copy of the pertinent papers.

Mr. Larkin said that a decision on Mr. Ponevejsky's immigration visa would be made within the next three or four days. It will be taken up at a board meeting. I called Mr. Larkin's attention to the fact that one third of the time during which it was valid for Mr. Ponevejsky to enter Japan had expired and that DS would appreciate having the decision at an early date.

The attitude of DS is that the Department cannot withhold notification of Mr. Ponevejsky's permission to enter Japan as it was granted by SCAP. DS is simply the transmitting agent. While SCAP would not permit him to enter Japan if he did not have a re-entry permit for some other country, he could enter Japan if he had ~~xxxxxxx~~ permit for such a re-entry permit even though an immigration visa to enter the US were denied.

There is attached a copy of telegram No. 680 of August 4, Noon from the American Embassy at Bangkok regarding Theater clearance to enter Japan for Leo G. Ponevejsky.

Mr. Ponevejsky received permission to enter Japan between August 1 and September 1, 1949 as the representative of A. Ponve Co., Incorporated of San Francisco. The Department notified the Embassy at Bangkok of his clearance to enter Japan in accordance with instructions on his application. In a case of this kind the applicant is given a certified copy of the Department's telegram which he uses in lieu of a military permit document. According to the telegram referred to above the Embassy states it is withholding the notification of his clearance "pending receipt reply to request for advisory opinion Ponevejsky immigration visa case submitted by Shanghai January 1949."

DS understands that an OM was drafted to Shanghai July 11, 1949 refusing Ponevejsky an immigration visa but that it has not been sent. When a decision is reached in his case it would be appreciated if VD would notify Mr. D. J. O'Brien, Room 721, (X 5867) so that a cablegram may be despatched to Bangkok in view of the fact that Mr. Ponevejsky's validity date to enter Japan will expire September 1, 1949.

There are enclosed (both in duplicate) the application of the Reverend Daniel Carrigan, an Irish national, who wishes permission to enter Japan as a missionary and a letter dated August 17, 1949 addressed to the Department of State by the Apostolic Delegate at Washington stating that the Reverend Carrigan will not be a burden on the Occupation Forces or the Japanese economy. In addition there is also enclosed (in duplicate) a letter dated August 5, 1949 from the Director of Reverend Carrigan's missionary society stating substantially the same information as the Apostolic Delegate's letter.

These documents were delivered to the Division of Protective Services for transmittal to you by the National Catholic Welfare Conference, Washington, D. C.

In the event a military permit is issued to the Reverend Carrigan it is requested that it be sent to this division for delivery to the National Catholic Welfare Conference which will forward it to him.

SUBJECT: FOREIGN REPRESENTATION: Request for military permit to enter Japan.

REFERENCE: Foreign Service Serial 667 of January 17, 1947 and its enclosure SCAP circular 8 August 30, 1946.

The Department is in receipt of a despatch from the American Embassy at London referring to Foreign Service Serial 667 of January 17, 1947 and transmitting (in triplicate) the application of Sister Angela Ninetti, an Italian national, who wishes permission from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo to enter Japan as a missionary.

The Embassy at London apparently was not informed that the Italian Government maintains a diplomatic mission at Tokyo or it would not have forwarded this application to Washington. Foreign Service Serial 667 states that in accordance with SCAP regulations nationals of a country maintaining diplomatic representation in Japan must have their requests for permission to enter Japan presented to the Supreme Commander by their diplomatic representative. Consequently because of this regulation no action may be taken by the Department in this case.

The Department is informing the Consulate of this matter because the Embassy at London informed it that Sister Angela was sailing from England to Italy about August 18, 1949 and that after she arrives in Italy she will visit the Consulate to receive her military permit. It was her understanding that her clearance to enter Japan would be cabled by the Department to the Consulate.

The Brazilian Embassy presents its compliments to the Department of State and has the honor to inform as follows:

2. On January 27, 1949, Mr. H. L. Sturgis, of the Department's Division of Protective Services, transmitted by telephone to Mr. O. A. Dias Carneiro, Second Secretary of the Embassy, a communication that the Department of State had received from the United States Embassy at Nanking, to the effect that the Brazilian Embassy in that city had informed the American Embassy that the amount of money necessary to cover transportation expenses of Mrs. Hilde Wiebke to Brazil would be made available to the Department of State by this Embassy. Mr. Sturgis added that said communication informed also that Mrs. Wiebke's passport, which had been issued by the Brazilian Consulate at Shanghai, would be sent to Japan, in order to be visaed by the American occupation authorities there, at the request of the Brazilian consular authorities referred to above.

3. On February 4, 1949, Mr. Sturgis called Mr. Dias Carneiro again to inform him that the Department of State had received a communication from the American occupation authorities, in Tokyo, stating that the granting of an exit visa from Japan to Mrs. Wiebke and her minor son was being delayed by the fact that the necessary funds for her repatriation had not been put at the disposal of the Department of State by the Embassy.

4. On the 25th of that same month, Mr. Sturgis com-

communicated that the matter had been brought to the attention of the United States Embassy at Rio de Janeiro.


5. All this information was transmitted to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Rio de Janeiro, which replied that Mrs. Hilde Wiebke and her minor son, both being Brazilian citizens, were in process of repatriation from Dairen, Manchuria, to Rio de Janeiro, through Tokyo, at the expense of her relatives in Brasil, and that these expenditures and the cost of transportation had been paid to the agency of Pan American World Airways in Tokyo.

6. The information in paragraph five above was communicated by telephone to Mr. Sturgis by Mr. Dias Carneiro, on March 7, 1949.

7. Recently, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs instructed this Embassy to request the Department's good offices with a view towards ascertaining the possibility of obtaining transportation for Mrs. Wiebke and her son who are still in Dairen, Manchuria, to Tokyo, Japan, from where they will immediately proceed to Brazil, since, as it was informed above, their transportation by air from Tokyo to Rio de Janeiro has already been paid.

8. The Brazilian Embassy would be very grateful to the Department of State for the verification of the possibility of transporting Mrs. Wiebke and her minor son from Dairen, Manchuria, to Tokyo, Japan, and expresses its appreciative thanks in advance for the kind attention of the Department to the matter.

Upon his arrival at Washington, following the closure of the American Consulate at Dairen, Mr. Gleysteen came in at Mr. Chappell's request to discuss informally certain matters still pending at Dairen in which DS is interested. Among other things Mr. Chappell asked what if anything Mr. Gleysteen might know about Mrs. Sudhaus Wiebke and her son, in whom the Brazilian Embassy is interested, and explained that DS would like to know what it can now tell the Embassy about them.

Mr. Gleysteen said that they were at the time of his departure on October 21 living with the German community there and that up to that time they had been unable to obtain their exit permits.

MEMORANDUM

The Department of State refers the Brazilian Embassy to a telephone conversation on September 8, 1949 between Mr. Carneiro of the Embassy and an officer of the Department of State, concerning the Embassy's memorandum No. 243/7(42)(56)02 of August 24, 1949 with regard to the proposed travel to Brazil, via Japan and the United States, of Mrs. Sudhaus Wiebke and her son, who are stated to be Brazilian citizens.

By telegram of September 16, 1949 the American Consulate at Dairen was requested to inform the Department of Mrs. Wiebke's chances to obtain exit permits and transportation.

In as much as the Consulate at Dairen was closed on October 21, 1949, an informal inquiry regarding Mrs. Wiebke and her son was made of one of the Department's representatives who has recently arrived in the United States from Dairen. The aforementioned officer reported that, at the time of his departure on October 21, 1949, Mrs. Wiebke and her son were living with the German community at Dairen and that up to that

time they had been unable to obtain their exit permits. It appears that there is little likelihood of Mrs. Wiebke and her son being able to leave Dairen in the foreseeable future.

Sir:

I have the honor to transmit herewith a Note Verbale which has just been received from the Bolivian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Worship in which the Ministry reproduces a communication from the Fábrica Nacional de Tejidos (National Textile Mills) in La Paz, Bolivia, bespeaking the assistance of the Ministry in bringing to the attention of the United States authorities in Japan its desire to obtain permission for Mr. Tomás Tamichi Komori to leave Japan, where he is presently residing, to come to Bolivia for the purpose of residence and to lend his technical services in the above-mentioned factory. According to the communication, Mr. Komori, who is a brother of a partner in the firm named, resided formerly in Bolivia for a period of 27 years, from January 30, 1917 to May 25, 1944, at which time he voluntarily returned to Japan. However, the records of the Embassy show that at that time he was deported to Japan via the United States. No other intelligence is recorded. There is no indication that Mr. Komori had ever acquired Bolivian citizenship.

The matter is respectfully referred to the Department for reference, provided it perceives no objection thereto, to the appropriate Civil Affairs office for consideration.

A. "Natesa" (National Textile Mills) of this city concerning Mr. Tomas Tamiichi Komori and Miss Hortensia Komori, which states as follows:

"MR. MINISTER OF FOREIGN RELATIONS.—
With the attached documents and for the reasons explained therein, we request diplomatic action toward authorization to leave the country indicated therein, in favor of the persons mentioned therein.-----/Otrosí.- Domicilio.7-----
The members of FABRICA NACIONAL DE TEJIDOS DE PUNTO S.A. "NATESA" (National Textile Mills), industrial firm established in this city, competent by law, respectfully declare before you as follows: Our industrial firm, composed of associates of Bolivian and Japanese nationality, has its juridical personality and its Statutes approved by Supreme Resolution No. 27220 of December 31, 1947.---For the better industrial management of our factory, and on account of his particular technical specialization in the manufacture of textiles, the personal collaboration of Mr. TOMAS TAMIICHI KOMORI is necessary to us; he is the legitimate brother of our principal associate, Mr. Santiago T. Komori, and is presently residing in Japan, actually in the small city called Minomachi, Tokiwacho Street, Mugi-Gun Province, Gifu-Ken Department of that country.----Mr. Tomas Tamiichi Komori, engaged in commercial activities, resided in this city of La Paz for a period of 27 years, or from January 30, 1917 to May 15, 1944, on which date he voluntarily traveled to Japan, via the United of American and he has not been able to return up to this time on account of restrictions imposed as a result of the last World War.----
The aforementioned Mr. Komori, during his long stay in Bolivia, has always observed the best conduct, as shown

by the

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by the records of the Security Police and the Mayor's Office of this city, enclosed in the evidence which is attached.--Furthermore, the aforementioned Mr. Komori, as indicated by the certified birth certificate which is also attached, has a legitimate Bolivian daughter named HORTENSIA KOMORI, born in this city of La Paz on April 5, 1930, at present 19 years of age and now in Japan with her father.----Finally, Mr. Komori, as a former resident of Bolivia feels strange and cut off in Japan, by reason of the fact that in this city of La Paz he maintains all of his family bonds and commercial connections.---As explained above, with the attached documents and with a view to the better technical management of our textile factories, we respectfully beg you, Mr. Minister, to have the kindness to instruct our Ambassador at Washington or to order that necessary action be taken before the Embassy of the United States at La Paz, in order that there may be brought before the Department of State of the United States the matter of authorization by the American occupation authorities in Japan for the departure of Mr. TOMAS TAMIICHI KOMORI and his legitimate daughter, Miss HORTENSIA KOMORI.---[Otrosí.- Domicilio:7 Offices of our factory, Fernando Guachalla Street No. 325 of this city.--- Equity and justice be done.---La Paz, July 27, 1949.---(Signature) Fabrica Nacional de Tejidos "NATESA".---Lawyer.----Luis Fernando Guachalla.-----

Gentlemen:

It is respectfully requested that a military permit be issued authorizing the admission of Mrs. Nina Denisova Chirskoff, who presently resides in Shanghai, China, to Japan, for a period of sixty days.

Mrs. Chirskoff is planning to enter Japan during the month of September, as representative of three service firms: (1) Dodwell & Company, a British corporation in the business of shipping and general agency, with offices at 17 Canton Road, Shanghai. Mrs. Chirskoff can presently be reached in Shanghai in c/o Dodwell & Company; (2) the Veritas Company (Far East), Ltd., a British corporation, organized in 1934 for the purpose of purchasing, selling and chartering vessels, as well as ship chandlery. The bulk of the company's business was done in the Far East, including Japan, but due to wartime conditions this business was disrupted and must be re-established; (3) Compania de Navegacion Veritas, S.A., a Panamanian corporation organized in 1947, engaged in freight shipping. Its principal office also is at 37 Wall Street, New York City, as is that of Veritas Company (Far East), Ltd.

Mrs. Chirskoff was born in Vladivostok on June 6, 1922, and has been residing in Shanghai since early youth, but considers herself stateless. She will be traveling under a certificate of identity, and will be accompanied by her son, George Chirskoff, who was born in Shanghai in August, 1942.

We personally guarantee the payment of the expenses of Mrs. Chirskoff while she is in Japan. She will reside with friends, who may be referred to if desired. They are as follows: Mr. and Mrs. John Albeck, 6 Bluff, Yokohama, Japan; Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Bush, c/o U.K. Liaison Mission, British Embassy, Tokyo, Japan; and Mr. P. Case, Secretary, Trans-Pacific Freight Conference of Japan, Yokohama, Japan.

It will be appreciated if the military permit, upon issuance, will be cabled to the American Consulate at Shanghai, at our expense.

The Pacific Military Permit Branch of the Department of the Army informs the Department of State that it is authorized to issue you a military permit to enter Japan as a private trader provided that you possess a valid travel document and a permit to enter some other country upon completion of your stay in Japan.

It is noted from the application that you submitted to the Department of Commerce in connection with your proposed travel to Japan that you are an Austrian national and that your place of business is in New York. Therefore, it is assumed that you propose to travel with an Austrian passport and that you intend to return to the United States when you complete your business in Japan.

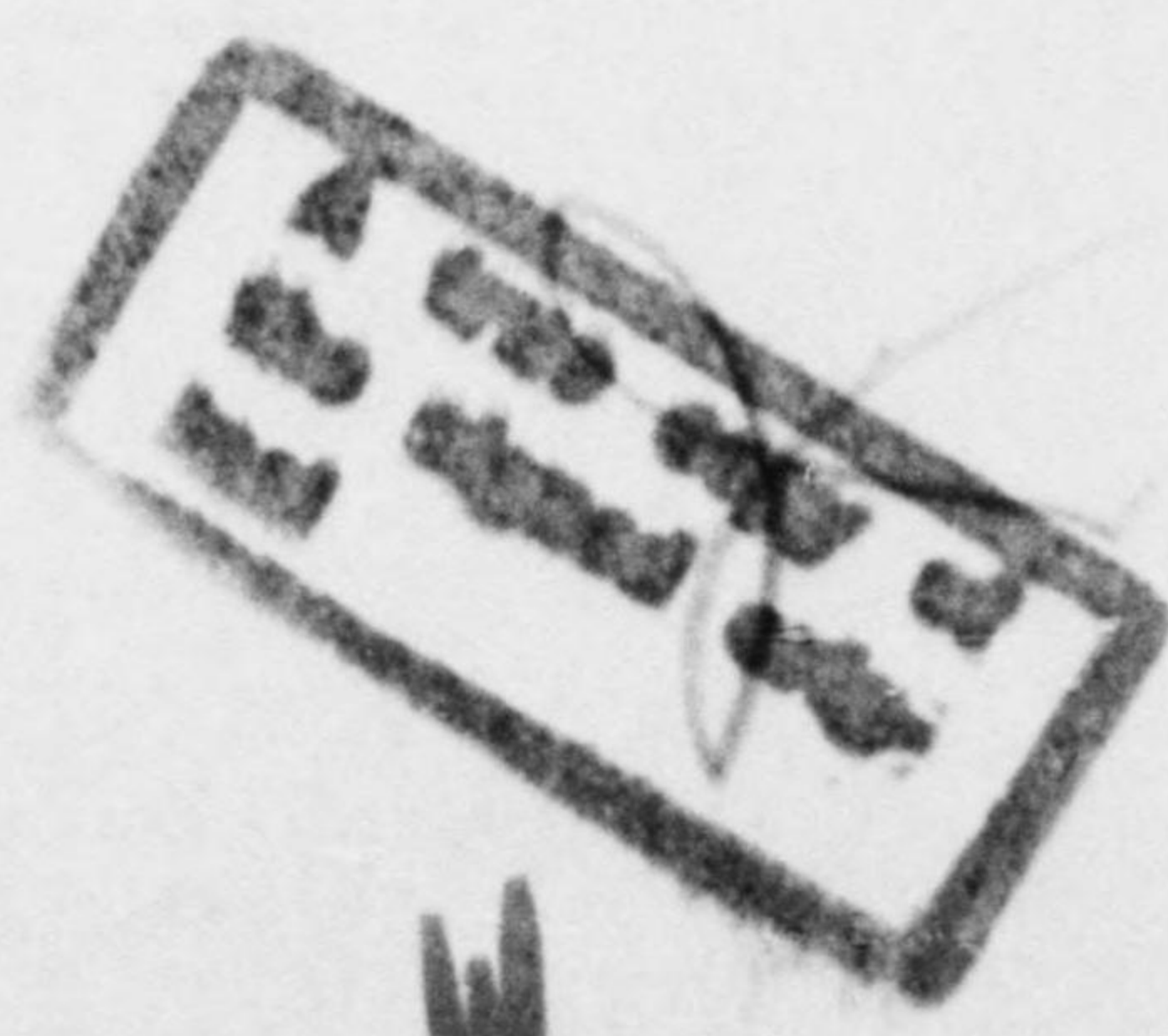

The action of the Department in the case of Sister Angela NINETTI, an Italian national, has been noted.

The Department is informed that when Sister Ninetti first called at the Embassy to request its assistance in this matter, she was referred to the Italian Embassy in London. She later returned and stated that she was informed in that office that they could not assist her in obtaining an entry permit for Japan. In the absence of information to indicate that Italy maintains a diplomatic mission in Japan, her application was accepted.

It is suggested that the Department may wish to consider the advisability of providing diplomatic and consular establishments with a current list of countries which have diplomatic representatives in Japan as well as a list of countries represented in Japan by Protecting Powers, to assist them in handling this work.
