SUBJECT: Procedures

Procedures for Restoration of Patents, Utility Models, Designs and Trade-Marks to Allied Nationals

The Japanese Government is directed to take necessary action to complete processing of all pending requirements pertaining to restoration, revalidation and extension of patent property and trademarks and to deliver to the Office of the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers the papers and documents required thereby within thirty (30) days from the date of this memorandum. Similar requirements forwarded to the Patent Agency subsequent to the date of this memorandum will be processed and the required papers and documents submitted to the Office of the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within thirty (30) days from the date of receipt by the Patent Agency.
