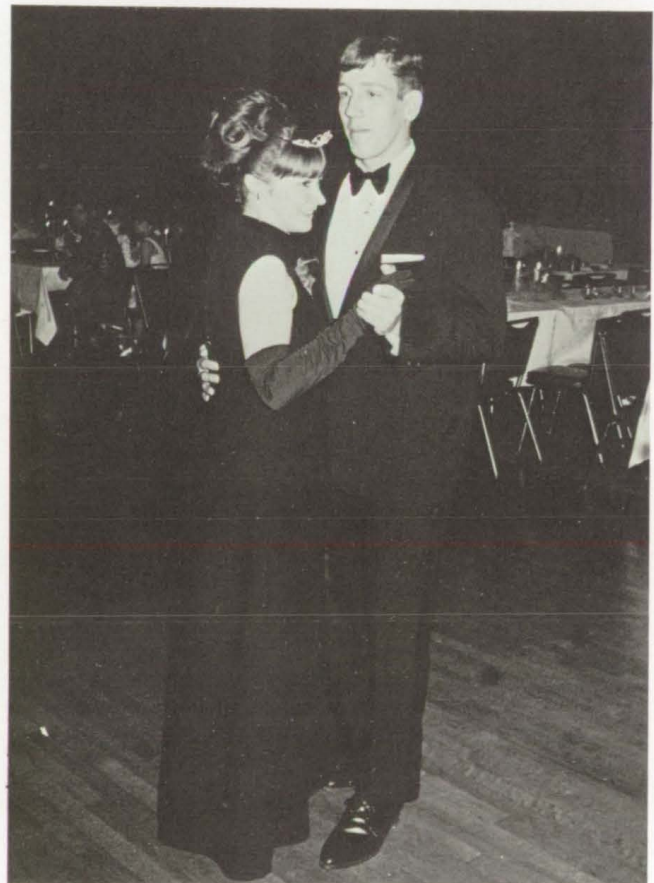

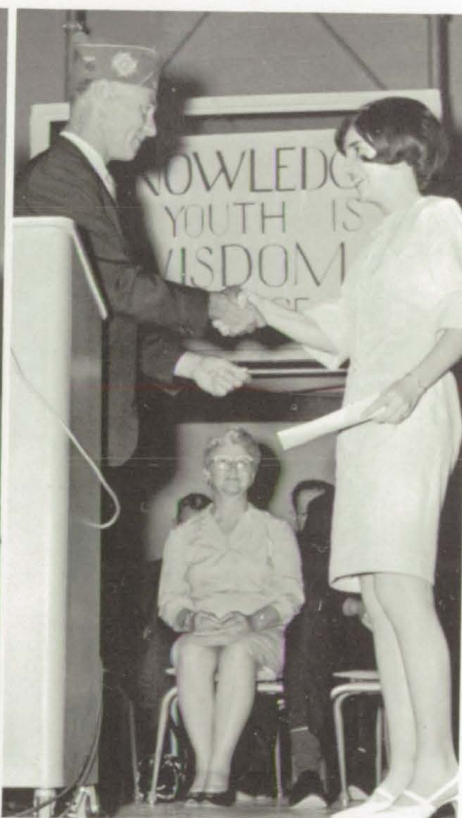

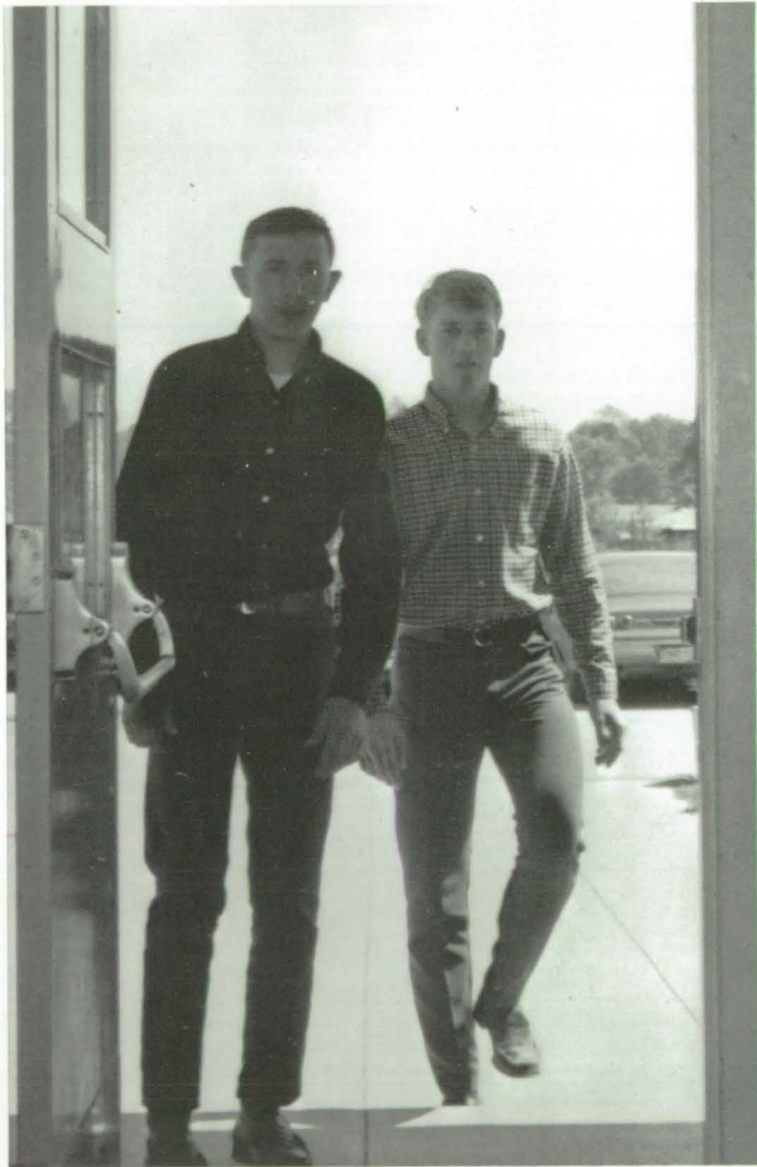

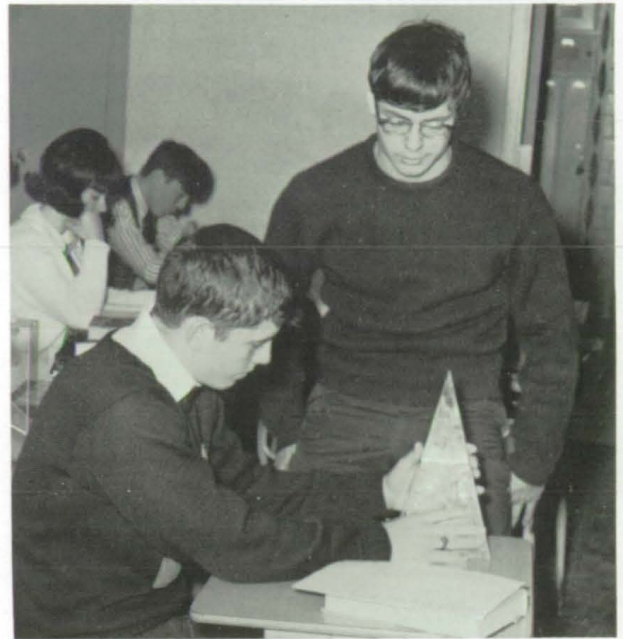

Several students combine plane geometry and Algebra II to prepare themselves for the new Senior Math course consisting of Analytic Geometry and a probability course. Available to students are General Math, Plane Geometry, two and one half years of Algebra, Trigonometry and Senior Math.

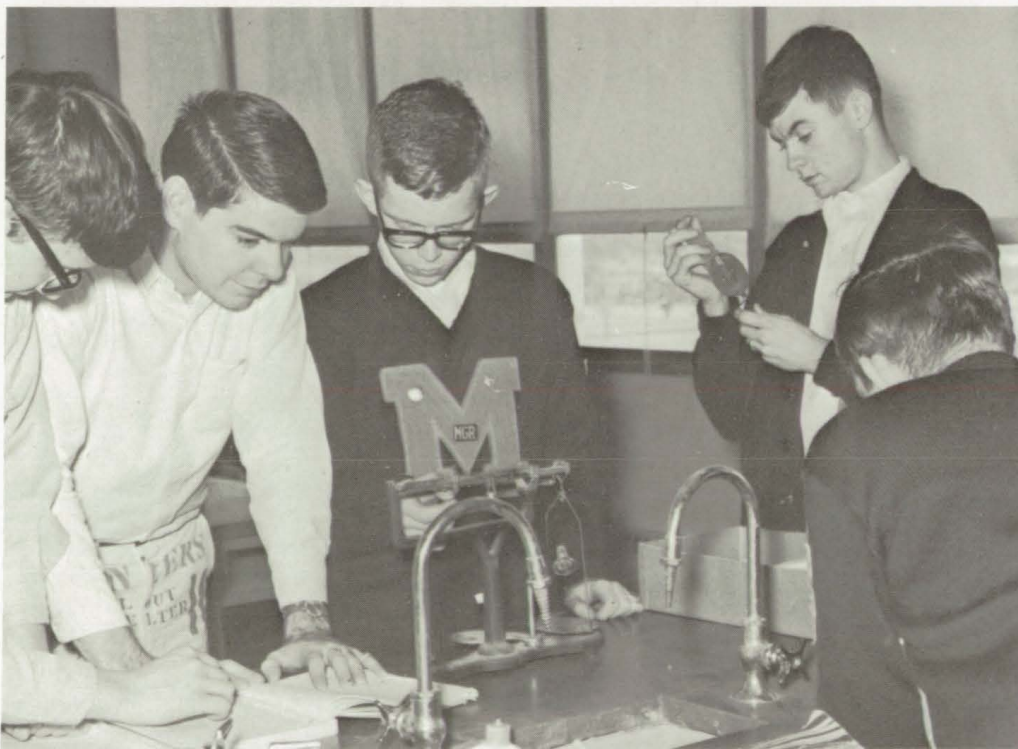

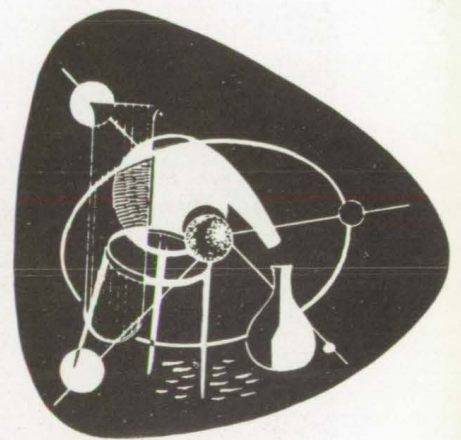

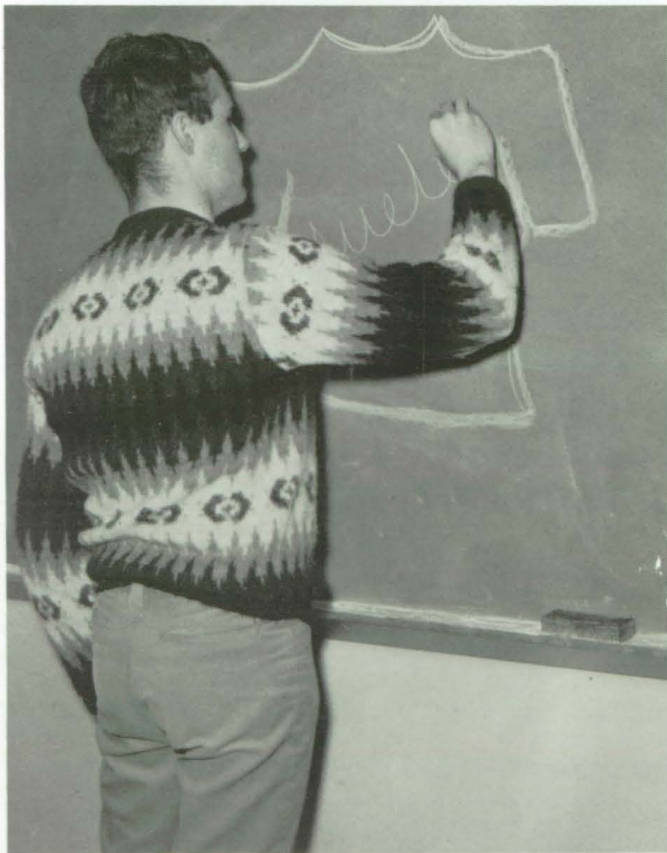


## Language Class Develops . . .

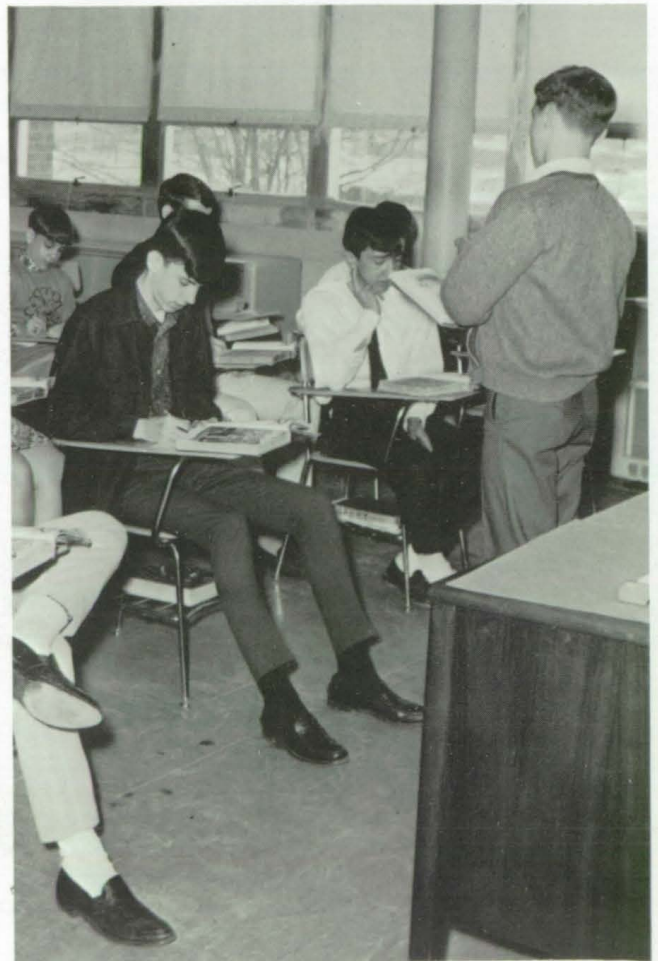
Students at MHS study three foreign languages, taught at three grade levels. Students learn the fundamentals of Latin, Spanish, and French. In second and third year classes students became better acquainted with foreign people and their customs. Tape recorders and recordings are used often to stimulate interest and to aid in learning pronunciation.

Latin students re-live the days of Julius Caesar and his Gallic Wars while French students practice ordering *radis au beurre* and *pommes de terre*. Spanish students study about matadors and *tortillas*.

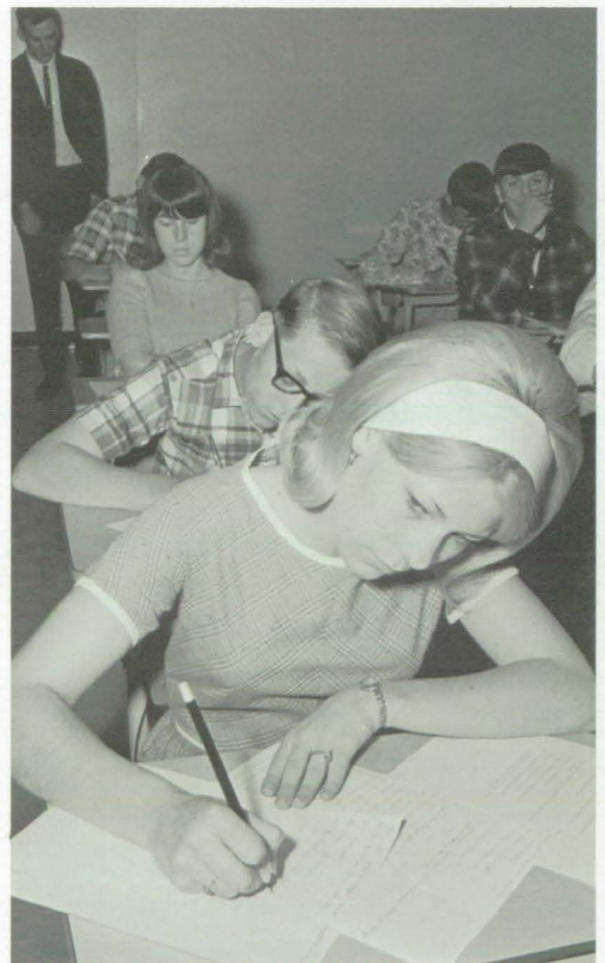

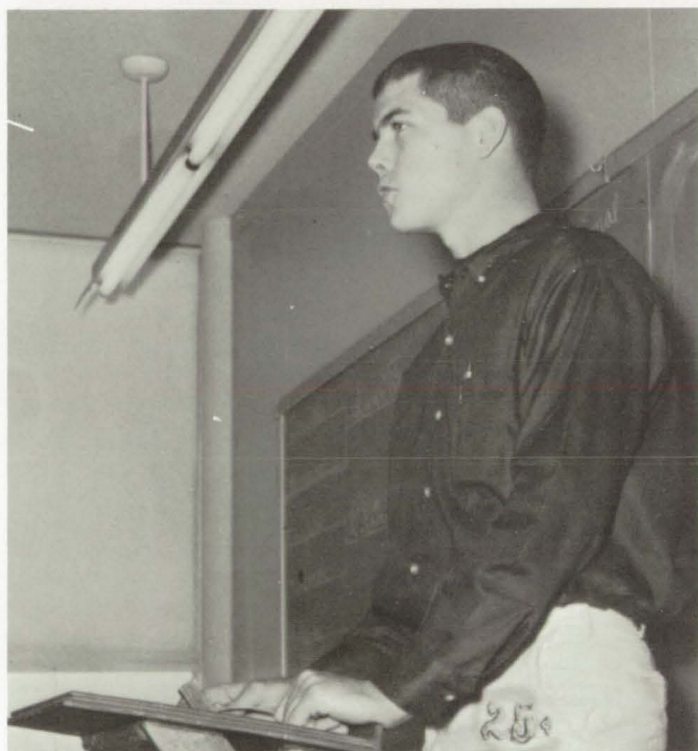

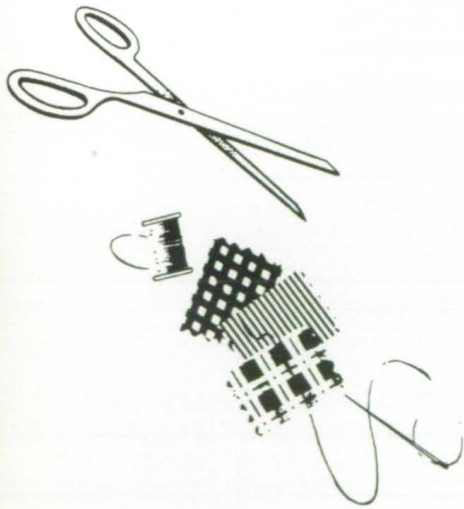


## Journalism And Home Economics . . .

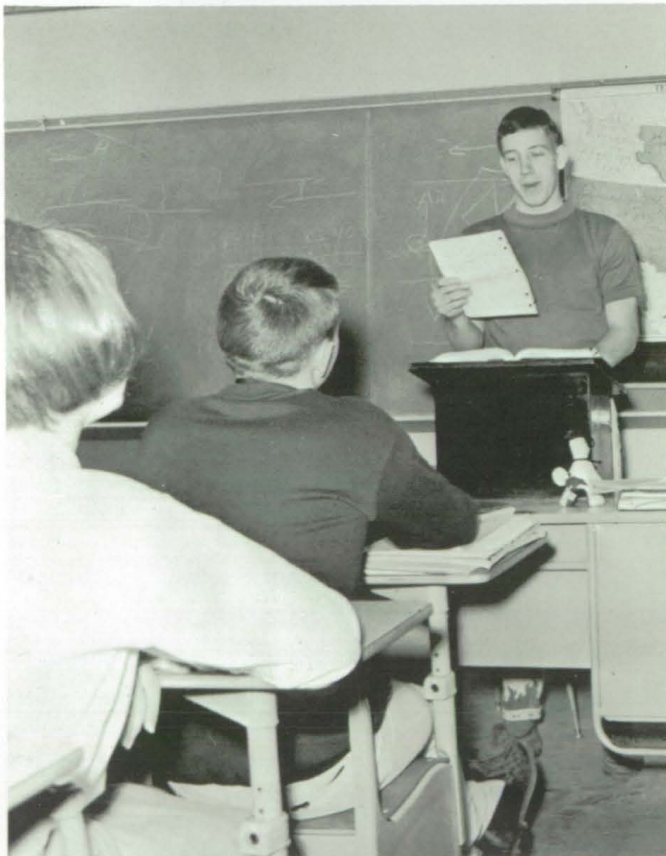

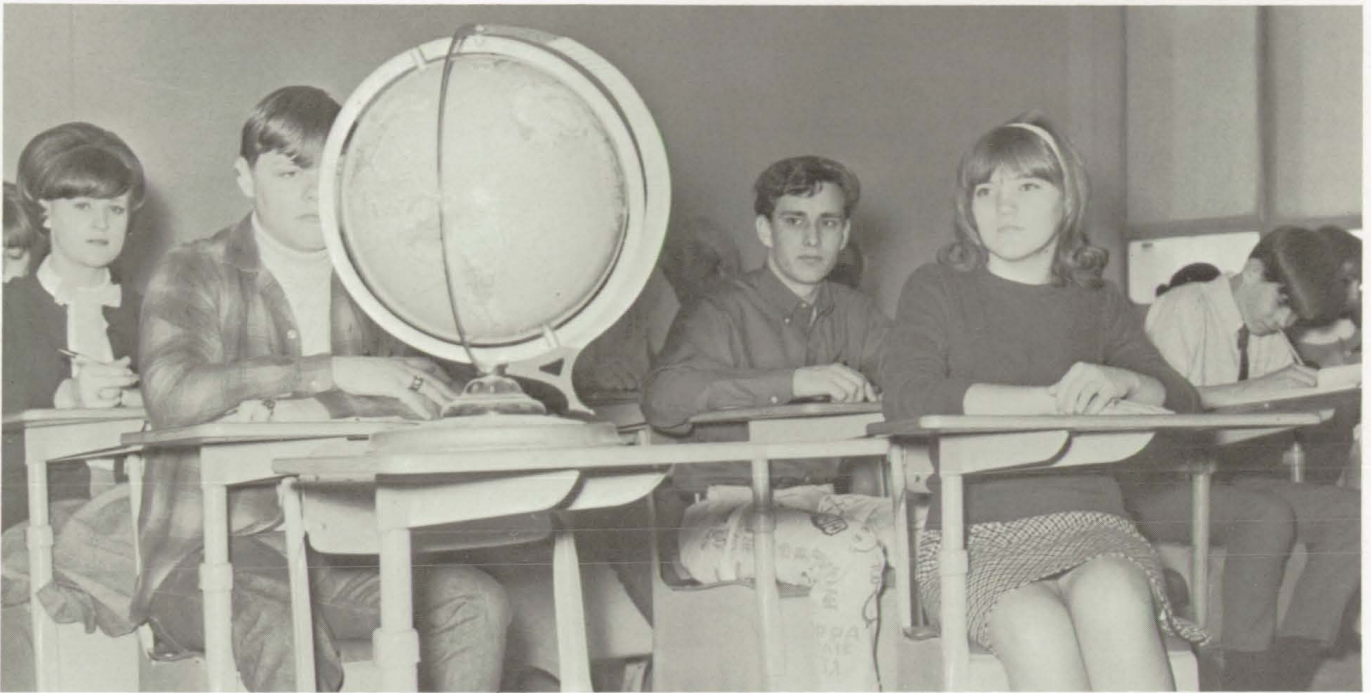

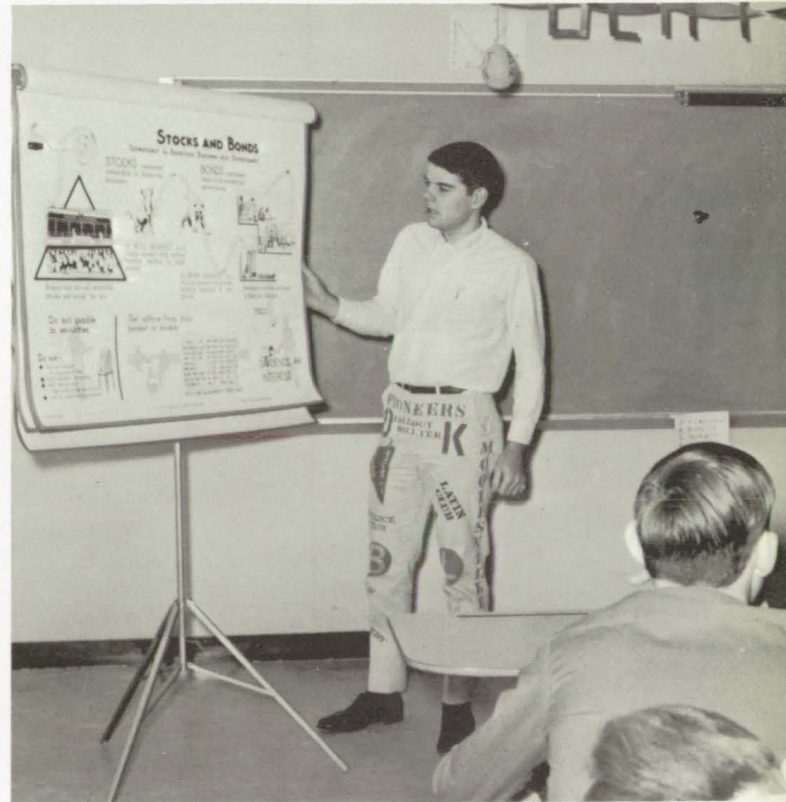

Social Studies classes visited the State Legislature on a field trip.

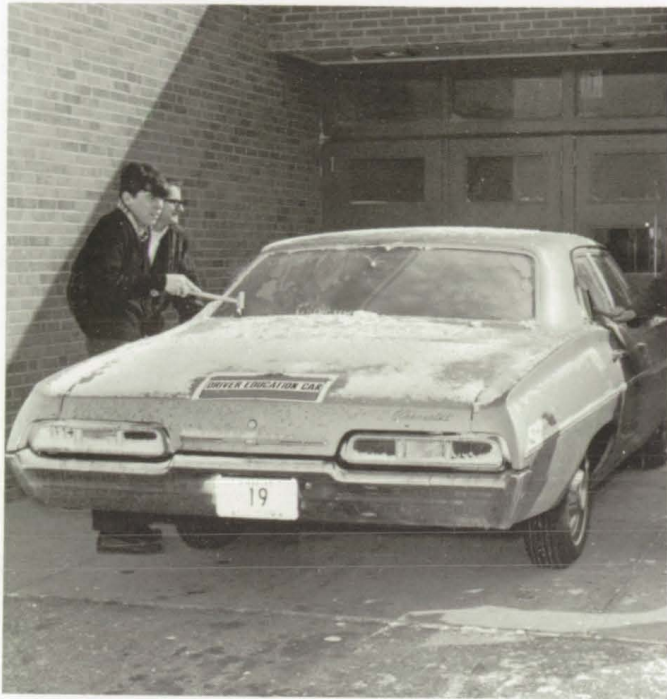

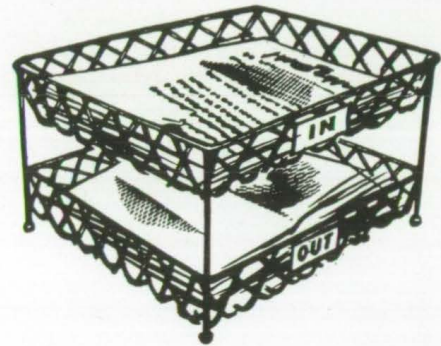

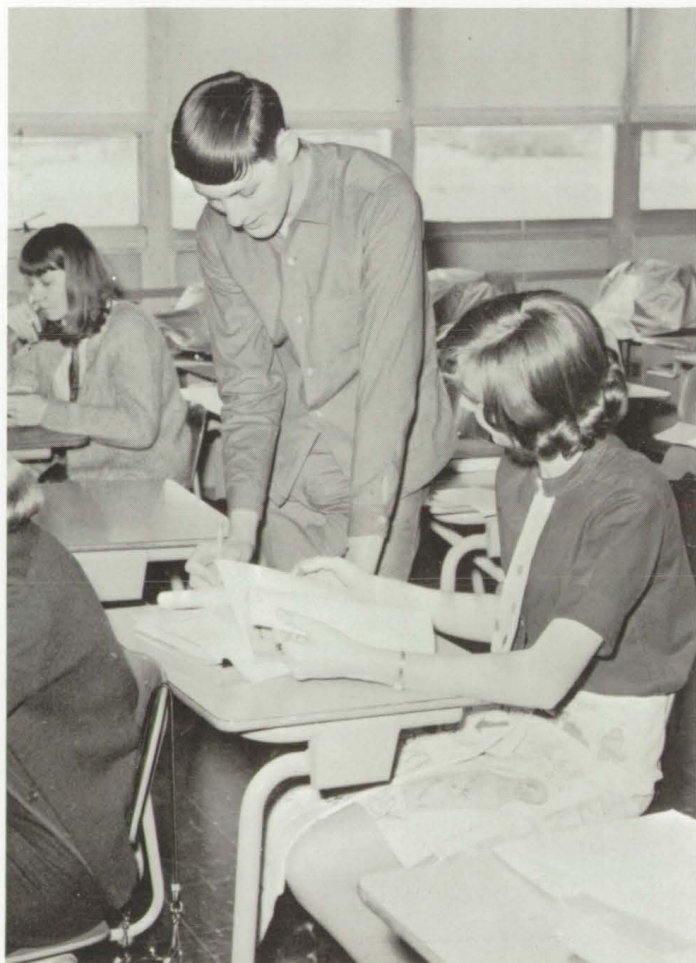

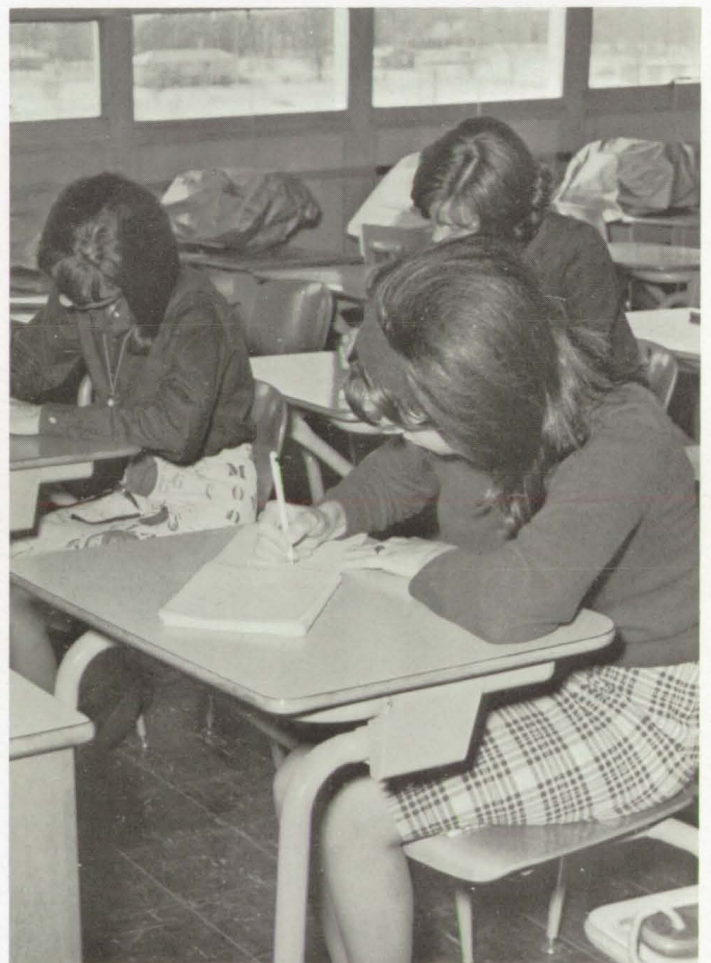

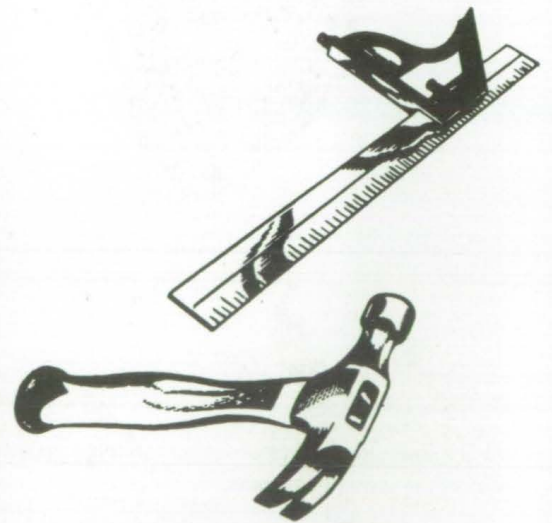

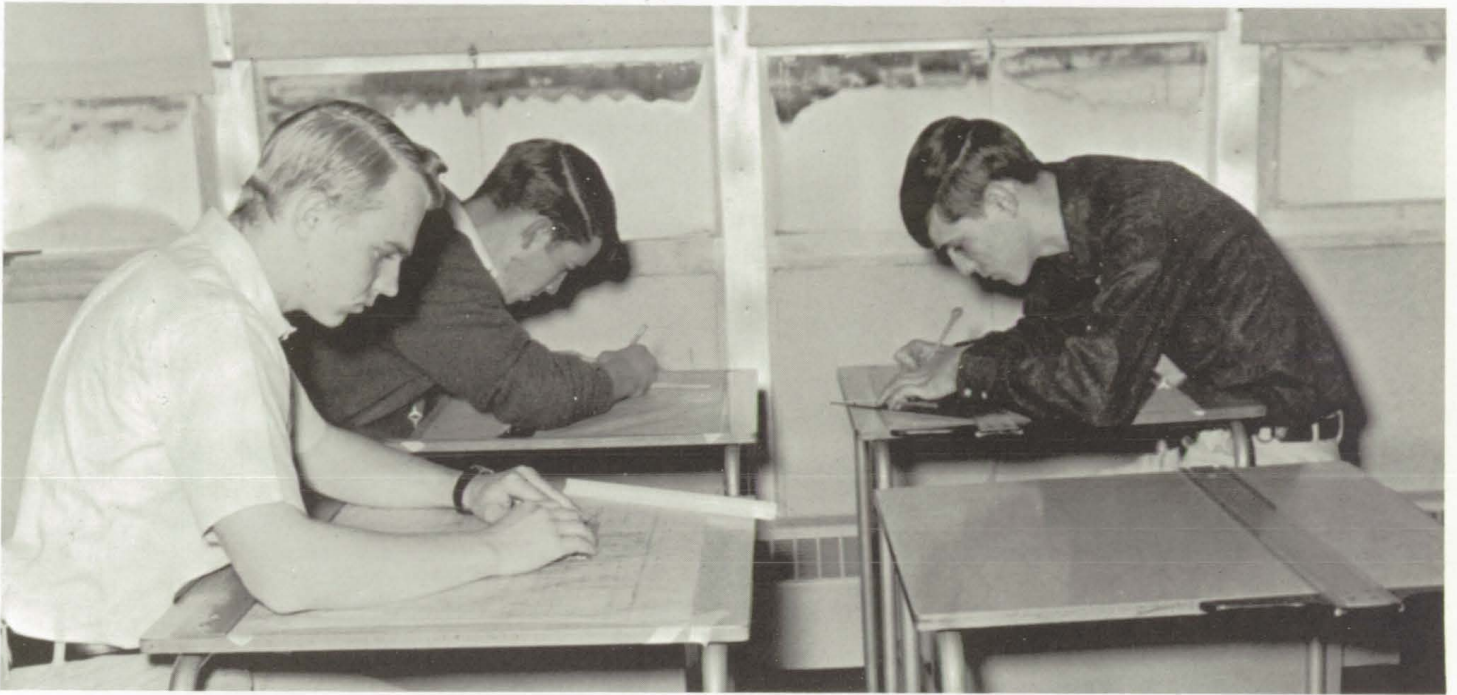

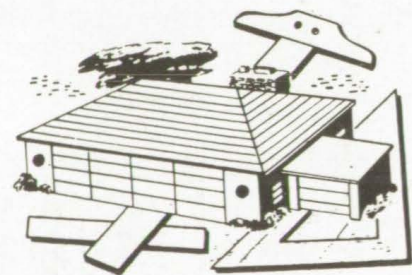

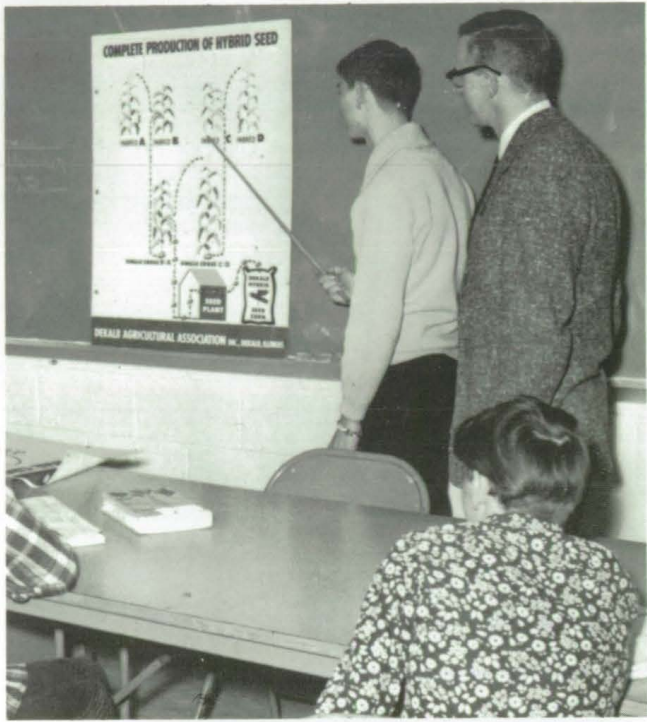

One of the most important honoraries at MHS is the Mooresville Chapter of the National Honor Society. The criteria necessary for membership are scholarship, leadership, service, and character. A 3.2 grade average or better is required; ten percent of the Senior class and fifteen per cent of the junior class are selected for membership.

The Honor Society spotlights its new members at biannual suspense-building tap-outs before the entire student body. A formal invitation is later held to install the new members in a ceremonious way before their families and friends.

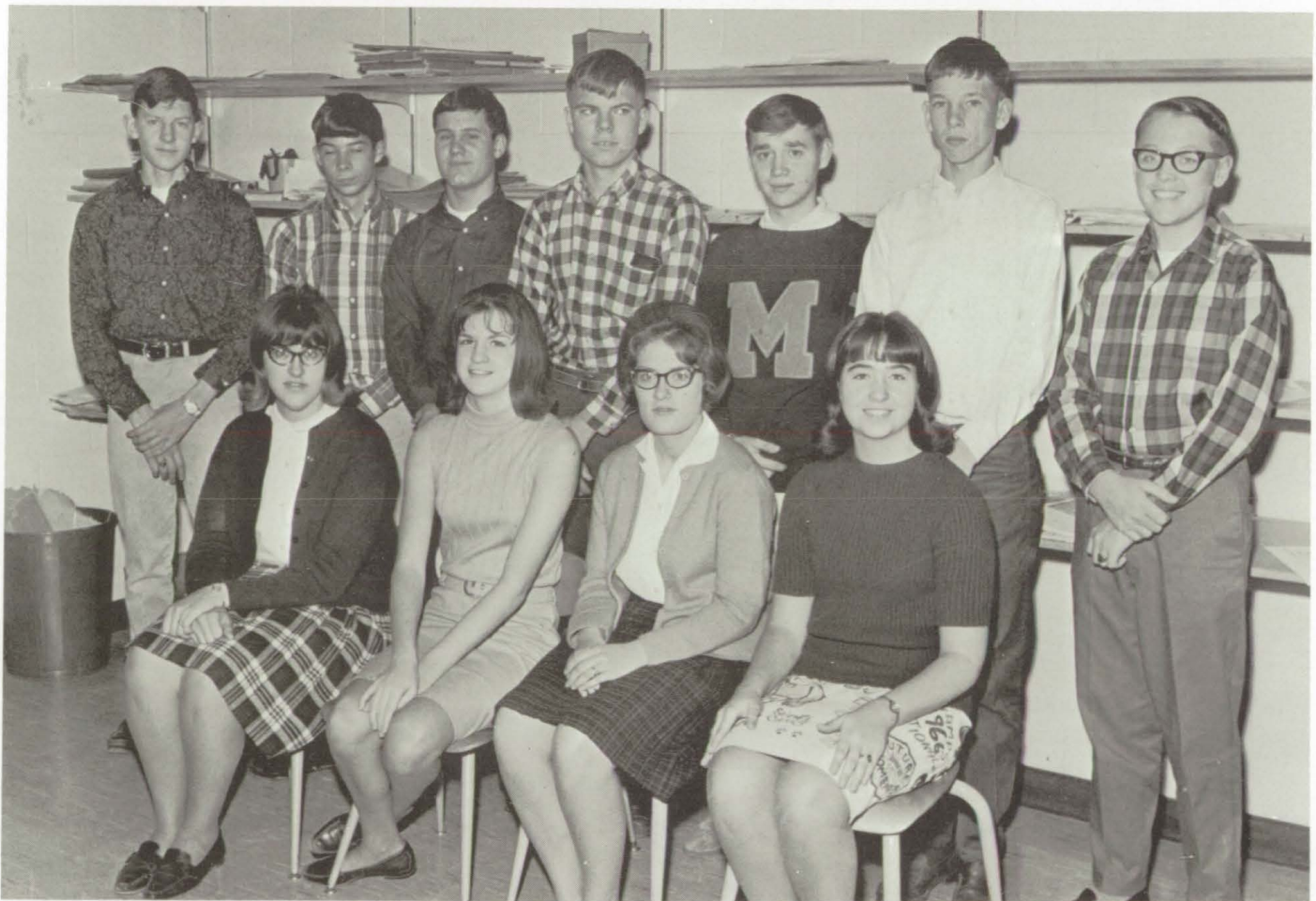
## And Business Staff Record Busy Year

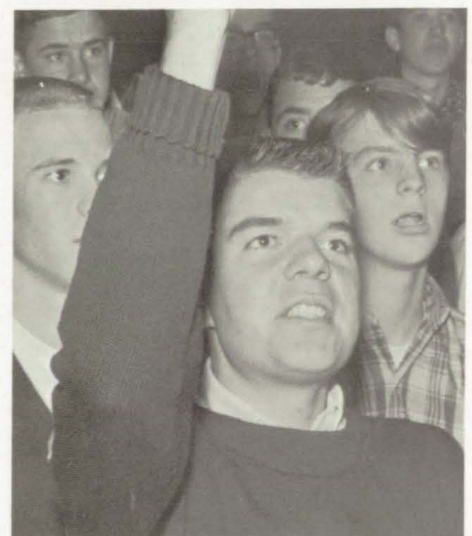

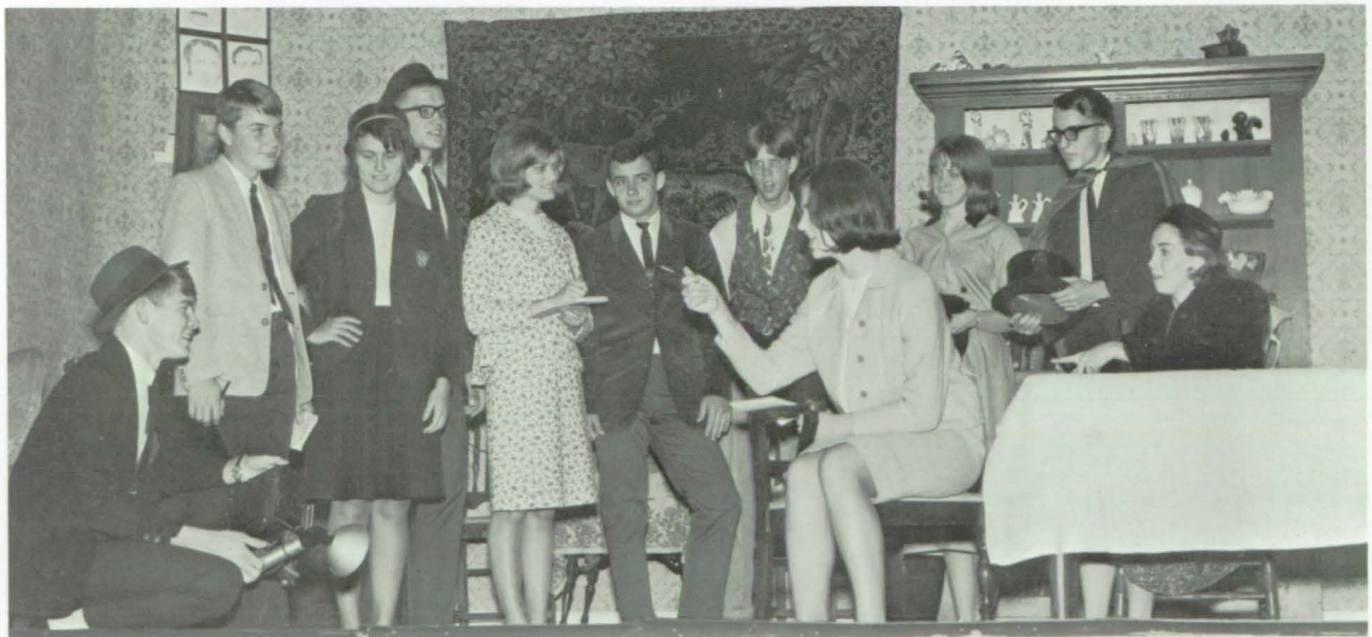

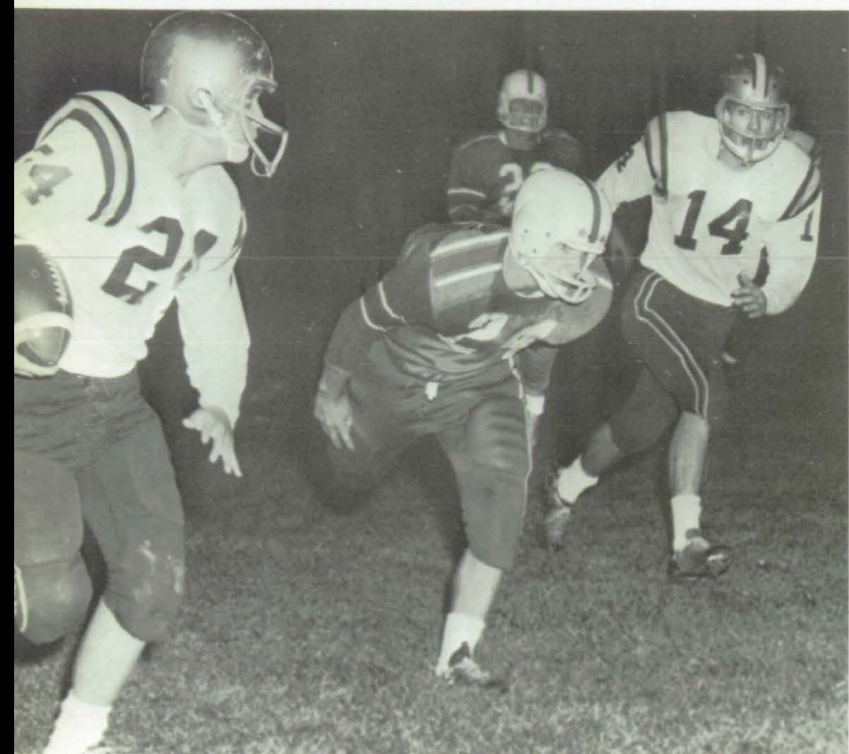

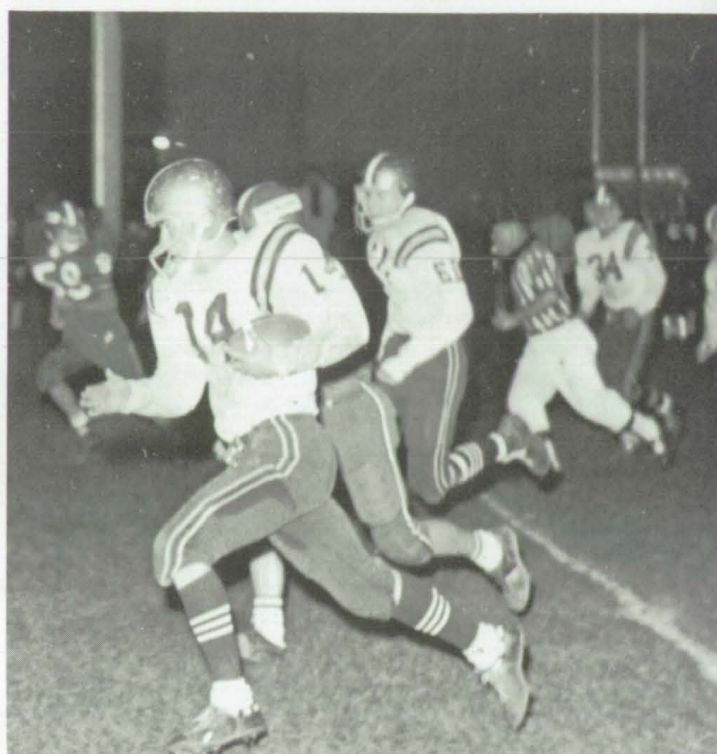

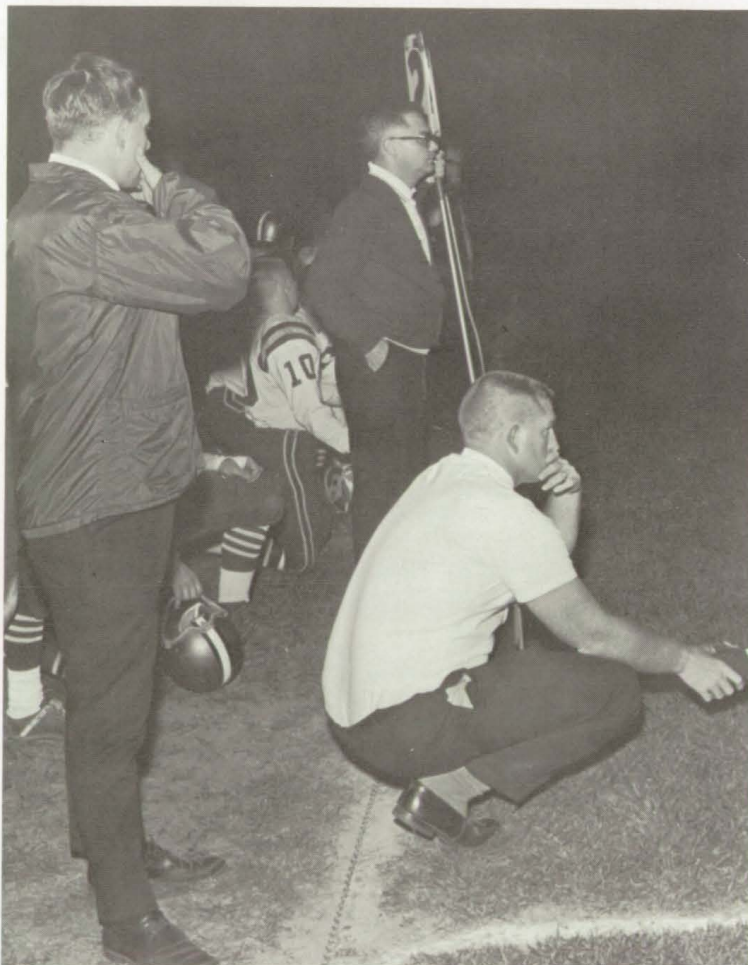

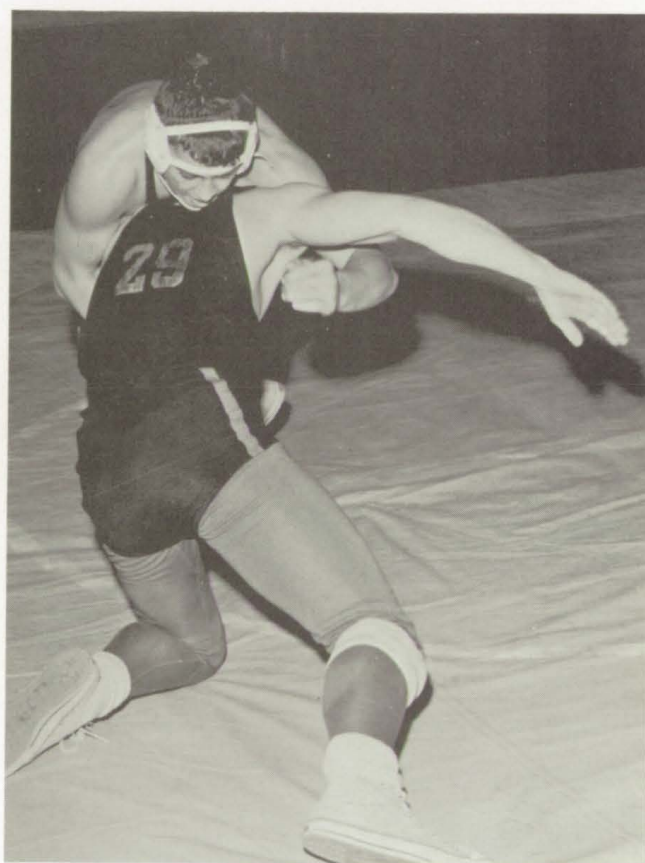


Stewart O'Dell seems to be positioning his man for the pin.

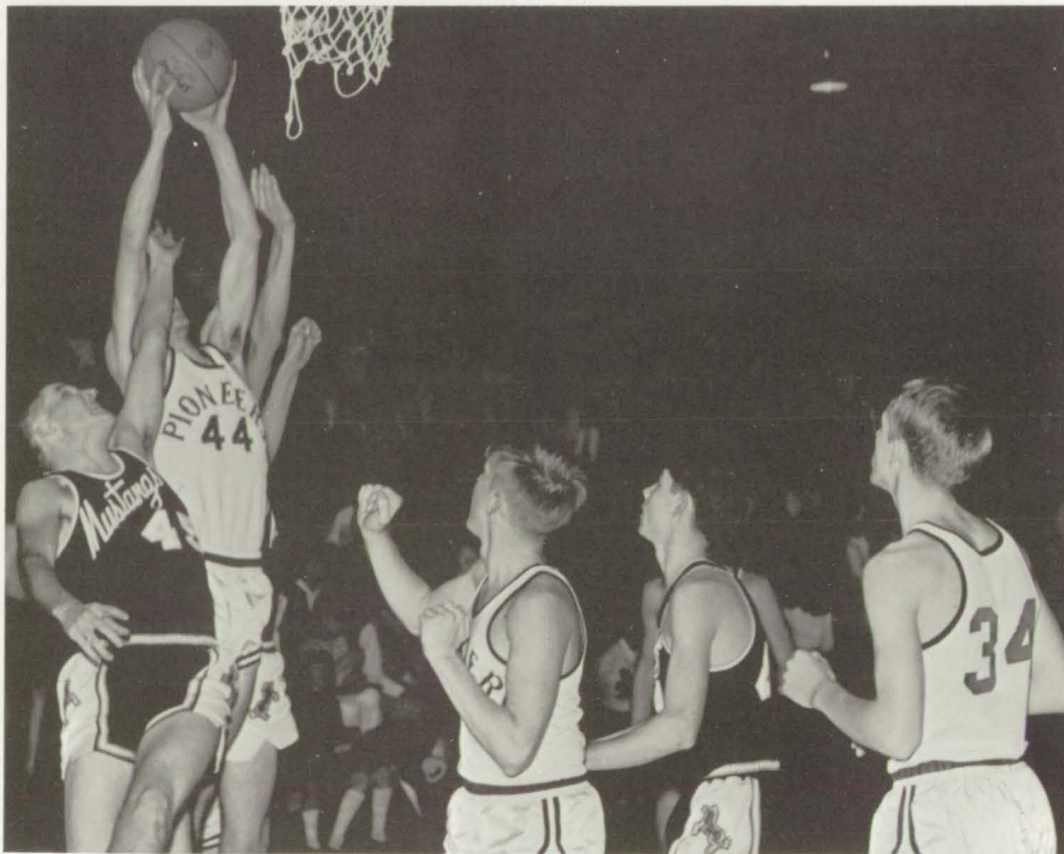

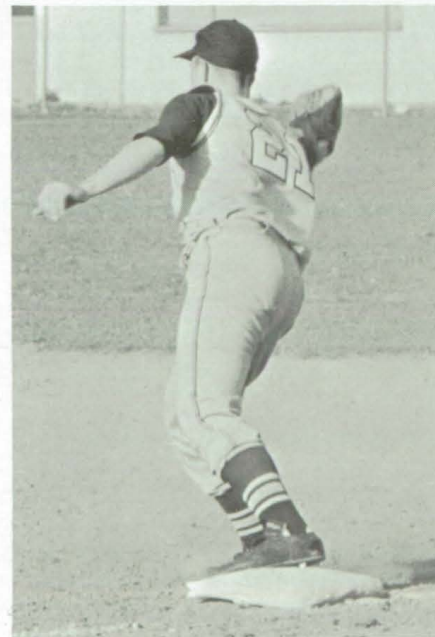
