Hon. James Russell Lowell died at his home in Cambridge, Mass., Wednesday morning. Mr. Lowell won quite a reputation as a poet and critic, and his scholarly essays made for him a great name in literary circles. He was the author of the famous "Biglow Papers" in yankee dialect, which is his greatest literary production. He was appointed by President Hayes as minister to Spain, and remained there until 1880, when he was appointed minister to England. He remained at the court of St. James, where he was regarded as a scholar and a genius, until 1885, when he was recalled by President Cleveland.
